*The Northern Highlands*  
**KINTAMANI**

Begin your day with a visit to Batuan village, renowned as the cradle of the Balinese art scene and celebrated for its distinctive painting style. From there, journey onwards to Kintamani, where you can marvel at the breathtaking views of the crater lake and the majestic Batur volcano, Bali's sacred mountain. Alternatively, take a moment to pause at a local café, indulging in panoramic vistas while sampling the region's renowned coffee.

As you descend towards Panglipuran, immerse yourself in the charm of this Balinese village, celebrated for its preservation of traditional architecture and culture. Explore its temple and admire the captivating bamboo forest. For those craving further adventure, venture to the nearby waterfalls in Bangli regency before concluding your journey back to Sanur.



## *The Essence of Bali* **BESAKIH & KINTAMANI**

Commence your day by venturing to Tukad Cepung, a unique waterfall set within a cave, renowned for its mesmerising “endless rainbows.” Next, journey to Pura Besakih, known as the Mother Temple of Bali. Perched on the slopes of Mount Agung, this majestic complex offers breathtaking countryside vistas from its elevated vantage point.

After immersing yourself in the ambience of Besakih, continue your nature exploration at the Pine Forest, where you can witness mist weaving through the towering trees. Treat yourself to a well-deserved lunch at one of the lake-view restaurants, and relish in the awe-inspiring panorama.

On your return journey southward, make a stop at a coffee plantation to witness the traditional roasting process and sample Kopi Bali along other tropical infusions, completing your day with a delightful sensory experience.



## *The Northern Lakes* **BEDUGUL & MUNDUK**

Explore Bali's natural splendor as you venture northward to its lush lake district. Along the way, consider stopping at the serene "Garden Temple," Taman Ayun, or discovering the enchanting Leke Leke waterfall, nestled within the tropical rainforest.

Upon reaching the summit, take a moment to explore the traditional fresh market of Candi Kuning, brimming with an abundance of tropical fruits, vibrant flowers and aromatic spices. Continue your trip to the revered Ulun Danu Beratan temple, dedicated to the goddess of water. The temple's reflection on the serene lake's surface creates a captivating floating impression, with the majestic Bedugul mountain range as a backdrop.



Enjoy a scenic drive along the panoramic road to Munduk, where you can admire Bali's twin lakes, before journeying back

through the verdant farmland of Plaga, marveling at the island's picturesque landscapes along the way.

