Learning Area 1

In LA 1 this fortnight, we have had a real focus on writing fluency. Lots of us are getting very good at writing words that are dictated to us, but in writing fluency, we have been starting to choose and sound out words to write independently. We look at a picture prompt on the TV and write as many words as we can in 3 minutes. When we have finished, we count how many words we spelled correctly. Miss J has been a wonderful addition to our learning community. With a focus on narrative writing, she has been teaching students how to craft engaging 'sizzling starts' to their stories. Her creative approach and warm presence have made a noticeable impact, and the students have thoroughly enjoyed having an extra teacher to support and guide them.

We are incredibly grateful for the time Miss J has spent with us and are already looking forward to welcoming her back for another two weeks in Term 4. Thank you, Miss J, for your dedication and energy—you've been a star in LA 2!



LEARNING AREA 3:

On Friday we celebrated Book Week. The students had a lot of fun dressing up as their favourite book character. We spent the afternoon reading books that were shortlisted in the different Book of the Year categories, as well as doing activities. It was a fun way for students to rediscover their favourite books and to be introduced to new books.

In Literacy, we are focusing on reading with accuracy and reading punctuation in texts. We are also learning new spelling rules that help with our spelling, which will then transfer to our writing.

In Numeracy we are moving through our times table challenge each day which is improving our rapid recall. We have been learning to do multiplication and division with regrouping and using different strategies for working out multiplication problems.



HEALTH AND PE

Although this term we are mainly focusing on skipping, students have also had the opportunity to work on their gymnastic skills. On the mini trampoline, students have learnt skills such as the "Motor Bike" landing, the "Tuck Jump", the "Star Jump" and the "180 Turn". Over the coming weeks, we will focus on forward rolls, and the front flip. During this time, students from Learning Area 3 will continue to work on their upcoming skipping performance for the final assembly of the term.




