

PRISON MINISTRY

The Kairos Prison Ministry at the Scotland Correctional Institute in Laurinburg, NC, volunteers thank you for your \$400 contribution. The Kairos mission is to share God's Agape Love with both the inmates and SCI staff through God's Word and promise that He cares and has a plan for everyone. We share Agape through letters, talks, meditations, prayer, and scripture during structured 3.5 Day Events and weekly Prayer and Share.

Please pray with us for sufficient volunteers and resources to host an Inside 3.5 Day Event March 7-10, 2024. This is our first 3.5 Day Event since the fall of 2018. COVID and SCI staff shortages prohibited the events that are the foundation for the Kairos Mission to share the transforming love and forgiveness of Jesus Christ to impact the lives of the incarcerated, their families and the staff.

Good food is a key portion of the ministry since the inmates live in a very disciplined environment combined with bland inexpensive food. Please pray for a successful Inside Event in March where lives are changed through the power of the Holy Spirit. We will be contacting SS classes for the creation of a Prayer Chain, for colorful individual place mats, and for meal tickets to help with funding. Please pray and let me know if you can be a volunteer for our Inside or Support Team. There are mandatory training sessions on Jan 6 and 20 plus on Feb 3 and 17. We have cabins reserved at Camp Monroe. My experience is that the blessing that you receive from serving far exceeds your contributions.
