KEY CONSTRUCTION UPDATES & MILESTONES



LOOKING AHEAD

- Continued block installation will bring additional portions of the facility to roof height.
- Structural steel installation will begin transforming the building's overall profile and footprint.
- Roofing deck work will advance construction toward a fully enclosed structure.
- Utility infrastructure and site logistics will continue expanding to support upcoming phases of construction.

- Concrete block walls continue to rise across the facility, with several sections now approaching roof height.
- Major slab pours have been completed for the gymnasium and main Club areas, marking another significant milestone in the vertical construction process.
- Under-slab utilities and infrastructure have been installed throughout key portions of the site, supporting continued building progress.
- Installation of the stormwater retention exfiltration system continues in phases. As sections are completed and stabilized, additional construction staging and material storage space becomes available for subcontractors.
- Work has advanced on bringing water and sewer services into the site, supporting future building operations and utility connections.
- Structural steel delivery is anticipated soon, with installation of beams and bar joists representing the next major phase of construction. Roofing deck installation is expected to follow as the building envelope continues to take shape.

WORKFORCE DEVELOPMENT HIGHLIGHT

The Hobe Sound Workforce Center continues to provide local young adults with access to skilled trades training through a cohort of six students who meet twice weekly for hands-on instruction and industry-recognized curriculum.

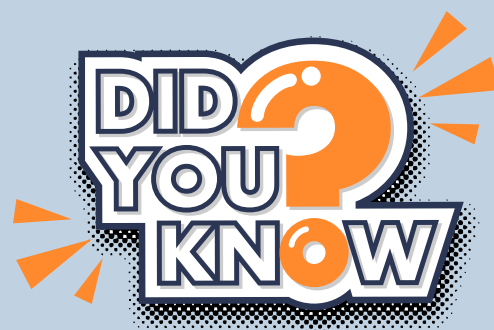
BGCMC recently celebrated the graduation of 50 Workforce Development participants, with 28 graduates now eligible for employment placement or apprenticeship opportunities. These outcomes reflect the organization's commitment to connecting young people and young adults with meaningful career pathways and industry-recognized training.



CLUB ACTIVITIES HIGHLIGHT

Music education continues to engage Hobe Sound Club members through ukulele instruction, percussion exercises, guitar demonstrations, and other hands-on experiences that build focus, confidence, and self-expression.

Currently serving approximately 20–25 members, the program provides access to instruments and musical experiences many youth would not otherwise have. Looking ahead, the new Hobe Sound Club's dedicated Music Studio Clubhouse will give members a purpose-built space to learn, create, and perform.



The new Hobe Sound Club will be the second BGCMC Club to feature dedicated workforce labs, expanding career exploration and industry-recognized training opportunities for youth ages 16–24 while inspiring younger members to begin thinking about their futures long before they enter the workforce.
