SOUTH DAKOTA'S EXTREME ABORTION AMENDMENT

Frequently Asked Questions: Can the Governor veto this proposed amendment?

No. Constitutional amendments cannot be vetoed by the Governor, either before or after the amendment is ratified by voters. Can the Legislature override or change this proposed amendment? No. The legislature cannot override or change a proposed amendment prior to its ratification by voters. After an amendment has been ratified and added to the constitution, the legislature could propose a repeal or modification of the amendment, but this likewise would have to be ratified by a majority of voters at a subsequent election. The legislature has no unilateral authority to repeal or modify provisions of the state constitution. Stay tuned for further information about the abortion amendment.

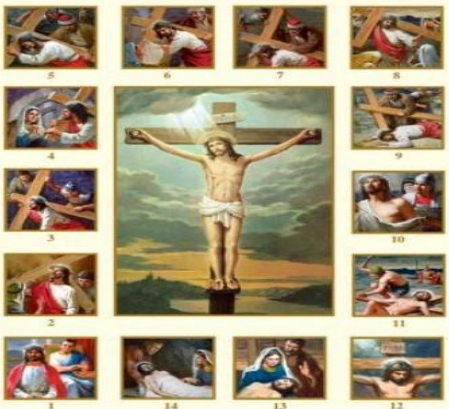

Fast & Abstinence

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Latin Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms on abstinence preclude the consumption of the flesh of mammals or birds. One may eat fish, amphibians, and reptiles. Additionally, one may consume animal fats (lard, tallow), foods derived mammals and birds (milk, cheese, eggs), and broth, stocks, and gravies that do not include pieces of meat. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.
