Why a Neighbourhood Plan?

Salfords & Sidlow is a rural parish with a strong local economy, good transport links, and extensive Green Belt countryside. We face pressures from housing growth and infrastructure demands. Our Neighbourhood Plan gives the community a stronger voice in shaping future development. Once adopted, it will have legal weight in planning decisions.

Our Vision

To keep Salfords & Sidlow a distinctive, rural parish where the Green Belt and countryside are protected, while supporting carefully managed growth that provides the homes, jobs, and services our community needs.

Key Objectives

- 1. Housing & Growth new homes must meet local needs, be well designed, and respect the character of the parish.
- 2. Green Belt & Environment protect landscapes, wildlife, and green spaces while promoting sustainability.
- 3. Economy support the success of Salfords Industrial Estate, Perrywood Business Park, local farms, and small businesses.
- 4. Transport & Infrastructure improve road safety, public transport, broadband, and manage parking pressures.
- 5. Community & Wellbeing maintain and improve local facilities, protect heritage, and strengthen community identity.

Our Policies

- Employment safeguard the parish as industrial estates as hubs of jobs and enterprise (NP1).
- Local Centres protect shops and services on Brighton Road and secure short-stay parking for residents (NP2).
- Design require all new development to respect parish character and be high quality (NP3).
- Housing Mix ensure new homes provide a mix of sizes and tenures, including affordable housing (NP4).
- Infrastructure developers must repair local roads/pavements after works and contribute to local improvements (NP5).
- Green Belt protect openness and ensure any development is proportionate and sympathetic (NP6).

Next Steps

- 1. Consultation residents and businesses will be asked for feedback.
- 2. Examination the plan will be reviewed by an independent examiner.
- 3. Referendum residents will vote to adopt the plan.
- 4. Adoption once passed, the plan will guide all planning decisions in the parish.
