A Note from Our Senior Minister

SEPTEMBER 3, 2025, Program Year begins. Wednesday night suppers return, and all programs begin.

Adults will meet in the Fellowship Hall at 6:00 p.m. for a special presentation. Sam Harrell – Executive Director of Africa Exchange and a friend of mine - will join us on Wednesday, September 3, to lead a conversation with all adults about a potential mission opportunity for our church to consider.

Sam was born to Baptist missionary parents in Nairobi, Kenya, where he spent all of his childhood and most of his adult life. Married to Melody (spiritual director, born and raised in Uganda), they have three adult sons.

A graduate of North Carolina State University and Baptist Theological Seminary at Richmond, Sam, together with Melody, founded Africa Exchange in 1997, which they operated for over 16 years under the auspices of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship as global field personnel. This was followed by a 7- year period in CBF leadership in Atlanta as Associate Coordinator of Global Missions.

Sam's primary work has been in community development and appropriate technology with marginalized urban and rural communities in Kenya.

Everyone is invited to come, listen, and learn how to be in prayer. Then, our prayers will guide us to consider if a small group from the church would be called to join in the Africa Exchange ministry through a Kutana Kenya experience.

You are invited to learn from Sam about the invitation for our church to join Kutana Kenya – 2026.

"Kutana" is a Swahili word signifying 'mutual encounter' and is the guiding ethos of Africa Exchange. Kutana Kenya is a 10-day mission immersion experience in a cross-cultural setting in one of the most ecologically diverse environments on earth.

Participants will encounter and engage people, projects, ecosystems, and places of significance, all in the context of a developing nation grappling with multiple social and environmental challenges.

Africa Exchange seeks to facilitate commitments and relationships that result in mutual transformation. Through cross-cultural encounters and service-learning, the Kutana Kenya experience inspires participants to become agents of transformation. This is achieved through partnership and support of Africa Exchange projects and programs, as well as by building participants' capacity to enhance engagement in their own contexts.

Menu: BBQ and fried chicken, mac 'n cheese, fried okra, rolls and banana pudding. **Cost:** \$10.00.



NEWS & NOTES FROM THE MINISTER OF EDUCATION & ADMINISTRATION


It's that time again. BridgePoints will begin September 10. We begin with two offerings "To Think As God Thinks..." presented by David Helms, and "Into the Heart of Romans" presented by Mathew Purser. Both presenters will offer you much to think about. Join us on September 10.



We often think of Christianity as a religion of repentance from the path of sin and an extension of grace to us. Jesus' words in the Gospel of Mark emphasize this dimension of faith: "The time is fulfilled, and the kingdom of God has come near; repent, and believe in the good news" (Mark 1:15). Yet, too many Christians have reduced the radical message of Jesus to be a simple transaction of confessing a sinful act or thought and receiving God's forgiveness only go on merrily the way we always have been. The gospel demands much more. What the New Testament calls for is a transformation of our mind. Christian faith calls us to think differently about life, faith, and God. This series will challenge believers to see that following Christ involves a radical rethinking of our lives, our values, and our commitments. The renowned New Testament scholar, Stephen Neill, once remarked in a chapel service, "Learning to think the way God thinks is the best expression of what it means to be converted." This series will explore how Christian thinking changes how we perceive ourselves, others, and society.
