





SECURITY & ACCESS TO CAMPUS FACILITIES

Omega Institute of Cosmetology has 24-hour security camera surveillance which is monitored daily by the institution's administrative department. Omega Institute of Cosmetology has an excellent relationship with its local law enforcement. Access to all School facilities is by key, if issued. The institution has an alarm system through ABC Fire and Burglar Alarm, LLC. Students are given ID badges on the day of admissions and are required to wear them while on premises. Visitors to the building must check in at the front desk. Omega Institute of Cosmetology will notify staff on any ongoing visitors to the building such i.e., maintenance and repair personnel which are also required to check in at the front desk. The Owner and staff of the institution also frequently monitor internal and external areas of the institution throughout the day to ensure the safety of all students and clientele on the premises.

Normal Business Hours: 8:30 AM – 4:30 PM Tuesday through Friday

Individuals are only allowed to access premises during business hours. Any individual requiring access outside normal business hours must do so by contacting the administrator or owner of the institution.

<u>LAW ENFORCEMENT AND JURISDICTION OF INSTITUTION/AUTHORITY TO ARRENT AND</u> RELATIONSHIPS

Omega Institute of Cosmetology does not have any sworn or commissioned law enforcement personnel on the premises. Any threats, incidents, and/or crimes brought to the attention of the institution will be reviewed, and if necessary, reported to Houma Police Department or Louisiana State Police. The institution cannot make any arrests but may attempt to detain the individual until law enforcement arrives. Any incidents not requiring law enforcement will fall under the institution's violation policies which correspond with the incident. In Instances where necessary, the institution will call 911.

MONITORING AND REPORTING CRIMINAL ACTIVITY

POLICY AND PROCEDURES FOR TIMELY REPORTING OF A CRIME

- 2. Make note of the time, date, and location of the incident to provide more detailed information.
- 3. Give details to the appropriate officials regarding the persons and/or vehicles involved in the incident.
- 4. What other departments and/or individuals were informed of the incident.

Upon receipt of the report, the institution will determine which response to make towards the incident including actions such as: disciplinary actions against the offender(s), notifications to all staff and students of the institution, notification to local law enforcement, and/or alternate security measures due to the incident.

Omega Institute of Cosmetology does not have any policies and procedures regarding confidential crime reporting (for inclusion in the annual disclosure of crime statistics).

TIMELY WARNING POLICY

If the institution believes issuing a notification will compromise efforts to assist the victim, or to contain respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency, no notification will be issued.

Students and staff will be notified through posting in all rooms of the institution of any criminal offence(s) which occur as deemed necessary. Omega Institute of Cosmetology will alert the institutions community of crimes reported to institution officials or local law enforcement, especially those in accordance with the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Crime Statistics Act, in a timely manner that will aid in the prevention of similar crimes. The Annual Campus Security Report required by the Clery Act is prepared with cooperation of the local law enforcement and Omega Institute of Cosmetology.

EMEGENCY NOTIFICATIONS

An emergency notification is necessary when there is any significant emergency or dangerous situation. Such emergencies may include natural disasters, active shooters, environmental threats, etc., which are occurring on the institution's campus. Incidents may differ in severity, so evaluation is necessary prior to issuing an emergency notification. The institution's administrator and/or owner are responsible for emergency evaluation and notifications relating to significant emergencies or dangerous situations, depending on the situation and availability of the above designated personnel. Omega Institute of Cosmetology works with local law enforcement and other emergency response agencies, when required, for significant emergencies or dangerous situations. The institution also works with local law enforcement to ensure the institution is notified of any emergency situations which may affect its students and staff and if an emergency notification needs to be issued.

The institution's administrator and/or owner will evaluate the information, determine if the incident is considered a significant emergency or dangerous situation, and if an emergency notification is required. The institution's administrator and/or owner will, without delay and considering the safety of the community to determine the content of the notification and initiate the notification system, unless issuing a notification will, in the professional judgment of the administrator and/or owner, compromise efforts to assist a victim or to contain, respond to, or otherwise mitigate the emergency. Alarms will also be used, if necessary, if they will not hinder the safety of the students or staff during the emergency.

Once the institution's administrator and/or owner has decided the situation is a significant emergency or dangerous situation, and it does not compromise any efforts, the institution's administrator will send out an emergency notification to all students and staff immediately. The institution's administrator and/or owner will decide on what is contained in the notification depending on what is pertinent to ensure the safety of students and staff. Students and staff will be notified immediately by one or more of the following: through texts, phone calls, the institution's social media page, and/or emails. Students and staff members contact information is collected during student orientation or the hiring process. This contact information is kept confidential and may be used for emergency notifications. All students and staff are urged to keep their contact information current with the administrative office of Omega Institute of Cosmetology. Emergency notifications, although they differ from timely warnings, do not replace the timely warning notification. If required, the owner will contact local law enforcement and/or local emergency response agencies to provide emergency support for said emergency. Local law enforcement will be responsible for informing the local community if the situation is a danger to them.

