Parish Mission Statement

Our Mary Queen community, inspired by faith and love, will live, worship, teach, welcome and support one another in the imitation of Christ.

I. GENERAL INFORMATION

A. <u>Communication</u>: We are here to serve the religious educational needs of our youth. If you have any questions, comments or suggestions, contact the Youth Ministry Office. Contact the Directors of Youth Faith Formation for inquiries concerning the Junior High, High School, and Confirmation programs. Contact the Faith Formation Director for registration and general information. Contact information can be found on page2.

Communication is made in the following manner:

- **Phone & Email:** Information is sent to parents primarily by email and flocknote. Parents should also check for notices in the Sunday bulletin. All e-mail and telephone communications made by the parish or core team will conform to the Archdiocesan confidentiality policy. See section on Safe Environment Program (page 5) for further details.
- Websites: Parents/Guardians and students are encouraged to visit the Mary Queen's website (and Religious Education page): www.maryqueencatholicchurch.org. This website contains helpful information about each of our Youth Ministry programs which will assist you with upcoming events, workshops, calendars and volunteer opportunities.

Social Media: The Junior High & High School programs will also Mary Queen's Facebook as a mass communication resource. It will contain updates and resources for both students and parents of both programs.

B. <u>Safe Environment Program</u>: The Core Team and assistants will provide a loving Christian atmosphere within the classroom so that youth will be able to learn and recognize they are special children of God. The Core Team are also positive Christian role models who are prepared to teach and discuss the designated curriculum. All Core Team and their Assistants have completed the CMG Safe Haven Online Training as required by the Archdiocese of

Galveston-Houston, USCCB (United States Conference of Catholic Bishops) and Mary Queen Parish. Phone numbers and e-mail addresses will be provided to the Core Team and Aides. They will be used strictly for Youth Ministry communications and be done in conformity with the Archdiocesan confidentiality policy as outlined in the CMG Safe Haven Program.

CMG Safe Haven Online Training is a required course within our Archdiocese and Parish. It must be completed by anyone having regular, on-going contact with children in our Youth Ministry programs, or Youth Ministry socials, events, and activities. Individuals must have taken the CMG Safe Haven Training Program, as well as completed the required paperwork which includes a Code of Conduct, Volunteer Information Sheet, and Background Check Authorization Form.

II. PROGRAM GUIDELINES

- A. <u>Admission Policies</u>: Regular registration cost for parishioners is \$65.00 per student with a family maximum of \$195.00. Regular registration cost for non-parishioners is \$95.00 per student with a family maximum of \$285.00. The pastoral policy of Mary Queen Parish recognizes that each student has the right to Catholic formation and guarantees each student enrollment in the faith formation program regardless of financial limitations. No student will be denied due to funding. See the Director for the Youth Office for information.
- Youth Preparing for the Sacrament of Confirmation: 10th, 11th, and 12th grade students who will be preparing for this year's Confirmation needs to consult the Sacramental Preparation section (page 7-8) of this handbook for further guidance. A current Baptismal Certificate with the church seal and all associated faith formation and Confirmation fees (\$200 total per Candidate) is required to help cover the additional costs incurred for preparation. For assistance with fees due to financial hardship, please contact the Youth Ministry Director.
- B. **Registration Forms:** Faith Formation Registration forms are now **AVAILABLE ONLINE**. When filling out the registration form, mark the grade your child will be **ENTERING** in the **FALL**, as well as the Sacraments he/she wants to/ is eligible to receive this faith formation year. Registration is required for all Junior High and High School youth.

- Registration is offered beginning in the spring. Check the bulletin for registration times and registration deadline.
- Registration form must be complete and accurate.
- All forms are dated upon arrival, and are processed on a FIRST-COME, FIRST-SERVED BASIS.
- Incomplete registration forms will delay entry of your children into the Faith Formation programs.

C. Classroom Locations and Times:

All Junior High & High School and Confirmation religious education classes are held on campus in either the Parish Center or St Charbel Youth Center. During the class, students meet in a large group for the teaching, then are broken up into small groups with their Core Team leaders and meet for a short time in classrooms.

- D. **Attendance Policy:** Regular attendance at faith formation is an important factor in helping your child deepen their understanding of church teaching, scripture, prayer, and community. CAST and Ark are doing a Trial Year with extended hours but less frequent meetings in the 2023-2024 Faith Formation Year. This means that the 4:30pm Youth Mass is now included in the CAST and Ark Curriculum and is therefore Mandatory. Full attendance credit is only give to those who arrive on time at 3:45pm and stay until 6:45pm.
- E. <u>Arrival and Departure</u>: All students are expected to arrive promptly at class time. Refer to class locations and times above.
 - 2 Late arrival is discouraged. It is disruptive to class. Parents and/or guardians of the students who are consistently late will be notified.

