Why do we cover statues and images with veils during Lent?

Have you ever wondered about why several Catholic Churches veil sacred images and statues during lent? Is there a profound meaning in it? What is the rationale behind this practice? Traditionally, this practice of veiling images during lent traces back to the medieval tradition of the "Hunger Cloth" in Germany. This cloth kept the altar hidden until Holy Week during the reading of the gospel that stated the curtain of the temple was torn in two. The veiled images not only served as a practical reminder for people about the season of lent, but also it symbolized the penance of the season.

Over time, the veiling of images became a common practice, and it was eventually reduced from the entire Lenten season to just the last week or two. In the Dioceses of the United States, **"the practice of covering crosses and images throughout the church from [the fifth] Sunday [of Lent] may be observed. Crosses remain covered until the end of the Celebration of the Lord's Passion on Good Friday, but images remain covered until the beginning of the Easter Vigil" (Roman Missal).**

Through the absence of images and statutes, we shift our focus from Christ in the desert to Christ during His Passion. And the veiled images build within us a longing for Easter Sunday. When images are unveiled before the Easter Vigil, we are reminded that we, in a sense, live in a veiled world. It is through our own death that we can see our true home, and the veil is lifted. Christ lifts the veil through His resurrection (*taken from www.sjs.edu/why do we cover statues with a veil during lent*).

As we enter Holy Week with Palm Sunday, let us shift our focus on the Passion of Christ and walk with Him in his excruciating pain and suffering.

Good Friday Collection: This special collection originated from the Popes' wishes to maintain a strong bond between the Holy Places of the Holy Land and all Christians of the world. It is the main source of sustenance for life around the Holy Places, and is also the tool through which the custody of the Holy Land is able to sustain and carry forward the important mission to which it is called: to preserve the holy places, the stones of memory, and to favor the Christian presence, the living stones of the Holy Land, through many activities of solidarity such as the maintenance of pastoral, educational, welfare, health and social structures.

Parish Mission: Our parish mission for 2025 is scheduled for May5-8th. The main purpose of the parish mission is to set aside a week to deepen and rekindle our faith. I request you kindly participate in the parish mission and experience spiritual renewal in your life.

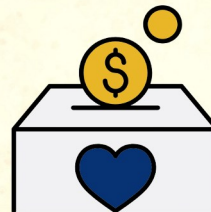

ITINERARY

DAY 1, SEP 15: DEPART USA
Depart from USA for transatlantic flight. Meals will be provided aboard the airplane.

DAY 2, SEP 16: MEDJUGORJE
Welcome to Bosnia! Drive to Medjugorje to check-in to our hotel for 3 nights. In the evenings, attend the recitation of the Rosary and the Healing service at **St. James church**. Dinner and overnight in Medjugorje.

DAY 3, SEP 17: MEDJUGORJE
While in Medjugorje, the group will visit the **Apparition Hill** and climb **Holy Cross Mountain**. If possible, meetings with available visionaries will be scheduled. During the day you have the opportunity for confession or to spend time in prayer in the Perpetual Adoration Chapel.

DAY 4, SEP 18: MEDJUGORJE
Free day of reflection for your private devotion to Our Lady in Medjugorje or an optional tour of Old Town of Dubrovnik, including visit of St. Blaise church. Dinner and overnight in Medjugorje.

DAY 5, SEP 19: SPLIT
After breakfast, drive to Split. Upon arrival, enjoy sightseeing of the **Diocletian Palace** with your local guide. Dinner and overnight in Split.

DAY 6, SEP 20: ZAGREB
This morning, travel to Zagreb and enjoy a city tour featuring the historic upper town, **St. Mark's church**, with the most colourful roof you have ever seen, Open Market with local groceries and some hand made things and Ban Jelačić Square. One of Zagreb's jewelers is its famous Stone Gate, Zagreb's most important shrine praising the Mother of God. Dinner and overnight in Zagreb.

DAY 7, SEP 21: SALZBURG
Long transfer from Zagreb to Salzburg, on route stop in Bled for lunch time (short stop). Late arrival to Salzburg. Dinner and overnight in Salzburg.

DAY 8, SEP 22: PRAGUE
In the morning, get to know Salzburg - it is a picturesque city known for its baroque architecture and rich musical history, the world-famous composer W.A. Mozart was born here. You will visit beautiful **Mirabell Gardens** and the historic centre, learn about the history of **"The Sounds of Music"** city, about archbishops and about significant pilgrimage trails laid around Salzburg, St James's Way being arguably one of the most famous pilgrimage routes in this region. In the afternoon, you will have departure to Prague. Late arrival to Prague. Dinner and overnight in Prague.

DAY 9, SEP 23: PRAGUE
This morning, tour the old part of the city to view the old town square, the famous **Astronomical clock**, the Jewish quarter, St. Nicholas church, **Charles bridge** and the Carmelite church of our **Lady Victorious** to see **Infant Jesus of Prague**. Your afternoon and evening are at leisure. Dinner and overnight in Prague.



DAY 10, SEP 24: KRAKOW

Morning departure with the bus Krakow Poland. On the way you will make a stop at **Klodzko** for lunch and some free time to explore the town by yourself and then continue to Krakow. You will reach Krakow in the late afternoon and have evening at leisure. Dinner and overnight in Krakow.

DAY 11, SEP 25: KRAKOW
During today's morning walking tour, you will visit the Main Market Square in Krakow, the biggest Medieval old town square in Europe. In the Old Town you will find the **Wawel Hill** - with the **Cathedral** and the **Royal Castle**, **Town Hall Tower**, **St. Mary's Basilica**, **Krakow Barbican** and Sukiennice (Cloth Hall), thousands of coffee places and delightful regional restaurants, many historic buildings and horse-driven cabs. Later on, you will continue to **Wieliczka Salt Mine**, the mysterious salt labyrinth that dates back to the Middle Ages and is the world's longest active salt mine. Dinner and overnight Krakow.

DAY 12, SEP 26: KRAKOW
Today, you will depart by bus to Wadowice, the hometown of Pope John Paul II, where you will visit his family home. Optional tour will be available to visit **Auschwitz-Birkenau**, the concentration camp established by German Nazis in 1940 and after the war it was turned into museum displaying evidence of the genocide. In the afternoon we will stop at **Sanctuary of the Divine Mercy** in Krakow Lagiewniki. Sanctuary of the Divine Mercy is one of the most important sanctuaries in the world that will encourage us to pray and contemplate Divine Mercy by the grave of Saint Sister Faustina and the Jesus, In You I Trust painting. Dinner and overnight Krakow.

DAY 13, SEP 27: WARSAW
This morning, journey to Czestochowa and visit the Yasna Gora monastery, known for the blackened picture of the virgin Mary, popularly called the **'Black Madonna'** in the late afternoon, arrive in Poland's capital city, Warsaw. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 14, SEP 28: WARSAW
Your sightseeing tour here includes a drive along the famous royal route from magnificent castle square to **Lazienki park** and palace, the summer residence of the last king of Poland. Pass by the palace of science and culture (known as the "wedding cake"), the **Saxon gardens**, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, monument to the heroes of the Warsaw ghetto, and barbican. Continue with a walking tour of the **Old town**, **Old market square** and **St. John's cathedral**. The rest of the day is free for shopping or a stroll through the city. Dinner and overnight.

DAY 15, SEP 29: WARSAW / USA
After breakfast, transfer to the airport for your flight to USA.