SAFETY AND SEURITY AWARENESS PROGRAMS

Annually, the institution performs drills and training with its students and staff to ensure everyone understands the response and evacuation process in the event of an emergency. Annually, the institution presents information regarding active shooter preparedness to all students and staff. Documentation regarding results of drills may be found and requested in the administrative office of the institution. Annually, Omega Institute of Cosmetology provides information regarding sexual harassment and sexual violence awareness to all students and staff.

RESPONSE AND EVACUTION PROCEDURES, DRILLS, & TRAINING

Omega Institute of Cosmetology does have evacuation signs outlining exits throughout the institution. The institution coordinates with its local fire department in inspecting and ensuring all evacuation procedures are correct and that all fire extinguishers are in working order and compliant.

Evacuation Exits

Students, staff, and clients will exit out the appropriate door, either to the front or rear of the building, whichever is closer or more accessible.

Evacuation Procedures for Fire-Students:

- All students are required to evacuate when the alarm is activated.
- Students are to follow authorized personnel when exiting the building.
- Students should attempt to assist persons with disabilities.
- All students, when exited, should meet at a designated muster station or move to a safe distance from the building for their safety and to allow local authorities to access the building and necessary surrounding areas. This should include distances far enough from fire hydrants, fire lanes, and power lines.
- All students will not re-enter the building until notified by the institution's administrator and/or owner.

Evacuation Procedures for Fire-Staff:

- All staff are required to evacuate the building when the alarm is activated.
- Staff will direct students towards the exit and out of the building to the designated muster station from the premises.
- Staff will assist individuals with disabilities in evacuating.
- Staff will check to ensure all students in their class are accounted for.
- Staff will sweep their sections and then exit the premises.
- Staff will report to the institution's administrator and/or owner whether all their students are accounted for.
- The institution's administrator and/or owner will ensure all students and staff are accounted for along with any clientele who were in the building at the time.
- Staff are not to re-enter the building until notified by the institution's administrator and/or owner.

Evacuation Procedures for Non-Fire:

- Evacuations for non-fire incidents will be notified by the institution's administrator and/or owner.
- All individuals should attempt to assist individuals with disabilities in evacuating.
- All students will follow authorized personnel out of the building.
- All individuals will not re-enter the building until advised by the institution's administrator and/or owner.

Evacuation Procedures for Bomb Threats:

- All students will follow the same procedures as they do for fire incidents.
- Staff will follow the same initial procedures but will ensure all students are moved to the designated safe zone located at least 100 yards from the premises.
- Staff will sweep their classrooms for students.
- Staff will assess the evacuation site for any unidentifiable objects and notify the institution's administrator and/or owner of the findings from the evacuation site and their rooms.
- Staff should immediately evaluate the situation if unidentified objects or individuals are within the evacuation area, move all students, and attempt to contact the institution's administrator and/or owner.
- The institution's administrator and/or owners will sweep the building and ensure all students, staff, and possible clients are accounted for.

- Staff will report to the institution's administrator and/or owner whether all their students are accounted for.
- No one will re-enter the building unless notified by the institution's administrator and/or owner.

Procedures for Active Shooter and/or Lockdown:

- Staff and/or students should lock and barricade the door.
- Close all blinds and/or curtains.
- Turn off lights and keep quiet.
- Lie down on the floor if there are gunshots and attempt to shield yourself with a nearby object if possible.
- If in an open area, attempt to get to a safe location.
- Do not open the door for anyone unless you are absolutely sure it is staff member and/or emergency personnel.

Procedures for Shelter in Place and Possible External Hazards:

- Follow instructions given by the institution's administrator and/or owner.
- Assists individuals with disabilities, if possible.
- Remain inside if there is an external hazard, if not inside, seek shelter where possible.
- Seek shelter in an interior room with no windows, if possible.
- Close all windows and doors, but do not lock.
- Do not leave the shelter until notified by the institution's administrator and/or owner.

DRUG AND ALCOHOL ABUSE POLICY

The student or staff member's emergency contact on file will be notified of the situation as soon as possible. Omega Institute of Cosmetology will work with local authorities in any way possible to ensure the safety of the student or staff member. Student or staff member's information used in the furtherance of a missing person investigation will be kept confidential and is only accessible to the institution and will not be disclosed except to law enforcement. If any student or staff member is under the age of 18, the emergency contact on file along with the student or staff member's parents, if different, will be notified.
