Next week we will be holding a house event and family picnic to celebrate a great term at ANPS, I invite you all to join us in an afternoon of fun!



LA 2 Students Get Hands-On with Their New School Laptops!

This month, our LA 2 students were introduced to their brand-new school laptops, a tool that will enhance their learning experience and allow them to use programs that can be accessed at home too. As part of this exciting step forward, the students participated in a special session on how to properly use and care for their new devices.

The first part of the lesson focused on the essentials: how to handle the laptops with care, keep them clean, and store them safely to ensure they remain in top condition. 
