

#### The Advent of RESCUE

**Question:** As children of God, what are we supposed to be doing during the four weeks leading up to Christmas?

**Answer:** Preparing for the birth of our Lord, Jesus Christ!

**Invitation:** Join us for the Advent of Rescue, an opportunity to join our St. John the Evangelist Parish Community in preparing for the birth of our Lord, through Advent Reflections, based on the Rescue Project with Fr. John Ricardo. As a group we will gather weekly for five consecutive Tuesday evenings, beginning at 6 PM in the Parish Office of St. John the Evangelist.

**Week 1:** Tuesday, November 25th at 6 PM, the plan for the next four weeks will be shared, *The 2025 Advent of Rescue* books will be distributed, and what we need to do to prepare for the next four weeks will be discussed.

**Weeks 2 – 5:** Tuesday, December 2nd, 9th, 16th, and 23rd at 6 PM. We will read scripture-based Advent Reflections and answer questions that will reveal the meaning of Advent. Our attention will be spent on "various prophecies in the Old Testament and we will reveal the unforeseen breakthrough, a making of rights for the things gone wrong, an unimaginable end to Death and of the one who tyrannizes us". We will learn how the "Gospels reveal to us a Savior who fulfills the many things that had been prophesied so many years before, and who exhorts us to prepare for His triumphant return when He will both render judgement and make all things new". The reflections will "tell the story of God becoming Flesh in the Person of Jesus who has come to fight for us and bring about definitive restoration to His creation and transform the Human Family into the Family of God".



#### **Dedication of the Lateran Basilica**


Did you know there are churches in Rome older than St. Peter's? St. John Lateran is one of four major basilicas in the Eternal City, and it is by far the oldest. The land was donated by an ancient Roman family to the Emperor Constantine, who in turn gave it to the Church. For hundreds of years, St. John Lateran was the "mother church." Popes lived on the grounds through the 14th century. The church itself suffered from pillaging by invaders, fires, and earthquakes. It has been restored and rebuilt five times since the 300s. On this feast, we remember more than a building. We celebrate the resiliency of our faith. Though trials may come in our parishes, personal lives, and the world, the Church endures through the grace of Jesus Christ.
