FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

Looking Back... Looking forward!

Six months ago, I came to you as your new pastor. I want to call it a "Baptism by fire," since I was away from regular parish ministry work for the past thirteen years while I served as director of the La Salette Mission Center. Additionally, both Fr. Jim and Fr. Trey needed medical attention when I arrived here. So, I want to begin this note by saying "Thank You" to all parishioners for your wonderful hospitality with which you have welcomed me as your new shepherd.

Although I served at Mary Queen as Associate Pastor from 2004 to 2008, it was important to me to know the history, people, and the current situation of the parish. I started by getting to know the parish staff by meeting them individually. I was able to listen to their stories, concerns and needs, and I couldn't emphasize more the importance of teamwork to become successful in their respective areas of responsibility. Written in the Wounds

For all the condemnation Thomas the Doubter has received in 2000 years of homilies, I think there's something to admire in him.

Thomas is not unique. We all waver at some point, overcome by hesitation, distracted by the clamor of the world which seeks at every turn to shout above the whisper of the divine.

Thomas knows what he saw on Good Friday: his friend nailed to a cross, a sword driven through his body. He saw the blood and the water. He saw these things with his own eves, eves given to him by God, eves which have never failed him before. And God doesn't ask us to suspend reality to believe in Him. He only asks us to be discerning about how that reality is interpreted in our hearts.

Thomas knows the man before him is either a fraud, preying on the hopes and anxieties of the traumatized disciples, or he is the Christ, the Savior of the world, accomplisher of impossible things. But where to look, to tell the difference?

Satan once appeared to the great mystic saint, Teresa of Avila, disguised as Jesus. She knew instantly that he was a fraud. Enraged, he demanded to know where his deception had failed. "You have no wounds," she told him simply.

Could we have accepted a savior who did not bleed? I don't think we could, because sooner or later, we would all stand before him and say, "Here is where the world hurt me. Here, and here, and here. What about you?" Christ can point to his hands, his feet, his side. "Here, and here, and here," he can say. "And I overcame them all."

It's the wounds, you see. The truth is in the wounds.

Thomas answered and said to him, "My Lord and my God!" - John 20:28

2nd Sunday of Easter (Sunday of Divine Mercy)

A protestant pastor friend of mine was invited to meet Pope Francis with a group of other pastors. He noticed the Pope's chair was especially ornate and set at the head of the group. He somewhat playfully said, "Holy Father, why do you get that special chair?" The group chuckled nervously at my friend's audacious chide.

The following year, the group was invited to return. They entered the room to find only simple chairs placed in a circle. Pope Francis entered, sat down in one of the humble chairs and, looking directly at my friend, with a twinkle in his eye, asked, "What do you think of my chair now?" My friend was stunned that the Pope remembered his concerns — and took the time to answer them.

Thomas the apostle was certainly stunned by the Risen Jesus displaying his wounds in person. But he also must have been equally shocked that Jesus knew and answered his particular questions, worries, and even demands related to his faith. How humbled — and perhaps a bit terrified — he must have been to realize God remembers his concerns and cares enough to answer them.

What questions or demands about Jesus do you find in your heart? Like Thomas, will you be bold enough to voice them this week? How wonderful to know that if we do so. God will remember and respond even to our most audacious desires.

easy way to withdraw from the demands of daily life and enter into a peaceful interior reflection on their relationship with Christ in the context of Marian devotion.



The first words placed in the mouth of Christ in John's Gospel are not: "Follow all these rules or you're going to hell." Rather, Christ probes our hearts with a question: "What are you looking for?" (John 1:38).

Christianity is not primarily a religion of law, as it is so frequently considered. It is first and foremost a religion of longing. The purpose of God's law is to point our longing toward real satisfaction and away from the counterfeits. The "whole life of the good Christian is a holy longing," wrote Saint Augustine. "That is our life, to be trained by longing."

Family of the Month



In 1966, George went to work at NASA. Soon they began looking for a place to move to with good schools: Friendswood! Sandy, George, and Shonna (age 2) moved to Friendswood in 1967; Bryan was born in 1968. Both kids were confirmed at Mary Queen and were 12-year students at Mary Queen and Friendswood High School. Shonna was involved with band and Color Guard. She attended A&M where she met her husband Paul. They were married at Mary Queen and as happens in life, Paul's job called and they moved away with

their two children! Bryan was a Mustang football player; he married Leigh Ann they had their marriage blessed at Mary Queen. The men started working days ahead of the festival borrowing tables and chairs from a KC Hall near Hobby. After work, they would get trailers and go load up tables and chairs, then reverse this after the festival. They had a good time working together!

Sandy was involved in the FIRST of these things: Pictorial Directory, Christmas Bazaar, VBS, CCD, and her favorite, RCIA in its early stages. They hosted RENEW in their home and were involved in most things in some way as worker bees.

In 2008, the bulletin said, "ACTS Retreat coming; theme: 'Be Still and Know That I Am God." Thus began the wonderful, JOYFUL movement in our parish: the ACTS community. Sandy met Sheri Barber at the retreat, and they formed a small group which is still going on today! They call themselves THE JOYFUL LIGHTS! The group of ladies gathers to celebrate God and COMMUNITY with study and projects throughout the year.

Sandy has been involved in various ladies' retreat committees as well as ACTS retreats. Divine Mercy Sunday

Question:

Where did the feast of Divine Mercy come from?

Answer:

If you were born well before the year 2000, you know the feast of Divine Mercy has not always been celebrated in the Church. In the early 1900s, a young Polish nun began receiving private revelations. Jesus appeared to her during her times of prayer, speaking a message of mercy and love for the world. She received a set of prayers the Divine Mercy Chaplet — and the request to have a feast day established to remind the Church of the mercy of God. St. Faustina died in 1938, on the cusp of war and in the midst of one of the most violent centuries in the history of the world. Her story and her diaries began circulating in Poland and beyond. It quickly became apparent that this was a holy young women, and the cause for her canonization opened. In the year 2000, she was canonized by the first-ever Polish pope, St. John Paul II. On her canonization day, he established the second Sunday of Easter as Divine Mercy Sunday, "a perennial invitation to the Christian world to face, with confidence in divine benevolence, the difficulties and trials that mankind will experience in the years to come."

Eye Has Not Seen

They say seeing is believing. But if you've ever ordered a pair of pants online, you know that's not always the case. Whatever the photos promise us, what looked like a perfectly nice shade of navy blue on our computer



screens comes in the mail as an unusual shade of blue green that only appears in the giant box of Crayola crayons.

The Apostle Thomas, who couldn't bring himself to accept that Jesus had risen from the dead without seeing him, is such an utterly relatable figure in the Gospels. Thomas is still reeling from a loss — not only of his good friend but his Lord, who was taken prisoner and crucified before his eyes. Thomas is guarding himself. He's not believing the hype. He's going to be the only judge of what is real and what is fiction.

Would any of us be any different? We've all had those thoughts. Can we believe it all — Jesus, salvation history, the Eucharist — when we haven't seen it with our own two eyes?

That's when we need to remember that those two eyes were absolutely positive they had ordered a pair of navy blue pants.

It's easy for us to sit back stroking our chins in judgment at Thomas, "you didn't believe the testimony of your friends!" But do we accept the testimony of our friends? The saints, the popes, the Church fathers themselves?

Sometimes the things that are most worthy of believing can't be seen with the naked eye.
