#### Enforcement Updates

Crosswinds

SCC confirmed on 15/5/26: -

*'Following the County Court's Order dated 30th September 2025, officers have continued to engage with all relevant parties to seek compliance and secure the remedy of the identified breach of planning control on the Land. As you correctly note in your email, the period for compliance with the terms of the Court Order expired on 30 April 2026. In the absence of any substantive evidence demonstrating adherence to the terms of the Order, it is now considered to be in breach.*

*In light of this, officers have been in ongoing dialogue with colleagues in Legal Services to progress this matter and determine the appropriate next steps. Once the various discussions have concluded, we will be in a position to advise you of any anticipated timeframes for further action.*

*Please be assured that we remain fully committed to securing a resolution at this site. Given the clear direction given by the Order of the Court, the continued breach is regarded with the utmost seriousness and is receiving attention.'*

Meanwhile fly tipping continues at the entrance making the whole area look terrible. We have asked for this to be cleared.

#### GACC donation for LGW DCO decision

The judge plans to issue his draft decision at the end of May with view to it being formally handed down and therefore being public at the beginning of June. There is however still a possibility of a further time slip.

GACC presented at the May Council meeting requesting additional funding to cover costs incurred for legal fees incurred to date.

Historical donations to GACC from 2020/21 onwards.

Annual donation of £250

Grant donation of £750 in 23/24 with a pledge of a further £500 if needed. (That was not made).

Grant donation of £2500 for LGW DCO in 2025/26.

GACC has confirmed they will need to raise further funds if they go to appeal or if they need to defend against either the Sec of State or Gatwick wishing to appeal.

GACC confirmed they did not submit any response to the R4 consultation but did ask GATCOM to respond with a request that any possible resolution of the conflict between Heathrow and Gatwick traffic that keeps R4 traffic down be expedited ahead of relying on FASI to provide a solution. This was based on the time line for FASI to even start being effective is likely to be at least 10 years.

GACC confirmed Plane Wrong has no access to any data GACC for their communications.

BB has made a suggestion of a monetary amount. KD has recommended to await the decision of the JR before a decision is made and stated she does not think it's appropriate to give GACC more funding than CAGNE for the work undertaken so far because the issues raised by both CAGNE and GACC were equally important and funded both with an equal donation. She also says it is also important to recognise is this what our residents consider important? Has the second runway really featured as a concern? Although, we have spent money on this issue defending the application to overturn the planning decision, at some point and given the other priorities for our residents we need to really understand where our funding should be spent.

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## **12. Clerk report and Action List**

### Salfords village hall

The fascia and soffits have been wrapped with new guttering at the hall at a cost of £8,795 – R&BBC strategic CIL funding will be used for this. Tresan Roofing advised of additional extras to cover the cost for labour & materials due to rotten sections of timber, fascia and soffit - £480.00.

### Bookstore

The bookstore has been completed and was launched at the coffee morning in June. Thanks to Paul (and Wayne) for building this. The costs for materials were £237.25

### Website and Email

Aubergine 262 are working on building the new website which should be live by end of June. I attended training on how to update it on 3/6/26.

### R&BBC Mayor and Deputy Mayor

New Mayor for 2026/27 for R&BBC is Cllr Nick Harrison and deputy Mayor Cllr Jed Dwight

### East Surrey unitary elections

379 candidates stood for 72 seats across 36 wards in East Surrey. 44% of electors in Horley West, Salfords & Sidlow Ward voted for their new unitary representative members. Steve Wotton and Andrew Stevens, both Liberal Democrats, were elected for this area. The Liberal Democrats secured 40 of the 72 seats available meaning it holds the majority.

The first meeting of the East Surrey Shadow Authority took place in May 2026 where Steve Wotton was elected as council leader and Kirsty Hewens the deputy.

### Cambridge Lodge Caravan Park access to A23

Residents of the Cambridge Lodge Caravan Park attended Horley TC meetings and requested if anything can be done to make the junction safer as it comes straight out onto the footpath/ cycleway. They are concerned there is going to be an accident. Horley TC submitted a request to SCC requesting *give way signs on the cycle lane/pavement*

SCC responded to Horley TC stating as this is a private business entrance similar to any dropped kerb which allows vehicular access to a private residence. Give way markings are present on the cycle lane at the Sainsbury's petrol station due to the increased and constant frequency at which vehicles enter and exit from these access ways.

Horley TC has asked if S&SPC will share costs to install Give Way markings. I have gone back to SCC to challenge their decision advising the Cambridge Lodge access is used by over 80 properties so cannot be compared to a domestic dwelling. They have still refused saying volume

of traffic is less than the petrol station and it goes directly against Highway Rule H3 of the Highway Code which establishes a new hierarchy of road users.

*Drivers and motorcyclists should not cut across cyclists, horse riders, or horse-drawn vehicles going straight ahead when turning into or out of a junction, changing direction, or changing lanes. Motorists must give way to vulnerable users whether they are riding on the road, a cycle lane, or a cycle track.*

SCC says To place give way markings would create confusion for both cyclists and motorists because of this and could lead to an increase in collisions as well as litigation issues.

The key issue is that road markings on the public highway are traffic signs/road markings governed by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and the Traffic Signs Regulations and General Directions (TSRGD). On an adopted public highway, a parish council cannot normally install unofficial give-way markings without the highway authority's permission. This means that if Horley TC and S&SPC arranged our own markings this would probably not be lawful, unless Surrey County Council explicitly authorises it.

If we arranged for a contractor to paint lines anyway, Surrey could likely:

- require their removal,
- treat it as unauthorised works on the highway,
- potentially recharge costs,
- and liability could become a serious issue if a collision occurred.

There is also a practical legal problem: if the markings are not authorised by the highway authority, motorists and cyclists may not recognise them as lawful traffic control features.

As such I have gone back to SCC asking for further data and evidence and interpretation of the Highways Code H3 and whether SCC would permit any advisory markings or non-standard surfacing treatment proposed and funded by the Parish / Town Council, subject to Surrey approval and specification.
