Message from the Parish Council

Councillors have been working on the development of the Salfords and Sidlow Neighbourhood Plan. We have several consultation events for you to come and see and comment on the progress of the plan to date.

Through the summer we ran a successful community garden growing a huge selection of produce which has been enjoyed by the residents. This will formally close at the end of October but we will continue to tend to the garden through the winter months in preparation for Spring 2026. We had already gone to print to be able to report on the Emmanuel Church spectator's station for Reigate Half Marathon but if you attended we hope you enjoyed the occasion.

We have lots of ongoing community events including our regular well being walks and coffee mornings on the first Friday of the month. The October coffee morning will be in support of Macmillan charity run by Christ the King Church. The Parent/ Carer toddler group welcomes about 10 families each month and we have space for more so as winter encroaches please visit us on the second Wednesday of the month at 10.30am when we have activities for children age 0 to 5 years old.

The Autumn litter pick for Salfords has been scheduled for Saturday 4 October and Sidlow will hold theirs on Sunday 9 November in the afternoon. The Parish Council has purchased more daffodil bulbs and Sidlow will plant these on their litter pick day and Salfords planting will be on Saturday 25 October meeting at 10am.

We hope you can join us for our Diwali celebration event, which is also on Saturday 25 October at Salfords village hall from midday to 2pm when we will be having crafts, dance and food and refreshments to celebrate.

The Sidlow fireworks event is booked for Saturday 1 November with gates opening at 6.30pm. Everyone is welcome. Our Christmas celebration will be held on Saturday 8 November at Salfords village hall. We will be turning on the Christmas lights, providing live music, refreshments and craft stalls to purchase Christmas presents. These are all free events for the benefit and enjoyment of our community. We hope you can join in the fun.

Councillors have responded to the Reigate and Banstead Borough Council Community Governance review advising we are open to exploring options to expand the parish boundary to the north, if our residents support it, and welcome dialogue with residents from those wards and R&BBC to consider the implications.

We are closely monitoring the local government reorganisation to try to better understand what impact it will have directly to our parish and residents.

Neighbourhood Plan Update and Progress

Councillors have been working on the development of the Salfords and Sidlow Neighbourhood Plan. We are creating a policy only plan, not recommending allocation of sites for development, but want our plan to be cohesive, stringent and help shape future development for the villages. We have met with Reigate and Banstead Borough Council who is supporting us on the process and are important and integral to this to be a success. Government targets for housing means Reigate and Banstead Borough Council has to build 1285 houses per annum. That is development size of 13 Westvale Parks in 15 years. We know our villages will be targeted for development and Reigate and Banstead Borough Council are currently undertaking a Green Belt review as requested by central government. We want to protect Salfords and Sidlow to ensure that any development in our community ensures it enhances it as best we can and the accompanying infrastructure and improvements are provided. We have several consultation events for you to come and see and comment on the development of the plan to date.

This is is your opportunity to work with us and provide feedback. We have to take the neighbourhood plan to a resident referendum prior to submission to the Planning Inspector for sign off so need your help to be part of this process and journey.



PLEASE JOIN IN THE COMMUNITY PLANTING

Gatwick Airport - Route 4

We have been in discussion with Gatwick Airport in respect of Route 4. We have received feedback from residents that they are experiencing more overflying in recent months and questioned if aircraft had deviated from the known legacy route.

At the September council meeting Councillors noted that 26% of flights using Route 4 are non-compliant to the Noise Preferential Route (NPR). It should be noted none of the other flight routes from Gatwick are non-compliant. We have written to Gatwick Airport to ask for detail and answers to the following: -

- Why is there so much non-compliance with Route 4 and none on other routes at Gatwick Airport?
- Can Gatwick Airport confirm if it is the same airlines who are non-compliant with Route 4?
- What authority/ ability does Gatwick Airport and the CAA have to these airlines on poor performance and what action is and can be taken?
- Is Gatwick Airport able to influence airlines who are not adhering to the NPR and share data with aircraft which can adhere to better educate the non-compliant ones?

We await the responses and once known will decide if there is any action we should be taking. We are advised by Gatwick Airport that there will be a Route 4 consultation in 2026. It is imperative that we have an understanding of the latest situation before being able to make comment on this.

Community Governance Review Consultation


Reigate & Banstead Borough Council (R&BBC) has started a Community Governance Review (CGR) to consider local governance arrangements throughout the Borough. This is a legal process that gives residents and organisations an opportunity to share their views on the most suitable ways of representing local people at a community level. Parish/ Town Councils can play an important role in terms of empowering communities and R&BBC want to ensure that parish governance within the borough continues to be robust, representative and is able to meet new challenges, such as the new unitary authorities. The aim of the review is to bring about:

- improved and stronger community engagement
- more cohesive communities
- better local democracy
- more effective and convenient delivery of local services ensuring residents across the respective areas are treated equally and fairly

Parish Councillors believe it is imperative that residents and businesses should have a local voice and be represented under the new unitary authority and as such are open to explore options with R&BBC to make sure this continues to happen. We have submitted a response to confirm we have looked at the borough wards to our north (Earlswood & Whitebushes and South Park & Woodhatch) and would welcome discussion with residents in the proposed wards together with R&BBC to better understand the possible options - benefits and difficulties from expansion into these areas.

