## **Sunday School in March**

It's March, and it's time to talk about LENT. Since we have been learning about Moses through the month of February, we've had to back track a wee bit. Lent officially began on Feb 14<sup>th</sup>, Ash Wednesday. So what is LENT? And why is it observed for 40 days? These and many more fantastic questions are what we dived into on Sunday March 3<sup>rd</sup> at Alsfeldt.





Lent is the season leading up to Easter. This is similar to Advent, the season we celebrate leading up to Christmas. Forty days represent a deep significance as well - Moses spent 40 days on Mount Sinai and Jesus spent 40 days in the wilderness. Both Moses and Jesus spent their 40 days fasting and in prayer, refusing temptation and coming closer to God. But why should

we fast or give something up during Lent? We do it for the same reasons that Moses and Jesus did - during Lent, we remove "SOMETHING" to make room for the "ONE THING". By giving something up for Lent, we are able to pursue and celebrate God and his goodness like never before.



To help our Sunday Schoolers understand Lent more fully, we watched a few short videos that included the explanation of Lent and a prayer to kick start the

in our lives that change? Answers included: The clocks as we sprung forward one hour this morning, the weather as we woke up to the ground covered in white snow, seasons, our hair style etc. The point was life is in constant change, BUT there is "ONE THING" that will never change and that's God and his love for us. At this point in our lesson, I was feeling quite confident and hoping that this statement would sink in and have an "ohhh yeah" kind of moment for our children, but I had a hand go up right away. "Yes Theodore" I replied to the six year old's eager hand.







"God does change...you told us that God can be 3 persons – The Father, Son and Holy Spirit" Theodore stated. Busted! Yes, I suppose in that regard God does change...So let's just say that His everlasting love for us NEVER changes;)

Hebrews 13:8 shows us that:

"Jesus Christ is the same yesterday and today and forever"
