

Godfather's Baptismal Covenant

Mary Queen Catholic Church

A child's Godparents are the first helpers for parents when it comes to raising a child who is grounded and strong in his/her Catholic faith. It is an important responsibility. Godparents lead by their strong, moral example, support the child's faith development, and assist the parents in their role as the primary educators of the faith.

Canon law and the Catechism of the Catholic Church clearly outline who is eligible to serve as a Godfather:

-A Godfather must be a fully initiated Catholic (baptized, received First Holy Communion, and is Confirmed) and be at least 16 years of age. He should be registered in a parish, attending Mass weekly, and receiving God's grace through participation in the sacrament of Reconciliation.

-A Godfather, if married, must be married in the Catholic Church and be in good standing with the Church. A Godfather can be married to a non-Catholic Christian, but the marriage must have taken place in the Catholic Church.

-Any Catholic who has abandoned the Catholic faith, even if they are now active members in another Christian Church or community, may not serve as a Godfather. They have separated themselves from the Church and cannot even serve as a Christian Witness.
