




Why do we cover statues and images with veils during Lent?

Have you ever wondered about why several Catholic Churches veil sacred images and statues during lent? Is there a profound meaning in it? What is the rationale behind this practice? Traditionally, this practice of veiling images during lent traces back to the medieval tradition of the "Hunger Cloth" in Germany. This cloth kept the altar hidden until Holy Week during the reading of the gospel that stated the curtain of the temple was torn in two. The veiled images not only served as a practical reminder for people about the season of lent, but also it symbolized the penance of the season.

Over time, the veiling of images became a common practice, and it was eventually reduced from the entire Lenten season to just the last week or two. In the Dioceses of the United States, "the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil" (Roman Missal).

Through the absence of images and statutes, we shift our focus from Christ in the desert to Christ during His Passion. And the veiled images build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. When images are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we can see our true home, and the veil is lifted. Christ lifts the veil through His resurrection (taken from www.sis.edu/why.do we cover statues with a veil during lent).

As we enter Holy Week with Palm Sunday, let us shift our focus on the Passion of Christ and walk with Him in his excruciating pain and suffering.

Good Friday Collection: This special collection originated from the Popes' wishes to maintain a strong bond between the Holy Places of the Holy Land and all Christians of the world. It is the main source of sustenance for life around the Holy Places, and is also the tool through which the custody of the Holy Land is able to sustain and carry forward the important mission to which it is called: to preserve the holy places, the stones of memory, and to favor the Christian presence, the living stones of the Holy Land, through many activities of solidarity such as the maintenance of pastoral, educational, welfare, health and social structures.

<u>Parish Mission</u>: Our parish mission for 2025 is scheduled for May5-8th. The main purpose of the parish mission is to set aside a week to deepen and rekindle our faith. I request you kindly participate in the parish mission and experience spiritual renewal in your life.






