FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

This Sunday, we the Christians around the world, celebrate Easter. In one of his sermons in his cathedral in North Africa, St. Augustine told his people, "We are Easter men and women and Alleluia should be our song." Alleluia is one of the oldest words in the Bible; it means praise God or thank God. Thank God for all the good things He has done for me, for others and for the whole world. Thank you, Lord, for the people we love and for the people who love us. Thank you, Lord, for good health and security, for our parents and good friends, for happiness, and for a good job. Also, we should be able to sing Alleluia when we encounter problems, sickness, and even death. For problems, worries, and all the difficulties of life: thank you Lord. For both the sunshine and the rain, the good things as well as the bad, Alleluia.

We experience the new life of the risen Lord not only as individuals but also as a community. Where there is communal brokenness, there is the possibility of communal resurrection. The violence of some of our cities, the inequality of wealth, opportunity and its consequent sense of injustice, the prevailing prejudices, the discrimination against classes and colors, and finally, the pandemic of Corona virus are among the many examples of our broken world. What worries me most is when nations are at war. It is heart-breaking to see thousands of civilians and innocent people that are brutally killed and many more searching for refuge and living in fear. We have 11 Polish La Salette missionaries working in Ukraine. Recently, their ministry has simply been reaching out to poor Ukrainians, and breaking and sharing bread with them and the refugees in the face of war. One of our La Salette missionaries in Myanmar is still imprisoned amid the civil war. La Salette missionaries in Haiti live in fear, not knowing their future and the people they serve. It may seem like the light is going out in our world once again. Therefore, the central message of Easter is liberation. So let us begin the walk towards building a new life, and renewing our families, our community, and our nation. Our world needs Easter. Our world needs liberation. We need to be untethered, untied from our brokenness, pride, prejudice, jealousy, and hatred so that we can experience the beauty of new life. There must be an Easter every day of our lives. Then we can really be Easter people, people of resurrection and new life and always sing Alleluia. Thank you, God. To all of you: may God bless you and may the joy of Easter bring cheer, prosperity, and happiness to your life!

What Would Mary Do?

This Easter morning, I am thinking of Mary Magdalene.

I want to know her state of mind as she approached the tomb in the darkness. Was she afraid? Was she thinking clearly? Was she tired? Had grief and trauma robbed her of her sleep the last two nights? What did she intend to do? Anoint Christ's body, yes — but what else? Kiss his hands, trace the markings where the lash had fallen upon his skin? Say goodbye? Weep? Despair?

What were the words she planned to whisper into the cold, empty darkness that morning, as she wept over God's body?

I don't know anything about her state of mind that Easter morning, except that I know she wanted to be with Christ. Perhaps that was all she knew, too. Perhaps she had no other thought, no other desire, than nearness to him. She didn't need to understand everything, and she didn't expect answers — she didn't dare hope for that.

But everything and everyone had fallen apart around her, and in Jesus' presence she knew her heart would be able to rest.

If you have ever been in the midst of a crisis in your life and found yourself pacing the floors of your house when no one else is awake, muttering the words to a prayer you know by heart, you know what Mary Magdalene felt. In those moments, we do not always feel God's presence. Sometimes, when we look for Him, we only see an empty tomb.

When these dark moments come, I pray you will remember the faithfulness of this great saint. Be like Mary Magdalene. Look for Jesus, always. You may not always find him, but he will always find you.

"She ran and went to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and told them, 'They have taken the Lord from the tomb, and we don't know where they put him."" — John 20:2

PRAY & REFLECT

March 31, 2024 Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord

Outside Chicago, there is a small cemetery in the woods behind Mundelein Seminary, where I was a student. One night I was exploring it. I looked up and was shocked to see an imposing seventeen-foot angel towering over me and preparing to blow a trumpet. Adrenaline rushed through me. I gasped and uttered, "Oh my God!" Quickly I realized it was in fact a massive bronze statue. I tried to calm myself down. But it still freaked me out.

As we begin to celebrate Easter today, this image might seem a bit unnerving. But please recall that for the first disciples on the morning of the resurrection, it was precisely that. It wasn't joyful at first, it was terrifying. It wasn't peaceful, it was unsettling. In that Jerusalem cemetery, something otherworldly had happened. Angels announced that he was no longer dead, but alive. They had blown their trumpets, so to speak, and Jesus had risen. Soon the disciples' shock in that dark cemetery would turn into joy.

We all have our own places of the dead, too, don't we? Deceased loved ones. Our tired patterns of blame. Relationships stuck in resentment. Indifference to the poor. Lost dreams. Despair about our future. Fear of sickness and death. These are our "cemeteries" where we don't expect much to happen. Today we enter — if we dare — those places with the disciples. See the mighty angel standing there, trumpet ready to blare!