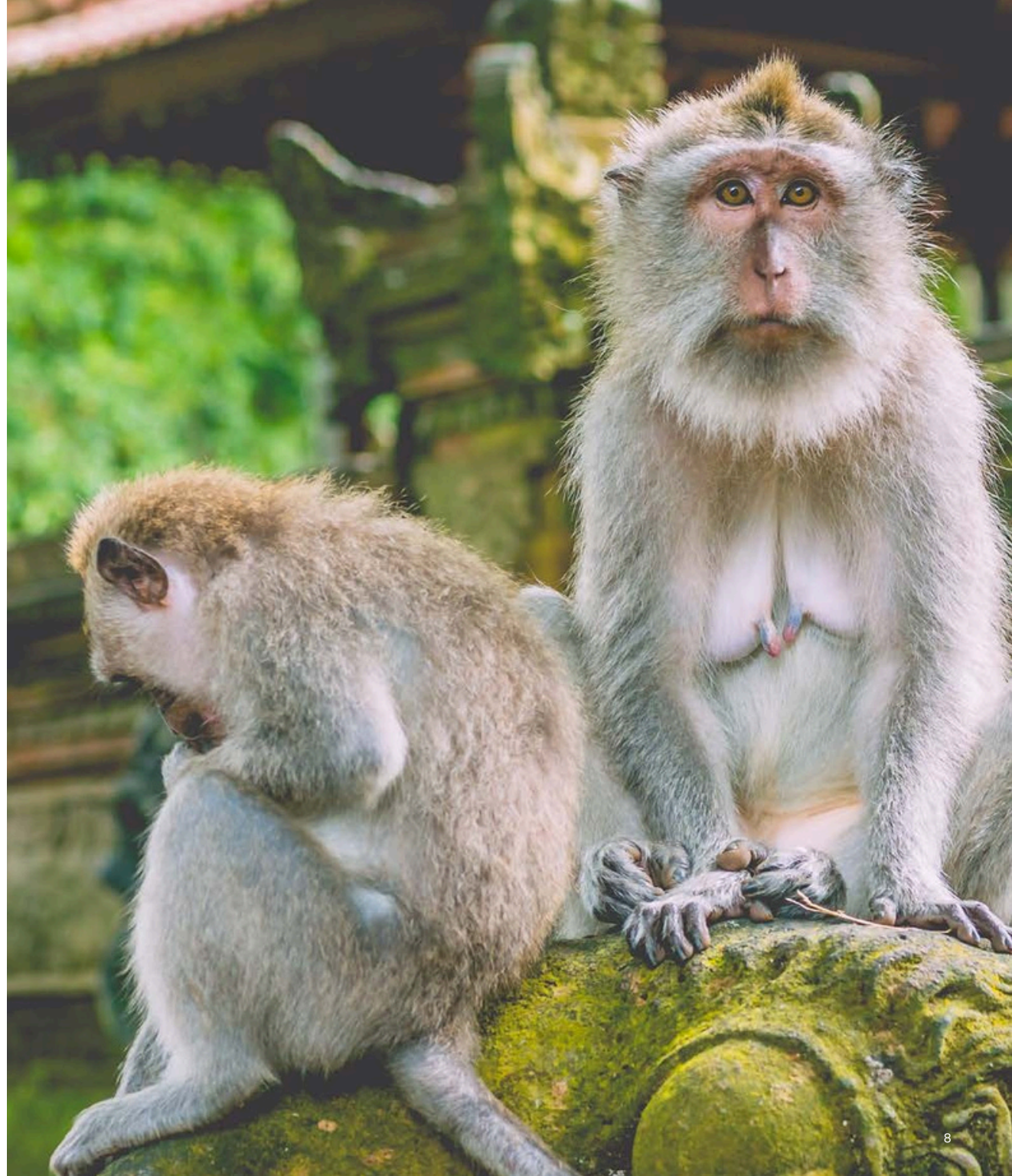


## *The Creative Heart* **UBUD**

Next, immerse yourself in the cultural heart of the island as you arrive at the idyllic village of Ubud. Here, tropical wildlife awaits at the Sacred Monkey Forest, while enchanting history unfolds at the Royal Palace. Explore the bustling traditional market brimming with trinkets, and wander through galleries and boutiques offering Balinese arts & crafts.

To cap off your day, marvel at the iconic Tegallalang rice terraces or make a detour to the "secret village" on your return journey, ensuring your day is filled with unforgettable experiences and discoveries.





## *Tri Hita Karana* **SUSTAINABLE BALI**

Embark on your journey by immersing yourself in the rich culture of Bali with a visit to an authentic Balinese house. Rooted in the sacred Hindu principles of 'Asta Kosala Kosali', the layout and design of these traditional homes offer insight into ancient architectural philosophy.

Next, delve into the ancient craft of egg painting, a delicate art form that demands both patience and skill. Marvel at the intricate designs crafted with precision and care.

Satisfy your palate with local specialties such as crispy Balinese duck or Mujair Nyat Nyat, freshwater fish cooked in aromatic local spices, before continuing to Begawan, a foundation dedicated to preserving Balinese wildlife and traditions.

At Begawan, engage in their conservation programs and discover the intricacies of heritage rice farming, support the breeding efforts of the endangered Bali sterling or participate in a lesson on sustainable living at the Begawan Learning Center alongside Bali's youngest generation.

# *The Sacred Escape* **A JOURNEY OF RENEWAL**

Venture off the beaten track on a soulful journey through Bali's sacred landscapes. Begin with a traditional Melukat water purification ceremony, a deeply meaningful ritual to cleanse body and mind, held at a scenic sanctuary far from the crowds. Continue with a visit to the Elephant Cave, one of Bali's most atmospheric ancient temples. Discover a unique heritage centre dedicated to the preservation of antique masks and puppets, then refresh beside one of Bali's most distinctive waterfalls surrounded by lush greenery. End the day in a traditional village where graceful herons gather at sunset; an enchanting sight believed to bring harmony and blessings.





