- I. OPENING PRAYER Fr. David
- II. Minutes for February 20, 2025, meeting Approved
- III. PASTOR'S REPORT, Fr. David
 - The first meeting of the Building and Grounds committee will be scheduled soon.
 - Fr. David discussed the need for volunteers for the hospitality ministry and suggested having each ministry share its experiences. We will start with the Security Ministry, led by Jeff Lofy, after Easter, May 2nd (which is not Mother's Day).
 - Fr. David noted the parish mission dates and the importance of avoiding scheduling conflicts. The mission will take place from May 3 to 8, with different nights for each session. Led by the priest from Kentucky and the Fathers of Mercy.
 - Fr. David announced changes in the daily Mass schedule to increase attendance.
 Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, 8 AM. Wednesday & Friday 10:30 AM.
 - The Annual Diocesan Volunteer Recognition Dinner is approaching and asks for names of deserving volunteers from each ministry. Each ministry is required to nominate at least one volunteer from its ranks for recognition. The diocesan deadline was March 25th.
 - New Bible study every Tuesday @ 6:30 time didn't work. Only **one person** showed up. Changing the day to Thursday at 6:30 to see if more people show up.
 - The Sacristan manages ushers and ministers.
 - The Parish Picnic in August needs to be planned.

IV. Administrator's Report, Connor Keegan

- Security Grant bugs have been fixed, and all FEMA's requested changes have been made. We are now awaiting their second approval to proceed.
- We've reviewed the Building & Grounds Committee's preliminary outlines regarding
 its structure and potential projects for the church, office, CDC, and other areas.
 Final decisions are still pending. Father David is considering inviting individuals to
 the council for participation.
- The grounds committee will manage all five campus buildings. Minor repairs may be handled at low cost, but unnoticed issues could lead to significant expenses for more extensive repairs.
- Connor researched our bookkeeping software and Parish Soft's fixed assets module, which integrates with our system to manage church asset logs and profiles. It seems useful, but we'll address it when necessary.
- Rectory renovation is almost complete. Waiting for the final invoice.

V. Finance Committee, Jim Crandal and Bill O'Donnell

- The finance committee recommended approving Danielle to finalize a \$320,000 contract with High Five Construction for a bathroom remodel, addressing health department violations and ensuring ADA compliance. The board will review the contract.
- The next steps include finalizing the contract and presenting it to the diocese for approval of funding
- A QR code for donations was proposed and approved, with plans to place it in the narthex and on pew cards, and it will be ready for Easter.
- The Finance Committee highlighted the importance of budget line items for ministries and discussed the possibility of donating assets like cars and boats. They also considered involving financial experts for mandatory distributions.

VI. President's Report, Ed Strickland

- Discussed the necessity of security badges for volunteers and ushers for identification at each mass.
- New badges have been received and are ready for use.
- Recommended organizing a parish town hall to educate and involve parishioners in the council's activities and future plans.
- Meeting minutes will be shared on the parish website and via email to keep parishioners informed. A new webpage is being created for easy downloads of
- Stations of the Cross and Soup dinners are going well.

- All ministries are on track for their events.
- We need more hospitality events to engage new residents and parishioners.

VII. Parish Life & CDC, Zara Roff & Kristen Moreno

- St. Patrick's Day dinner was a success. They cooked 120 corned beef.
- Family Camping Annual Event, July 25-26, at Stampede Reservoir.
- State Accreditation coming up in July
- CDC Graduation on June 6 in the grass area
- Fall Festival—School, CDC, and Parish Life are collaborating to make it happen. The goal is to raise \$10,000.