This is the **7th Year** of the TMIY program in our parish, and this year's theme is **'Thy Kingdom Come.'**

easy way to withdraw from the demands of daily life and enter into a peaceful interior reflection on their relationship with Christ in the context of Marian devotion.



The first words placed in the mouth of Christ in John's Gospel are not: "Follow all these rules or you're going to hell." Rather, Christ probes our hearts with a question: "What are you looking for?" (John 1:38).

Christianity is not primarily a religion of law, as it is so frequently considered. It is first and foremost a religion of longing. The purpose of God's law is to point our longing toward real satisfaction and away from the counterfeits. The "whole life of the good Christian is a holy longing," wrote Saint Augustine. "That is our life, to be trained by longing."

La Salette reflection for Easter Sunday Written by the National La Salette Laity Board



Our Gospel today records the story of the Disciples John and Peter going to the tomb and not finding Jesus there. It states that John saw the empty tomb and believed. What must he have thought? Was it real? Did He rise from the dead?! Was what Jesus said really true? What

does this mean? What a mixture of thoughts and emotions! Did John doubt at all? The Scripture says that he believed!

The first people who heard about the Apparition at La Salette did not believe the children's story. They spent hours harshly interviewing and threatening Maximum and Melanie for years and their story ALWAYS remained exactly the same. Do we sometimes challenge God in this way?

As time went on, the truth, sincerity, honesty and consistency brought even many serious doubters to soften and come to believe. And the consequences of their behavior were avoided. And the crescendo of thousands of pilgrims who came to La Salette after that prayed and sacrificed despite harsh conditions and no accommodations. Miracles happened to many and a whole change in faith and religious practice took over France and much of Europe. Crops flourished and the churches filled again as Mary had predicted: if people convert, the potatoes will be self-sown in the fields.

So today we celebrate the joy of Jesus' resurrection and the eternal life He gave us. We celebrate Mary's visit and desire to call us back to reconciliation with Jesus. She reminds us that unless our spiritual life is healthy and strong, our earthly life, economic life, and political life will not flourish. Do we believe? Let us reflect and speak to God of how we might need to change.

Easter

Question:

Why is the Easter season so long? And should we be doing something special for it?

Answer:

You've probably noticed the priest continuing to wear white vestments at the Sunday liturgy. While we celebrated Christ's resurrection several weeks ago, the Easter season extends fifty days - just over seven weeks - from Easter Sunday to Pentecost. For most of that time — about six weeks — Jesus is still with the disciples, teaching and encouraging them. The Easter season isn't just a celebration of when Jesus is with us. At the Last Supper, Jesus promised to send an "advocate" or "counselor" when he left. At the Ascension, he directs the disciples to await "power from on high" - the coming of the Holy Spirit. The Ascension completes the Paschal Mystery, beginning with Jesus' suffering and death and continuing in the resurrection. But the Holy Spirit ushers in a new era for the Church. After spending weeks in prayer, fasting, and service during Lent, it may seem odd that we don't widely have similar practices for Easter. That doesn't mean you can't embrace the season! Commit to taking moments of little joy throughout the weeks, like random acts of kindness towards others. Consider reading the Acts of the Apostles to learn more about the early Church or picking up an Easter devotional to pray with. He is still risen indeed!

A Happy Ending Isn't the Whole Story

"Is there a happy ending?"

When my kids were young, we never made it past the first whiff of any narrative tension before I got this



question. As soon as whatever princess or furry woodland animal who was the hero of the story got into any small scrape, they wanted that reassurance, "Is there a happy ending?"

I can't say I blame them. Don't we all feel that way sometimes? We enter into a relationship with someone or some situation, and we just want to protect ourselves. We want to know it's not going to go badly — or, if it does, that we will be able to come back from it. It's a human instinct, a reflex. Our inclination to protect ourselves makes it so that we sometimes want to press fast-forward on the bad stuff and skip straight ahead to the happily-ever-after.

Easter is the ultimate happy ending. It's the day of miracles. The day when all the stones roll away and all the sins are forgiven. It's the day that puts everything right.

But if we learned anything from this week — from the Passion and death of the Lord — it's that we can't press fast-forward on the hardships of life. That tension, that loss, that fear — it's crucial, isn't it? As Catholics, we are who we are because of Easter. But Easter doesn't happen without Good Friday.

So, does the story of salvation have a happy ending? We know it does. But we also remember that the ending isn't all that matters.