## *Heritage Gems* **THE CAPITAL OF BALI**

Your tour begins at Bajra Sandhi Monument, a striking structure shaped like a giant traditional Balinese bell. Inside, dioramas, sculptures, and artifacts offer deep insights into Bali's history. Be sure to visit the observation deck for a breathtaking 360-degree view of Denpasar.

Next, head to Bali Museum, located in the heart of Denpasar near Puputan Square. This museum showcases the island's rich culture through exhibits of ancient artifacts, traditional costumes, and ceremonial objects. The museum itself is an architectural gem, featuring ornate gates, stone pathways, centuries-old statues, and open-air pavilions framed by lotus ponds. Just a short stroll away, you will discover Jagatnatha Temple, a sacred site dedicated to Sanghyang Widi Wasa, the Supreme God in Balinese Hinduism. The temple symbolizes the unity of all deities and serves as a peaceful retreat amid the city's hustle.

Conclude your journey at Kumbasari Market, one of Bali's largest and most vibrant traditional markets. Experience the lively exchange between sellers and buyers while browsing an eclectic mix of fresh produce, handcrafted goods and colorful textiles, blending traditional charm with Denpasar's modern cityscape.





## *The Enchanted South*

### **ULUWATU SUNSET & KECAK DANCE**

Experience the enchantment of the Bukit peninsula, renowned as one of the world's premier surfing destinations, by embarking on a journey to one of Bali's most iconic temples. Perched majestically on a cliff overlooking the southern coastline, Uluwatu offers mesmerising views of the vast Indian Ocean. For an unforgettable cultural experience, venture to the open-air amphitheater adjacent to the temple and immerse yourself in a traditional Kecak performance, also known as fire dance, set against the backdrop of a breathtaking sunset. Conclude your evening with a delectable "feet in the sand" Seafood BBQ on the shores of Jimbaran beach.

