
Learning Area 2



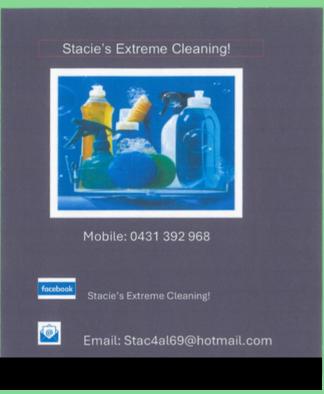


