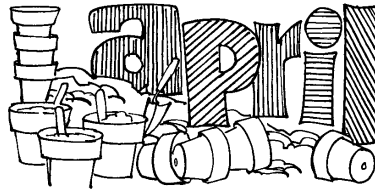

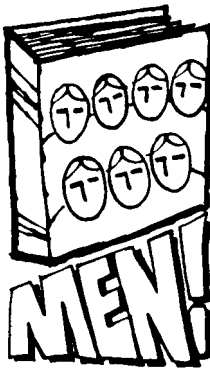

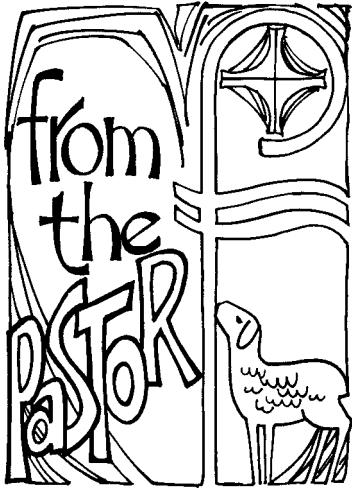


## ONGOING FUNDRAISERS...

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,



It is hard to believe but Holy Week is upon us! As I ponder this week to come, I want to engage you in a philosophical question. If given a plate full of delicious French fries along with a side of nutritious and life-giving kale; which do you eat first and most of? As you ponder deeply, I must point out

that the temptation of this week is to skip to Resurrection. It is savory to our soul to dwell in a place of life and hope and not walk the path of rejection and crucifixion which embody Maundy Thursday and Good Friday respectively. I would argue that the life-giving part of Jesus journey is not the Resurrection itself. After all we serve a God that can bring life from dry bones and water from stones and bringing the Son of God back to life is absolutely within God's power. What is nourishing to the soul is knowing what Jesus endured and suffered while at the same time forgiving and loving all along the way. Consider the following thought:

*"You become a hypocrite when you can't freely be at peace with others, but you can carry green palm leaves to church to commemorate "palm Sunday"! Throw those palm leaves somewhere; and lay your life down for someone to walk on and get to the destined land!"*

These words stung me hard at first. It is brutal to think how quickly Jesus went from proclamations of "Hosanna" to angry petitions to crucify him. In the same way, we are not truly at peace with ourselves unless we commit to action and not just ceremony. I encourage us all first to embrace the entirety of Holy Week. Sit at the table when Jesus calls out Judas. Walk beside him as he carries our shame on the Cross and his friends abandon him. Come to the empty tomb and rejoice that even if we are hypocrites and fall short, we still receive the Glory because of Grace! That said, how we live our lives newly invigorated by the power of Resurrection matters greatly. This season is an opportunity to recharge our spiritual

batteries and be the hands and feet of Jesus day in and day out.

First Thessalonians 4:14 proclaims: *For we believe that Jesus died and rose again, and so we believe that God will bring with Jesus those who have fallen asleep in him (NIV translation)*

Perhaps if we are not careful, we can become too complacent and fall asleep at the wheel when it comes to Discipleship. I am guilty sometimes of focusing on my own problems and not seeing the hurting person right next to me. Easter is a bombastic reminder that he is Alive and that the life which dwells in us is to be shared in all we do! I pray that we can all wake up with new Hope, Love, and Peace as we witness the harrowing and triumphant story of Jesus carrying the weight of all the sin and death in world!
