



On Our Journey.....to Sainthood

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Praise and Glory in our Lord Jesus Christ! We are getting close to the season of All Saints.

My suspicion is most of you have a favorite Saint. Whether it is our confirmation name, our birth given name, our Blessed Mother, someone whose life inspires us, or someone we have turned to in times of sorrow, the Saints are continually available to us, through their intercession.

Intercession of those who have gone before us, and who's eternal reward is to be forever with Christ, is very biblical. Saint Paul proclaims, "For I am sure that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor things present, nor things to come, nor powers, nor height, nor depth, nor anything else in all creation, will be able to separate us from the love of God in Christ Jesus or Lord" (Rom 8:38-39). The Saints are alive in Christ and full members of the community of believers, the Mystical Body of Christ.

The Saints can be like our first responders; they are fully aware of our needs and await the opportunity to pour out their love of God at our sincere heartfelt request. The Book of Job gives us one such example when an angel asks the Lord to deliver a man from death and return him to his youthful vigor (Job 33:23-26). The prophet David cries out to the Heavens and implores the angels, "Bless the Lord, O you His angels, you mighty ones who do His word, harkening to the voice of His word!" (Psalm 103:20 and 148:2). We can do likewise!

It is important to point out that praying to the Saints is not idolatry. We do not worship the Saints; worship is reserved for God alone! We pray for the Saints to intercede for us, it is ultimately God who is the source of our answers to prayer.

Lastly, as the one mediator between God and man, (1 Tim. 2:5-6) ultimately, praying to the Saints is all about Jesus. He is the one who granted them victory over death, He is the head that unites all the members of the Body together, He is the one who hears and answers the prayers of in Heaven and on earth. Perhaps now is the right time to remind us that we are all created to become Saints! How's that goin' for ya?
