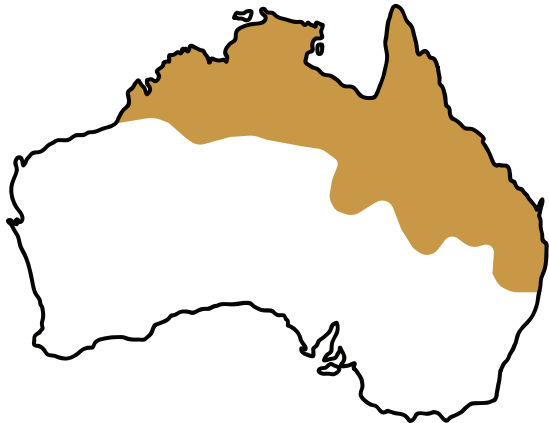


FRITO

This male frog joined us at NLDC in 2023. He spends most of his time hanging out on the branches in his tank. This species is also known as the Australian green tree frog or the dumpy tree frog. Frito can change color to match his surroundings! He usually looks blueish-green, but sometimes appears reddish-brown. Most tree frogs are nocturnal, so he is more active at night.

SPECIES PROFILE

Status - Least concern in native range of Australia

Habitat - Moist, forested environments but can be adaptable to drier habitats

Diet - Insectivorous, will eat a variety of insects including moths, roaches, grasshoppers, spiders, and crickets

Average Size - 3-4.5" long

Lifespan - Up to 16 years old in captivity and up to 10 years old in the wild

Fun Fact - Tree frogs have microscopic tube-shaped channels on their toe pads topped with peg-like structures that secrete a mucous which helps them stick to all types of surfaces.
