#### SCRIPTURE READINGS

Daniel 6:10-22 - Daniel in the Lions' Den

10 Although Daniel knew that the document had been signed, he continued to go to his house, which had windows in its upper room open toward Jerusalem, and to get down on his knees three times a day to pray to his God and praise him, just as he had done previously. 11 The conspirators came and found Daniel praying and seeking mercy before his God. 12 Then they approached the king and said concerning the interdict, "O king! Did you not sign an interdict, that anyone who prays to anyone, divine or human, within thirty days except to you, O king, shall be thrown into a den of lions?" The king answered, "The thing stands fast, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, which cannot be revoked." 13 Then they responded to the king, "Daniel, one of the exiles from Judah, pays no attention to you, O king, or to the interdict you have signed, but he is saying his prayers three times a day."

14 When the king heard the charge, he was very much distressed. He was determined to save Daniel, and until the sun went down he made every effort to rescue him. 15 Then the conspirators came to the king and said to him, "Know, O king, that it is a law of the Medes and Persians that no interdict or ordinance that the king establishes can be changed."

16 Then the king gave the command, and Daniel was brought and thrown into the den of lions. The king said to Daniel, "May your God, whom you faithfully serve, deliver you!" 17 A stone was brought and laid on the mouth of the den, and the king sealed it with his own signet and with the signet of his lords, so that nothing might be changed

concerning Daniel. 18 Then the king went to his palace and spent the night fasting; no food was brought to him, and sleep fled from him.

Daniel Saved from the Lions

19 Then, at break of day, the king got up and hurried to the den of lions. 20 When he came near the den where Daniel was, he cried out anxiously to Daniel, "O Daniel, servant of the living God, has your God whom you faithfully serve been able to deliver you from the lions?" 21 Daniel then said to the king, "O king, live forever! 22 My God sent his angel and shut the lions' mouths so that they would not hurt me, because I was found blameless before him; and also before you, O king, I have done no wrong."

#### REFLECTION

Are you familiar with the story of Daniel in the lion's den?

The meaning of the name of Daniel is this: Dan (or Din) is 'to judge' in Hebrew, and El is the abbreviation of Elohim (God) in Hebrew. Daniel means that 'God judges alone' or 'God is my judge.'

The whole book of Daniel is about it. If you are righteous and truthful to your God, you would be safe in any circumstance, even in the lion's den.

Of many episodes, I picked up this story this morning for it is one of the most popular, and John Dodington wanted to sing it with the choir.

When I heard of it in my childhood, mainly through Sunday School, I was so amazed and excited and often raised a question to myself: Would God really save me in any condition like Daniel if I were truthful and faithful to God?

My answer was, "Yes," until I got severely bitten by a dog.

Ever since, I have had an instant fear - the trauma of facing animals, whether it is big or small.

"Me in the lion's den overnight under the protection of the angel of God."

I cannot handle it. I may pass out immediately, even before the lion's roaring.

Is there anyone here who can stay in the lion's den overnight with a 100% guarantee of safety and security?

How about with a prize of ten million dollars?

No, No, No. Don't be even close to the lion's den.

Daniel in the lion's den - What, then, is it all about?

It is all about Christ – the soul from God in the animal body.

It is all about justice in the unjust animal world

I want to remind you of what Paul says to people in Corinth:

2 Cor. 4:7 - But we have this treasure in clay jars so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God and does not come from us.

Daniel, God judges alone, is in you, and dwells in your body.

Where was Christ born?

Christ was born in a stable in Bethlehem.

Why Bethlehem?

This is because Bethlehem is the House of Bread (Beth—house + lehem—bread in Hebrew).

Therefore, Jesus the Bread from heaven should be born in the Bakery of Bethlehem. Why The stable?

For it is the place where animals dwell.

Without God, living bread, the law of God, judgment and righteousness of God, the lion, the king of animals, dominates and rules you and your life.

Who / what are the lions today?

Five giant companies such as Microsoft, Apple, Saudi Arabia Oil Company, Amazon, Meta, and Costco

And G-7 plus Russia and China are the lions in the den of the world.

Without Christ, the living bread, animals in the stable argue, fight, and even kill one another.

That is the world we live in now.

So, we have constant wars in the lion's den at present in Ukraine, Genocide in Gaza, and conflict between Iran and Israel just began.

We have, however, good news that Christ the babe was laid in the manger.

Eat the bread I gave you, and drink the cup I shed so that the babe Christ in us may grow.

Every baby born has the potential to grow to conquer the lion king.

What happened right after Jesus was baptized at the Jordan River?

Mark 1:12-13 And the Spirit immediately drove him out into the wilderness. 13 He was in the wilderness forty days, tested by Satan, and he was with the wild beasts, and the angels waited on him.

See the parallel between Jesus with the wild beasts and Daniel with the lions in the den.

What are the wild beasts?

Paul defines it as such in Galatians 5:19-21: Now the works of the flesh are obvious: sexual immorality, impurity, debauchery, 20 idolatry, sorcery, enmities, strife, jealousy, anger, quarrels, dissensions, factions, 21 envy,[a] drunkenness, carousing, and things like these. I am warning you, as I warned you before: those who do such things will not inherit the kingdom of God.

22 By contrast, the fruit of the Spirit is love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, generosity, faithfulness, 23 gentleness, and self-control. There is no law against such things.

The Bible keeps telling us about human conditions in the lion's den.

Take another look at Matthew 10:16: I am sending you out like sheep into the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves.

Here, the Christ character is described as a sheep and dwells in the midst of wolves.

The picture of the gentle Christ spirit tenants the bodies of the wild beasts of earth! It is another metaphor for Daniel in the lion's den.

So, the Bible advises us to be wise like serpents and be innocent like doves.

The serpent is not always a bad image in the Bible.

We find the sheep image such as kind, gentle, weak, innocent, dedicated and truthful to his Lord in the character of Daniel in the lion's den.

The story of Daniel, the man of the judge of God, tells us that the soul may safely reside in the animal's body or "den," if it holds true to its divine ideal.

So, the Psalmist says, "The Lord is my shepherd, I shall not want" - Psalm 23.

Can you declare it in the situation of the lion's den?

Who will judge and protect you?

Let me conclude with Psalm 91: You who live in the shelter of the Most High, who abide in the shadow of the Almighty,[a] 2 will say to the Lord, "My refuge and my fortress; my God, in whom I trust." Amen.
