SPECIES PROFILE

State Status - Threatened, uncommon

Habitat - Prefer deciduous forests with an abundance of roosting sites where they can hibernate throughout the winter

Diet - Insectivorous, will primarily eat small beetles and other flying insects

Average Size - 12-13" wingspan

Lifespan - Up to 20 years old in captivity and up to 30 years old in the wild

Fun fact - Bats are incredible at controlling pests. Without insect-eating bats, farmers in Wisconsin would have to pay up to \$1.5 billion for pesticides to keep their crops from being decimated by insects
