






LEARNING AREA 1:

This fortnight in LA 1 we have been learning individual letter sounds and using these to build and read words. The sounds we have currently learnt and have been practicing multiple times a day are a, i, m, s, t, u, o, p and f. We know the names of these letters, a word starting with this letter and the sounds they make. In numeracy we have been creating and comparing collections of objects and can identify the larger collection. We are starting to do this by just looking at the number (subitizing) rather than counting each object in the collection. We have learnt SO much over the last two weeks and had lots of fun!







Leerning Ares 2:

LA 2 Math Update: Exploring Place Value and Strategy

This week, LA 2 students have been diving into the concept of place value, working with numbers up to the hundreds. They've been comparing numbers and practising their skills in a fun, interactive way. The class played a game that required good luck, where students rolled dice to determine the numbers for the hundreds, tens, and ones columns of their number.

Once their numbers were formed, students paired up to compare their results, deciding together whose number was bigger. It was a fantastic opportunity to reinforce math skills while adding an element of fun and friendly

Learning Area 3:

In LA 3 we have been learning to do research on the computers. In Humanities we have been researching early settlements. Why and when were settlements developed? Who were they named after? We have had fun finding out some interesting information.

Science has us looking at human and animal adaptations over the years. We found out that wombats have a bony plate in their bottoms that protects the wombat from bites and scratches. We also discovered that kookaburras sit very still and camouflage with the forest, making them almost invisible to their prey. And we learnt that dingoes don't bark, they howl to communicate. We have also had fun doing name art to brighten up our classroom. This activity has been a little bit of a challenge but with resilience, our efforts are paying off.

We have enjoyed our year so far and we are looking forward to lots of learning

and growth in the next weeks.










