

On Our Journey.....to discomfort

This weekend I was called out of my comfort zone. I suppose we have all experienced new varieties of discomfort recently. These are trying times indeed. Yet, are the troubles of modernity all that different than the

perennial plagues which have infected the cosmos since its inception? Where is one to turn?

I began this reflection with some very intentionally chosen words: called and comfort. The invitation I received this weekend was not one that I would have chosen myself. I had plans. Besides, I would never have chosen to attend an event where I would obviously be an alien. I would be one of the few who doesn't speak the language. There are many things about the culture I do not understand. To attend would be very uncomfortable. But I did go. Why? I was called. I was called, by God, to be at this event. I was called, by God, to be uncomfortable. God chose me, as unworthy, stiff-necked, and unqualified as I was, to go. I said yes (by His Grace) to do something for Him; that I would never have chosen for myself.

As it turns out, very little of my cowardice actually conspired. On the contrary, I concluded the day, with the realization that I had encountered God, at a depth I had never before experienced, thanks to this special community of people. I cannot offer enough thanks to the Deaf Community or to God for making this possible!

Perhaps, in God's Providence, all Christians should, and have always been, called to be uncomfortable in this world and with the things of this world. Perhaps, if more Catholics could hear the call of God and accept the invitation to get out of our comfort zones, more people would know Jesus. Perhaps, we have been chosen and called not for comfort, but greatness. Now that would be countercultural!

Or Lady of Courage, pray for us!

AIR CONDITIONER REPLACEMENT NEWS

Beginning **Thursday, September 25** thru **Friday, October 10** we will be replacing the 8 AC units in the **Cathedral** (those under the stations of the cross). The present units are 16 years old. Two of the units have been down all summer. Parts are no longer available for the units as the model brand is obsolete. The installation of the new units will take around <u>2 weeks</u>. Small scaffolds will be set up in front of each unit during installation. To expediate the install we will **close the Church during the week days. Wednesday's 8:30AM masses (10/1 & 10/8) will be at St. John the Evangelist. Adoration will begin at 5:00PM,** instead of 3:00PM. Friday's 8:30AM masses will still be at the Cathedral. The weekend masses (9/28 & 10/4) will still be at the Cathedral but some pew space will be lost due to the scaffolding. Funds to pay for these AC units will come from the 1 by 1 campaign. These funds were originally slated to replace the Chiller in the Cathedral Center. We are now short funds to replace that unit. Any help in this area is surely welcomed.
