## THOUGHTS FROM OUR TRANSITIONAL PASTOR

### Faith, Family, and "Post-Easter Days"

A minister friend remarked to me recently that he found it much easier to preach during Lent and Easter than he does in these "post-Easter" days. I have never felt this way although I understand his thinking. His intriguing remark did cause me to do some reflection. To be sure, the Lenten and Easter seasons of worship do provide deep and great themes to preach about - - discipleship, the cross, and resurrection. But equally true is the fact that the risen Jesus left us with great work to do. Are there not equally great themes of faith to preach on and live for during these "post- Easter "days? A good example is the family. Our church will be highlighting the importance of family on many Sundays in the coming weeks – Children's Day Worship on May 5, Mother's Day and Parent-Child Dedications on May 12; Children and Youth music programs, and Youth/Graduate Sunday on June 2. Our next season of the church is a great time to celebrate the gift of family – and the "family of God" as Pentecost Sunday happens on May 19!

As I contemplated this matter, I was reminded of how grateful I am that Jesus is our Lord and Savior for all of life and days, not just the "high and holy" ones. Faith and trust

in God are meant for all our days and not just for the "holy days" of the church. So, in this season of returning to the routines of living and of a devoted life, let us not grow weary in well-doing. Jesus has entrusted the ministry of God's love to us. Our faith in God ought to be good for the long haul and for going the distance. There is nothing to prevent us from continuing to sing the "jubilant alleluias" of our faith just as we did during the Easter season. So, sing brothers and sisters, sing of your faith and trust in God who is the same yesterday, today, and forever!

Here might be one good thing to do. Take the Lenten teaching of Jesus to "love one another as I have loved you" and put it into practice as you go about your daily routines this week. If you will put this teaching of our Lord into practice, you may find that these "post-Easter" days are full of surprises and spiritual blessings you never imagined. And who knows – a "great door, a wide door" may open right before you!

In this month of Jesus' ultimate sacrifice of his life, do we have amnesia?


Do we forget how truly thankful we should be for all that we have - our freedom, our families and this wonderful church community?


#### Studies in Paul: His Life and Letters

### Kairos Prison Ministry, Scotland Correctional Institute (SCI)

On behalf of the volunteer laymen and clergy, Kairos Prison Ministry, Scotland Correctional Institute, we would like to share with you a few of the many impacts of God's work inside the prison March 7-10. Our 18 inmates, whom we refer to as residents, are seated at three tables, called families, along with three Kairos volunteers/clergy. The residents are all volunteers and selected by the SCI Chaplain and approved by the Warden. More than 60 of the 1800 inmates wanted to participate. However, we did not have an adequate number of Kairos volunteers to serve more inmates. We had 24 Kairos volunteers on our Inside and Support Team plus all the donated food.

The Kairos mission is to share God's Agape Love through God's Word and actions. As we shared Agape through talks, meditations, scripture and other activities, residents were given opportunities to share their Kairos experience. One resident said he had not been treated with such dignity for so many years that he had forgotten what it was like. Another shared that his faith was hanging on by a thread and the ministry rekindled his trust in God and way ahead. Another shared that these days came at a perfect time in his depressed life and lifted his spirits. Another said that our Kairos letters to him were the first that he had received in prison.

Good food is a key portion of the ministry since the residents live in a very disciplined environment, where most of their decisions are made for them, combined with very bland inexpensive food. Breakfast is served at 3:00 AM, lunch at 11:00 AM and dinner at 2:30 PM. Not all have jobs, however, they seek work to make the meager wages of 7-32 cents per hour. Their money is used for phone calls, items in the canteen and extra time on their laptops.

We all were blessed seeing the expression of caring and support by so many individuals, churches, and restaurants. Our church and others provided links for the prayer chain, placemats with uplifting words and drawings, donations, and many prayers. The prayer chain and went around the 21x40 foot room two and a half times. There were also many posters

placed on the walls from other Kairos Prison Ministries from several states and as far away as Australia. We wish that you could see the residents' expressions, with tears in their eyes, gazing at the displayed love, caring and support.

Another inspirational aspect of the Kairos Prison Ministry is that we do not abandon the "graduates" after the 3.5 day inside event. A Kairos volunteer goes to SCI every Wednesday evening for "Prayer & Share" led by the graduates. We also have reunions to encourage the graduates in their spiritual life. Our prayers are that they learn to trust in God and share His love with others.

Thank you for your prayers, prayer chain links, placemats, and financial donations. And a special thanks to Eric Corbett and Chick-fil-A for their donation of the first breakfast served Friday morning. You can imagine the smiles of joy with the tasty breakfast sandwiches and other goodies.