- Early pick-up is also discouraged. Frequently missing all or part of weekly classes does affect your child's religious education.
- ☑ If you need to pick up your child before the scheduled dismissal, the parent/guardian must send a brief note (stating time, date, and signature). Parents must come to the meeting location to pick up your child.
- F. **Emergency Cancellation**: If FISD, CCISD, PISD and/or local schools have closed due to inclement weather or other emergency situations, faith formation classes will be canceled for the day. (We do reserve the right to cancel class even if FISD, CCISD or Pearland is still in session.) If you have any questions about cancellations, please call the Youth Ministry Office at one of the extensions listed in front of the booklet before bringing your child to class. Please use your best judgment about whether or not to bring your child(ren).

III. SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

- A. All students preparing for the sacrament of Confirmation MUST submit a NEW Baptismal Certificate in order to be eligible to be confirmed. If your child was baptized at Mary Queen Church, you will need to fill out the request of verification form given in the Confirmation packet. If they were Baptized elsewhere, you will need to contact the church of baptism and request the new certificate. All Candidates are required to pay the normal faith formation registration fee of \$65 PLUS an additional \$135 fee for Confirmation registration, which covers the additional costs incurred by the Parish for preparation materials, Confirmation Retreat, and the Rite of Confirmation Mass. This fee is due upon registration for Faith/Confirmation formation. Note: The pastoral policies of this parish recognize that each student has the right to Catholic formation and no student will be denied participation due to funding. Please contact your program director for more details.
- B. <u>Confirmation Requirement/Pre-Requisite</u>: For your child to be considered a candidate for the sacrament of Confirmation, they must have attended a minimum of <u>70%</u> of faith formation classes offered in the immediate previous year (Year 1). Teen must be baptized and able to renew Baptismal promises or have

been put into confirmation formation through the RCIA if unbaptized/has not received First Communion. They should exhibit an active faith life and knowledge of the Church by participating in the Sacramental life of the Church especially the Eucharistic liturgies. Youth should also be involved in youth events and activities. Attendance at Faith formation/Confirmation classes are required and missed classes will have to be made up. Teens will also be required to attend the Mary Queen Confirmation Retreat and at least one additional Catholic retreat, Summer Camp or Conference. The Youth Ministry Team will provide the dates of various opportunities to fulfill this requirement as soon as the dates are available.

C. **Expectations**: Readiness Interview: There will be an interview with the child at the beginning of preparation within small groups to ensure full understanding and preparation of the sacrament, and a final individual interview at the end of the Confirmation classes.

Catholic education does NOT end with Confirmation!
It is expected that all Confirmed Teens will continue
attending Youth Group and participate in the life of the
Church through their Senior year in High School.

IV. EXPECTATIONS

- A. <u>Parents</u>: Parents are to see that their children attend classes regularly and on time, as absences and tardiness disrupt the continuity of learning. They should communicate with the Youth Ministry office about any special needs or circumstances that may affect their child during faith formation meetings/classes. Parents are encouraged to be an active part of their children's learning and will be required to attend Parent Sessions during their Teen's Immediate preparation for Confirmation year.
- B. <u>Students</u>: Students are to behave in a Christian manner at all times, and to be respectful and cooperative with any adults assisting within the program. They should actively participate in classroom discussions and activities. Students should attend class regularly, and complete all assignments given. Students should honor the program's Dress Code, Code of Conduct and Policy regarding use of cell phone. Failure to adhere to the dress code or code of conduct could result in a removal from in-person Catechesis.
 - Dress Code: All dress should be modest and appropriate for

Mass. No undergarments should be visible, no shorts are allowed please, nor should bellies or lower backs be visible. If your child cannot wear it to school (shorts, inappropriate logos, words, etc) they cannot wear it to Mass or to Ark and CAST meetings.

- © Code of Conduct: Students will follow classroom rules, respect others and their property, as well as respect church books and church property. Failure to follow the policies and procedures set forth by Mary Queen, the Archdiocese, and it's Directors could result in your child being removed from in-person Catechesis.
- ☑ **Use of Cell Phones/Air Pods:** Upon entering the Main Hall or Youth Center for class students will <u>turn off /silence</u> their cell phones and leave them alone until the program concludes. If a Core member sees a student texting or using a cell phone in any manner during the evening, the Core member will take the phone and the student's parent will be required to retrieve the cell phone from the Director of Youth Ministry and Formation at the end of the night.

V. RIGHT TO AMEND

Mary Queen Catholic Church Youth Ministry Program reserves the right to amend this handbook as necessary. Parents will be notified in writing if changes are made to any procedures or information contained in this handbook.




MARY QUEEN CATHOLIC CHURCH ARK JR. HIGH YOUTH GROUP 6TH - 8TH GRADE