We have made it clear that it is imperative that before the Parish Council could commit to any amendments to our existing parish, we would need to fully understand the views from our existing residents, views of the residents in this extended community, associated risks including financial / asset transfers. We would also request support from R&BBC to assist the Parish Council in being prepared with any expansion of electors such as calculating staff requirements to meet the new resident number demands.

Councillors agreed it was best to keep options open at this early stage in the consultation process. R&BBC Officers will consider all the responses to the consultation and make draft recommendations to full Council by 7 November and open another public consultation which will close on 16 January 2026. After this date R&BBC Officers will consider responses to the consultation and make final recommendations to full Council for implementation in March/April 2026. The next Parish Council elections will be held on 6 May 2027 which will be the effective date of any changes to parish/town boundaries and electoral arrangements.

Crosswinds - County Court

The Judge granted an interim injunction order for Crosswinds site at the court hearing on 21/7/25. This is in relation to the illegal waste dumping on a Green Belt site which has caused nuisance to residents with a continuous influx of lorries driving on local roads and causing damage to the land.

The interim order will remain in effect until the matter progresses towards a final judgement, which in turn could be followed by the Court granting a final order. The interim order will only seek to prohibit the relevant activities during its period of effect, so as to maintain a 'status quo'. Only at a final order would any remedial/removal works be mandated. The date for the next hearing at the Guildford county court is 29/9/25 at 12pm.

The Parish Council submitted representation for the court where we stated: -

- the nuisance to residents caused by a huge volume of lorrie's travelling at speed along Ironsbottom and Horse Hill from early in the morning until late at night day after day
- Observation that between 10 and 20 lorries with Fullers logo on their sides entering and leaving the site on a daily basis and how it is beyond comprehension that a firm of the size of Fuller Grab Hire Limited would not have been aware that the site had no planning permission for waste disposal
- Noting the obvious financial benefit to disposing of commercial construction waste in an unlawful manner being beneficial to the landowner and waste lorry operators
- Raising the fact that 80% of the land area is now said to be contaminated with unknown waste
- That the land has been raised by as much as one meter in many areas and without any satisfactory explanation it can only be agreed that it is purely for disposal reasons with its associated pecuniary advantage set off.

We stated it is essential that the land is restored to its original agricultural nature, to ensure that there is no risk of leaking of any contamination into the local water courses. We understand that the scale of the restoration works required to rectify any harm caused by the activity will be substantial. However, the offenders here are not innocent. Identical activity was stopped in 2021 at some cost to Surrey County Council in time effort, etc., however the owners failed to restore the land then and seemingly were encouraged by the lack of full enforcement to renew the activity in 2024.

A failure to require restoration now will only continue to encourage all of the defendants.

We await the decision of the court judgement.



Salfords village hall update

The Parish Council has made an application to bid for Reigate and Banstead Borough Council strategic CIL funding to enable us to make further enhancements to the village hall. The improvements include:

- repairs to roof at left hand side when viewed from the front
- Replacing the flat roof at the main entrance of the hall
- Wrapping all fascia and soffits to provide longevity and improve appearance
- To change the forecourt to provide on site parking including provision of dropped kerb and disabled parking
- Improvements to main hall floor.

If the Parish Council is successful, we will need to apply for planning permission for the carparking improvements and also make a subsequent application to Surrey County Council for the dropped kerb. Other works will need to go to tender.

In the meantime we have plans to have some decoration works to tidy up areas where there is wear and tear.

Communication Accessible

The village hall has been accredited as being Communication Accessible. The Clerk and Cllr Caroline Clarke have completed training on Communication Access which means they have the capability in supporting people with communication difficulties more effectively.

Public attendance at our Councillor Surgery is also welcomed as this is one of your opportunities to liaise with Councillors and make comment in an informal setting. If you feel strongly about an application it is important that residents also comment directly.

In the months July to September, the Council reviewed 16 planning applications as follows:- Support - 1, No observation – 7, No objection with comment - 5 and 3 objections.

APPLY FOR WARM HOMES GRANT

The Warm Homes Grant to make your home more energy efficient and save on bills is now open for applications in Surrey. Home improvements you can get:

- wall, loft and underfloor insulation
- air source heat pumps
- smart controls
- solar panels.

You are eligible if:

- your home is privately owned (either by you or your landlord)
- has an Energy Performance Certificate (EPC) of D, E, F or G if you do not know your home's EPC, you can find it out when you apply
- your household income is £36,000 a year or less. If you earn more than that, you might still be eligible if either:
 - you live in a certain postcode area
 - someone in your household is getting certain benefits

 This scheme is run by Surrey County Council.

ELECTRICAL CHARGE VEHICLE POINT What is the Surrey Chargepoint Network?

Providing the residents of Surrey with reliable, inclusive and convenient charging infrastructure is essential if the county is to be EV-ready by 2030.

That's why Surrey County Council has teamed up with Connected Kerb for a history-making project to install hundreds of charging points across the region by 2027. 
