

## **ELC OF POLK LAUNCHES KINDNESS INITIATIVE IN POLK COUNTY**



Earlier this month The Early Learning Coalition of Polk County introduced its "Be Kind! Polk" initiative to a well-attended presentation. We were so excited that several of the

attendees included local city, county and business leaders along with other supporters. They listened closely as they learned about the importance of positive early social emotional development and how it can greatly affect a child's first four years of life.

The audience also learned that kindergarten teachers in Polk County ranked kindness as an essential trait that preschoolers needed to have to be kindergarten ready. It was also pointed out that not practicing kindness could present problems down the road. They were reminded of a recent incident of violence that had made the national news.

At the conclusion everyone was introduced to the initiative's logo with its four foundational points as a reminder of where kindness should be practiced: in family and inner circle, in the workplace, in self-care and finally in community. **CEO Marc Hutek Ed. D.** hoped that the initiative's four foundational points could provide an effective plan that could positively affect all the sectors of our life and make the world around us better.

"I really believe that although kindness may seem very simple and ordinary, it's really something that impacts all sectors of our society," said Hutek. "We should be modeling kindness for our children daily and if they see it all around them, maybe they'll realize this is the way the world was intended to be."

POSITIVE PARENTING TIP: HOW TO HELP YOUR CHILD AVOID MELTDOWNS




Sometimes an emotional meltdown can happen at the most inopportune times and dealing with one can certainly be challenging. Parents have all experienced meltdown moments, but they can be equally frustrating for a child.

What if you could have calm discussions about them before they even happen? To prevent a meltdown there are lots of opportunities throughout the day to teach children how to act appropriately. Here are some great ideas that will help to reinforce more positive behavior.

KINDNESS CONNECTIONS: THE IMPORTANCE OF LISTENING



Listening is an important skill for children to develop not just for following instructions but also for **listening and responding properly to others in social settings.** 

Below are a few discussion questions from **Highlights Early Learning** that will help you and your child focus on why listening is so very essential for communication. The Obstacle Course activity will also provide some fun while practicing listening for specific instructions.

- Create a simple obstacle course where the children have to listen for specific instructions (i.e. "crawl under the table," "hop over the line") and freeze at certain points.
- Ask "Why is it important to stop and listen before moving?"
- Ask "Can you think of a time when listening carefully helped you understand something better?"
