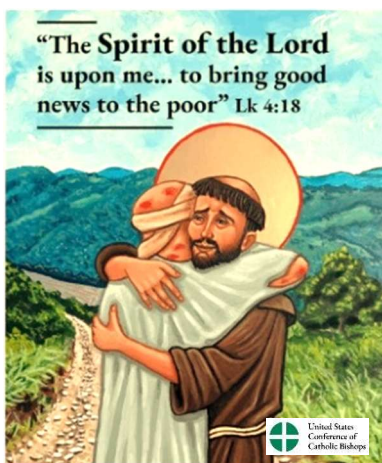

15th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Seeds of God's Promise

The 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A invites us to think about how God's word works in our lives. Each reading uses simple images from the world around us. Rain, seeds, soil, and harvest all show how God's word brings life and hope. These readings remind us that God always works with purpose.

In Isaiah, we hear how God's word is like rain that makes the earth fruitful. Paul tells us in Romans that creation itself longs for freedom and shares in our hope. In the Gospel, Jesus uses the parable of the Sower to teach us that our hearts must be ready to receive God's word.

On the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year A, these passages come together to remind us that God's plan is certain. His word nourishes us, even when life feels dry or hard. With open hearts, we can grow strong in faith and bear much fruit.

6 Ways to Grow in Devotion to the Precious Blood

Here are a few steps to increase our love and reverence for the Precious Blood and grow in awareness of its power in our lives:

1. **Attend daily Mass** and receive the Holy Eucharist, the Body and Blood of The Lord.
2. **Meditate** on the seven accounts in Sacred Scripture that Jesus shed His blood for us: Circumcision, Agony in the garden, Scourging at the pillar, Crowning of thorns, Carrying of the Cross, Crucifixion, and Piercing of His side.
3. **Make a Sacrifice for others** each week. Our Lord willingly shed His blood, laying down His life for us. We can imitate Him by laying down our will, plans, or comfort to serve our neighbor. In that way, we follow Jesus in His sacrifice and show Him tangible love.
4. **Memorize Scripture** verses mentioning the Precious Blood:
Romans 5:9: "Since, therefore, we are now justified by his blood, much more shall we be saved by him from the wrath of God."
Ephesians 2:13: "But now in Christ Jesus, you who once were far off have been brought near in the blood of Christ."
1 John 1:7: "[I]f we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship with one another, and the blood of Jesus his Son cleanses us from all sin."
5. **Pray a litany**, chaplet, or offering of Reparation to the Most Precious Blood of Jesus.
6. **Say this short prayer** throughout the day to continually remind yourself of your salvation: "Most Precious Blood of Jesus Christ, save us and the whole world!"
