


NOODLES

SPECIES PROFILE

State Status - Least concern, common

Habitat - Adults breed in wetlands and vernal pools, and will burrow under logs and detritus

Diet - Carnivorous, will eat earthworms, insects, and any living thing that will fit in their mouth

Average Size - 8-10" long

Lifespan - Up to 40 years old in captivity and up to 15 years old in the wild

Fun fact - Salamanders have an amazing survival strategy; they are able to regrow their limbs and tails! If they lose a limb, a blood clot will form at the wound site and cells will begin to repair the damage to form new tissue
