


Apple Picking Trip

September 2025 Trustee Flash

Recent Accomplishments

Victoria House Rental Success - Great news! The house is now rented for \$1,750 per month. We've contracted with Kim Davis of KDD Realtors to manage the property professionally. Special thanks to John Waldrop, who volunteered his time and equipment to add topsoil, plant grass seed, remove an old stump, and smooth the yard at no charge to the church.

HVAC Maintenance - We've replaced the second HVAC unit on the Education Building. The 12-year-old unit was reaching the end of its service life, and this proactive replacement ensures continued comfort and efficiency.

Phase 1 Master Plan Update

Six Years of Planning Come Together - Over the past six years, we've developed a comprehensive Master Plan for our facilities. When the full scope proved financially challenging, we strategically divided it into manageable phases, with Phase 1 addressing the most critical foundation needs.

Thorough Contractor Research - We've been diligent in our planning process:

- Contacted 12 companies for bids
- Received 7 responses (2 for asphalt-only work)
- Evaluated 5 comprehensive proposals
- 3 credible contractors with comparable bids

The Phase 1 Investment - Based on three comprehensive bids from credible contractors, each approximately \$1.7 million, our recommended Phase 1 investment is:

\$1.7 million for comprehensive infrastructure project

\$100,000 contingency fund

Total: \$1.8 million

What Phase 1 Delivers - This comprehensive plan addresses multiple facility needs simultaneously:

- Essential drainage infrastructure (the foundation for everything else)
- Safe preschool drop-off area and also for church members
- Improved handicap accessibility
- Better traffic flow and parking solutions
- More welcoming entrance to the sanctuary without a ramp
- Prevention of future costly emergency repairs
- Enlarged playground area for preschool
- Enhanced parking lot safety
- Foundation infrastructure for any future building expansion

Trustee Flash Continued...

Next Steps: Finance Committee and Congregation Decision

The Trustees' Role Complete - We have fulfilled our responsibility by:

- Developing a comprehensive plan with professional site design
- Obtaining all necessary city permits
- Securing multiple credible contractor bids
- Presenting the complete proposal to Administrative Council

Finance Committee's Critical Role - We have provided the \$1.8 million total as a starting point to determine what level of investment our church can afford. The Finance Committee will analyze our financial capacity and present funding options.

Your Decision to Make - Ultimately, this decision belongs to our congregation. The Trustees have listened to your suggestions for facility improvements and worked to develop a comprehensive solution. Now it's up to all of us together to decide:

- · What level of investment can we responsibly make
- How to fund the project (if approved)

When to move forward with implementation

Responding to Your Input - This Phase 1 plan directly addresses many concerns and suggestions we've heard from church members over the years. The Trustees have worked hard to create a solution that improves multiple aspects of our facilities while providing the essential foundation for future growth.

A Foundation for the Future - Whatever the congregation decides, Phase 1 provides the infrastructure foundation essential for any future building projects. This isn't just about fixing current problems – it's about enabling our church's continued growth and ministry expansion for decades to come.

The Trustees stand ready to support whatever decision the congregation makes regarding this important investment in our church's future.
