

THOUGHTS FROM OUR TRANSITIONAL PASTOR

WELCOME TO THE SEASON OF LENT!

Surprise! Surprise! First Baptist Church Family:

I can hardly believe I am writing to you relative to the Christian season of Lent. Did we not just complete Advent? February does find us on the doorstep of another major Christian season. Time does move on.

The Christian season of Lent begins with Ash Wednesday (February 14) this year and continues until Palm Sunday (March 24). Lent is the forty-day period of special focus on discipleship leading up to Holy Week which comes early this year (March 25- 30) and then Easter Sunday arrives on March 31.

Lent is a time when Christians are encouraged to do serious reflection, seek to walk closer to Jesus, and be reminded of the great gift of salvation from our sins. Marjorie Thompson, a Christian writer, calls Lent "the spring cleaning of the Church." Indeed, this season is a time to fight back against those things in our lives which pull us away from faithful and obedient discipleship. Our church will enhance our Lenten observance with special Lenten services on Wednesday nights and sermons on the six Sundays during this period.

A popular tradition of Lent is to give up something for 40 days. The idea behind this tradition is to show the same discipline and obedience that Jesus showed during his 40-day battle in the wilderness with Satan. (I will be glad to give up liver for Lent!) But if "giving up something" is not your thing, try this: add something for Lent. How about one of these? Add more joy and less bitterness; add more hope and less pessimism; and add more God's book and less Facebook. Any takers?

On the first Sunday of Lent (February 18), we will remember the time when Jesus wrestled with the devil in the wilderness. We wrestle with the devil as well. Lent is a time to fight back, and not let the devil do us in. We can strive to say with Jesus, "Be gone, Satan. You shall worship the Lord our God and him only shall you serve." This affirmation about God is surely the true goal of Lent.





SENIORS ON THE MOVE

MUSIC MINISTRY & SENIOR ADULT MINISTRY



We are nearing the Holy season of Lent, the time that Christians use to prepare for the pinnacle of the church year—

Holy Week. The roots of the word "lent" refer to the lengthening days as springtime approaches. Spiritually, Lent is a time of preparation for a celebration. If you have ever thrown a dinner party, you know the hours of preparation involved in such a feat. To celebrate well, one must prepare well.

The real aim of Lent is, more than anything else, to prepare believers for the celebration of the death and Resurrection of Christ. The better the preparation, the more glorious the celebration. We can more meaningfully experience this mystery with purified minds and hearts.

Lent represents an opportunity to try to separate ourselves from sin and selfishness. As we do this, we can more intently focus on God's will for our lives and his kingdom's work by allowing it to become fully alive in our hearts.

So, how do we prepare? Typically, Christians observe three disciplines throughout Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. These three practices are often referred to as the *three pillars of Lent*. Almsgiving, which focuses on the needs of others, is probably the least understood of these pillars. It has most often been thought of as taking care of the needs of the poor; however, it does not have to end there. Perhaps the more current expression "acts of kindness" is closer to the essence of almsgiving.

The Lenten season can be a meaningful time for those who are devoted to prayer. St. Augustine described fasting and almsgiving as "the two wings of prayer" because they are signs of humility and charity. I believe St. Augustine's statement is a fantastic way to sum up a time-honored view of Lenten preparation.

I would add *worship* to this discussion as an indispensable action that helps us prepare for Lent, because worship is a time when we can meet with the living God while we pray for and encourage each other.



Ash Wednesday falls on February 14th this year—a rare meeting with Valentine's Day. Ash Wednesday focuses on two main ideas: the fallen nature of human beings and our own mortality.

One of my post graduate professors would occasionally remind the class of our human condition by quietly stating, "Remember, you are dust." *All go to the same place; all come from dust, and to dust all return.* (Ecclesiastes 3:20). This year, with the meeting of Ash Wednesday and Valentine's Day, perhaps we can redirect our thoughts to consider another idea: "Remember, you are deeply loved." The depths of God's love brought Jesus to the manger, and love took him to the cross. Then, in victory, Jesus rose victorious over sin and death. We are deeply loved.

Ashes symbolize both death and repentance; this is a time for turning away from sin and renewing our love for God. Ashes can serve as a reminder that we belong to God. The willingness to wear ashes on one's forehead is a sign of repentance that comes from the truth in Ecclesiastes. If you attend this service, the receiving of ashes is open to you; it is not mandatory. Ash Wednesday, the beginning of Lent, observes the experiences of Christ in the wilderness and his temptation by Satan. Believers observe 40 days of fasting and repentance to remember Christ's experiences and learn from what he sacrificed for us. (Our service is at 6:00 p.m.)



Our February activity will feature a game day on Monday, February 12th. Come out at 2:00 p.m. and spend time playing some board games and fun activities with your friends. Snacks and beverages will be provided. Bingo included!
