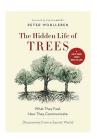

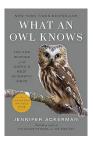
Human Nature: Nine Ways to Feel About Our Changing Planet

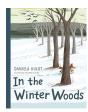

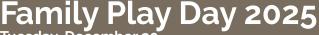

Discovery Center Trails

The Discovery Center offers 12 miles of trails for you to explore this season. When snow levels allow, we groom the trails for single-track classic skiing and snowshoeing. While use of the trails is free, donations are welcome to help maintain their quality. While enjoying the trails, please keep the following guidelines in mind:

- Dogs must be on a leash at all times, please pick up after your pet
- Please stay on the designated trails
- Each intersection is indicated on a map at that location
- Please be respectful of others using the trail system
- Please respect groomed ski trails by not walking on them with boots and staying to the side of them if you are on snowshoes