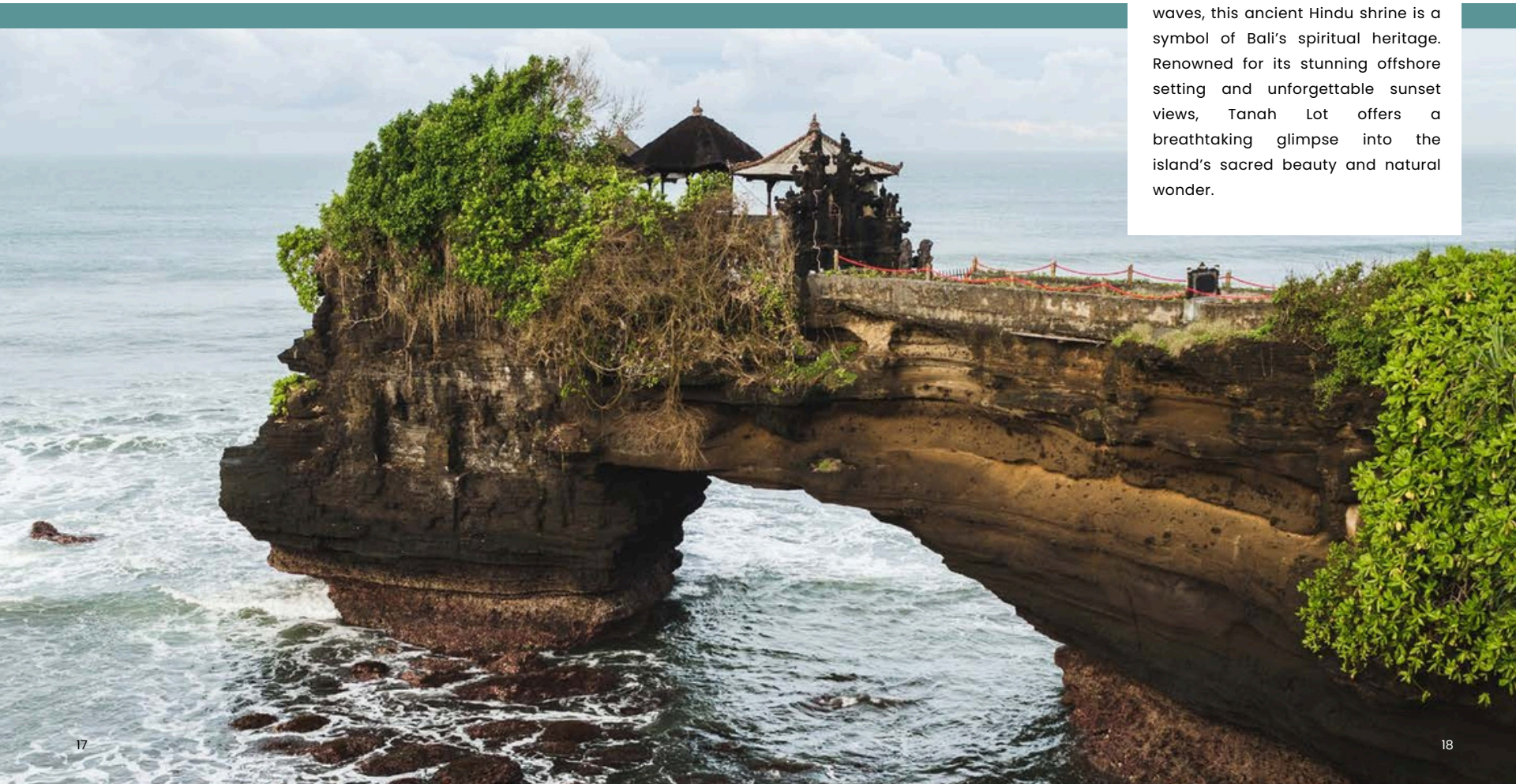
# *The Spiritual West*

## **TANAH LOT**

Start your day with a traditional purification ritual, known as Melukat, at the breathtaking Taman Beji Griya Waterfall. Nestled in the lush greenery of Badung Regency, this hidden gem is a sacred site to seek inner renewal through the healing powers of natural spring water. Cleanse your mind and spirit in one of nine sacred springs, while taking in the awe-inspiring views of the twin waterfalls.

Next, head to Taman Ayun Temple in the village of Mengwi. Known as the “Garden Temple,” this serene sanctuary is a masterpiece of traditional Balinese architecture, set within meticulously manicured gardens and tranquil water features.

Continue westward to Tanah Lot, one of Bali’s most revered sea temples. Perched atop a dramatic rock formation amidst crashing tidal waves, this ancient Hindu shrine is a symbol of Bali’s spiritual heritage. Renowned for its stunning offshore setting and unforgettable sunset views, Tanah Lot offers a breathtaking glimpse into the island’s sacred beauty and natural wonder.





# *The Scenic West* **BATU KARU & JATILUWIH**

The ultimate journey tailored for nature enthusiasts. Traverse traditional villages frozen in time as you venture towards the sacred Batu Karu temple. Perched at an elevation of 2,000 meters above sea level and enveloped by ancient forests, this revered site offers a tranquil sanctuary amidst nature's embrace.

Continue your expedition to the Jatiluwih rice terraces, a UNESCO World Heritage site and one of the island's most breathtaking panoramas. Marvel at the captivating scenery of the rice ridges nestled at the foot of Mount Batu Karu, providing both stunning photo opportunities and insights into Bali's traditional irrigation system, the Subak.

Following your exploration, unwind at one of the panoramic restaurants before commencing your journey back eastward. Make a special stop at the sacred Kayu Putih tree in Desa Tua and learn about its mysterious tales.





## *The Wild East* **GOA LAWAH & TIRTA GANGGA**

Start your day with a visit to the mystical cave temple of Goa Lawah, home to thousands of bats. Journey onward to Tenganan Village, inhabited by Bali's indigenous people, the Bali Aga. Here, amidst the timeless landscape, the Bali Aga maintain a traditional rural lifestyle, preserving their unique heritage and traditions.

Savor lunch in the serene coastal town of Candidasa

before continuing to the enchanting water gardens of Tirta Gangga. The royal palace boasts a labyrinth of pools and fountains, surrounded by lush gardens adorned with intricate carvings and statues.

On your return journey to The Pavilions, traverse traditional snake fruit plantations and the terraced hills of the Sidemen valley, soaking in the picturesque beauty of Bali's countryside.



# *The Secret Valley* **SIDEMEN**



Discover an untouched panorama of lush rice terraces, majestic volcanoes, and charming villages. Pause at an Endek weaving center, where intricate ikat fabric, synonymous with Bali's vibrant sarongs, is meticulously handwoven following ancient traditions.
