




On Our Journey...

Take up your Cross. This will be my last bulletin article before the season of Lent begins, so I want to touch on a Lenten subject. I recently heard Fr. Mike Schmitz define active and passive taking up of our crosses. I would like to briefly summarize and add to what he said because I think we can all gain something from it.

First off, let's put this saying in its proper perspective. In Jesus' days, taking up your cross meant one thing and only one thing: death. If you were carrying a cross, you were on your way to a Roman crucifixion. Today, we approach it with less vigor. Today, the cross is a difficulty in our lives, but it is still a call to die to oneself for the sake of the Kingdom.

To actively take up our crosses is something we will do for Lent. We call it fasting and almsgiving; I would not count prayer as a cross to bear, although I understand it can be difficult at certain times in our lives. These crosses are active because we are choosing the cross and how and when it will be carried.

To passively take up our cross is to be given a cross we didn't choose, and one we don't want. These can range widely from your child struggling in one of their classes to losing a loved one. The fact that we didn't choose and don't want it doesn't allow us to simply drop it.

When God is calling us to purification and to grow closer to him, he is making a greater good out of our situation, even if we can't see it. At these times, listening to his Son is extremely beneficial. "Come to me, all you who labor and are burdened, and I will give you rest. Take my yoke upon you and learn from me, for I am meek and humble of heart; and you will find rest for yourselves. For my yoke is easy, and my burden light." (Matthew 11: 28-30).
