# THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR DAVID

### RENEWAL SERVICES, SUNDAY, MAY 21

We will host our Spring Renewal Services on Sunday, May 21, 8:30 and 11:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. The Reverend Debra Gray will be our guest preacher. Many of us will remember that Debra preached the Ecumenical Ash Wednesday Service in February and will recall that she is a very gifted preacher. Let me tell you a little about Debra. She is a native of New York City and now lives in West Southern Pines. Debra and her late husband, Tobey, moved to North Carolina in 2014. Debra was on the ministerial staff of Trinity A.M.E. Zion Church in Southern Pines until the Bishop appointed her as pastor. She is currently Pastor at Love Grove A.M.E. Zion Church. Debra founded The Heritage Creative Arts School, a hybrid high school in Moore County. Debra holds a Bachelor of Arts in English Education, a Master of Science in Educational Science, and recently graduated from Duke Divinity School with a Master of Divinity. More importantly, Debra is a gifted proclaimer of the gospel. I am confident that she will bring an inspirational message of faith! Our theme for the Renewal Services will be "Repent and Believe the Good News." Our renewal scripture is Mark 1: 14-15: "Jesus came to Galilee, proclaiming the good news of God, and saying, 'The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news." The morning services will follow our regular schedules. We will have a light supper at 5:00 p.m., followed by our evening renewal service. There is no charge for the supper, but we ask you to make reservations so that we know how to prepare properly. We are also planning a baptismal service that morning and one that evening for anyone who wants to be baptized or to make a profession of faith. I hope you will mark your calendar for these renewal services.

### REMEMBERING WHO WE ARE!

As we transition, one of the keys to good change is remembering who we are. This past vear we have been careful to discuss our Core Values and renew our Church Covenant in worship. I have preached on a number of those core values this past year. I plan to return to those this summer. One that we have long affirmed and must confirm diligently is our commitment to women in ministry. Our Core Values state, "We affirm the individuality of our calling before God and affirm that men and women are equal and free before God to pursue their calling as ministers." First Baptist Church, Southern Pines, has a long history of affirming women in ministry. We ordained women deacons in the early 1970s, and the church has consistently ordained women ministers through the years. We believe that practice is grounded in the sacred scriptures. I plan to preach on that this summer after I conclude my current preaching series. You may have heard in the news that a group of

Southern Baptist leaders is targeting churches with women pastors. I was surprised that the Executive Committee voted, to use my term, to disfellowship Saddleback Church because they have a woman Associate Pastor who preaches periodically. Rick Warren has pastored that church for over forty years. The SBC, to be fair, uses the language of "churches not in friendly cooperation." The result is the same no matter what language we use. In recent years, we have observed a trend in the SBC to begin using the language of "pastor" for a variety of roles when the position involves broad leadership in the church; for example, the trend would be for a Minister of Education to be called the Associate Pastor of Education. The shift in language is subtle, but it has a clear ideological purpose to restrict the role to "men only." Now there is a group within the SBC seeking to target churches where women hold the title of pastor or associate pastor. Simultaneously, some are working to recommend that all SBC churches be required to sign the 2000 Baptist Faith & Message. As these developments unfold, it will be important that First Baptist be proactive in our response. Therefore, I recommend that our Enlistment Committee enlist once again a Denominational Relations Committee. In 1998 and through the early 2000s, the Denominational Relations Committee studied the issues and guided the church in making important decisions. We are in need of such wise guidance in these

denominational times.

### **QUARTERLY FINANCIAL REPORT**

### March 2023 vs March 2022

Through the first three months of 2023 we received \$319,380 in budget contributions, \$44,557 less than our giving goal of \$357,190. In 2022 our receipts were \$327,168, \$7,788 more than in the current year.

The church's operating cash flow increased in the first quarter of 2023, receipts exceeding expenses by \$19,016. By comparison, in the first quarter of 2022 receipts exceeded expenses by \$29,625.

The balance in the Capital Improvement Fund on March 31, 2023, was \$65,835. The Annie Armstrong Easter and CBF Global Missions Easter Offerings goal for 2023 is \$6,500. Through the end of March, we received \$2,150.

The balance of our General Endowment Fund through March 31, 2023, was \$414,675. The Jeannie H. Jordan Memorial Endowment for the benefit of Sonshine Learning Center had a balance of \$73,379 and helped fund four scholarships during the current school year. The Brent Godfrey Memorial Youth Fund had a balance of \$107,088.


