Our goal at Camp Mokulē'ia is to engage campers in a safe, Christian community to help them create cherished lifelong memories. We are located on 30 beautiful acres of Hawaiian beachfront property where we strive to care for and share the land we have been blessed with.

## Camp Mokulē'ia's Mission and Vision:

Camp Mokulē'ia, historically a sacred place of rest, recreation, and renewal, is a ministry of the Episcopal Church in Hawai'i that inspires individuals and communities to connect with the goodness and blessings of all God's Creation. Camp Mokulē'ia, upholding Christian and Hawaiian values, is dedicated to maintain, develop, sustaining, and caring for its natural resources, offering a safe gathering place for all who enter, and providing for Christian ministry through intentional service to the spiritual needs of the Episcopal diocese and the community.

Your responsibilities as a Counselor In Training will include but not be limited to the following:

- 1. Photo Intern:
  - Manage photo documentation for each session, take photos and videos of campers during each activity time, organize and post them to the photo app, and make the closing ceremony video for Friday mornings
- 2. Dining Hall Host/Hostess:
  - Assist campers in setting and bussing tables during meal times
- 3. Counselor Assistant:
  - Effectively assist Camp Counselors in managing cabin and activity groups emphasizing cooperation, support, and problem-solving
  - Assist with PowerPoint during morning and evening devotional times
- 4. Snack Shack Attendant:
  - Operate snack shack (be welcoming, take snack orders, record amounts spent)

#### Your **general responsibilities** as a staff member:

- Live in the cabin with campers and other counselors during camp sessions Sunday Friday.
- Follow the policies/procedures in your staff manual regarding safety and human relations.
- Ensure the health and safety of campers and report issues to staff as necessary.
- Be a positive Christian role model and help campers develop their Christian faith.

Ability to value and respect the opinions and beliefs of others.

- Must be a **Hawaii resident**
- Must have completed 11th or 12th grade by the start of summer 2026
- Uphold the Christian mission and vision of Camp Mokulē'ia
- Ability to arrive at camp May 31, 2026 and depart July 27, 2026
- Ability to attend Staff Training June 1 13, 2026
- Ability to work five weeks of camp
