

Draft Clean Energy Implementation Plan content development update

9/17/21

Puget Sound Energy (PSE) is developing its first Clean Energy Implementation Plan (CEIP), and will file the draft CEIP on October 15, 2021. The matrix below provides an enumeration of the CEIP requirements found in Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 480-100-640 and the current status of the draft development of each item.

This document fulfills the requirements of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission's Docket UE-210571 Order 1 conditions in Paragraph 19, Condition 1-4.

PSE's current draft goals are 59 percent renewable and non-emitting generation by the end of 2025; all retail sales of electricity to Washington electric customers are greenhouse gas neutral by January 1, 2030; and nonemitting electric generation and electricity from renewable resources supply one hundred percent of all retail sales of electricity to Washington electric customers by January 1, 2045. PSE presented this information to its IRP stakeholder group on September 14, 2021, and the Equity Advisory Group on September 13, 2021.
