





On Our Journey

After my husband's grandmother passed I was given a large box of her quilting supplies and a fat stack of various quilting blocks. Some were even from his grandmother's mother!

As I sorted through all the bits and pieces I realized that I didn't know what pattern they had planned to use nor what size of quilt. How could I ever make sense of all this randomness? However, I felt like it was important that I not give up on it.

There is something special about working on a project started by a different generation. There was this sense of being connected to those who came before me. I felt connected not only to both of my husband's grandmothers and great-grandmother's, but also to my own grandmother who taught me to sew as a child.

I truly felt like I was wrapped up in their love and encouragement even when I didn't know what to do with what I was given.

This project made me realize that my experience with this quilt is much like my faith journey.

I am never alone when I try to make sense of things I have been handed in life. I have been blessed with both faithful relatives who set good examples, as well as brothers and sisters in Christ who walked before me. They are still here with me and you today encouraging us to have hope and to not give up— even when our walk on earth looks like a lot of random quilt squares that don't fit together. Because in the end, they will all fall in place the way God intended.
