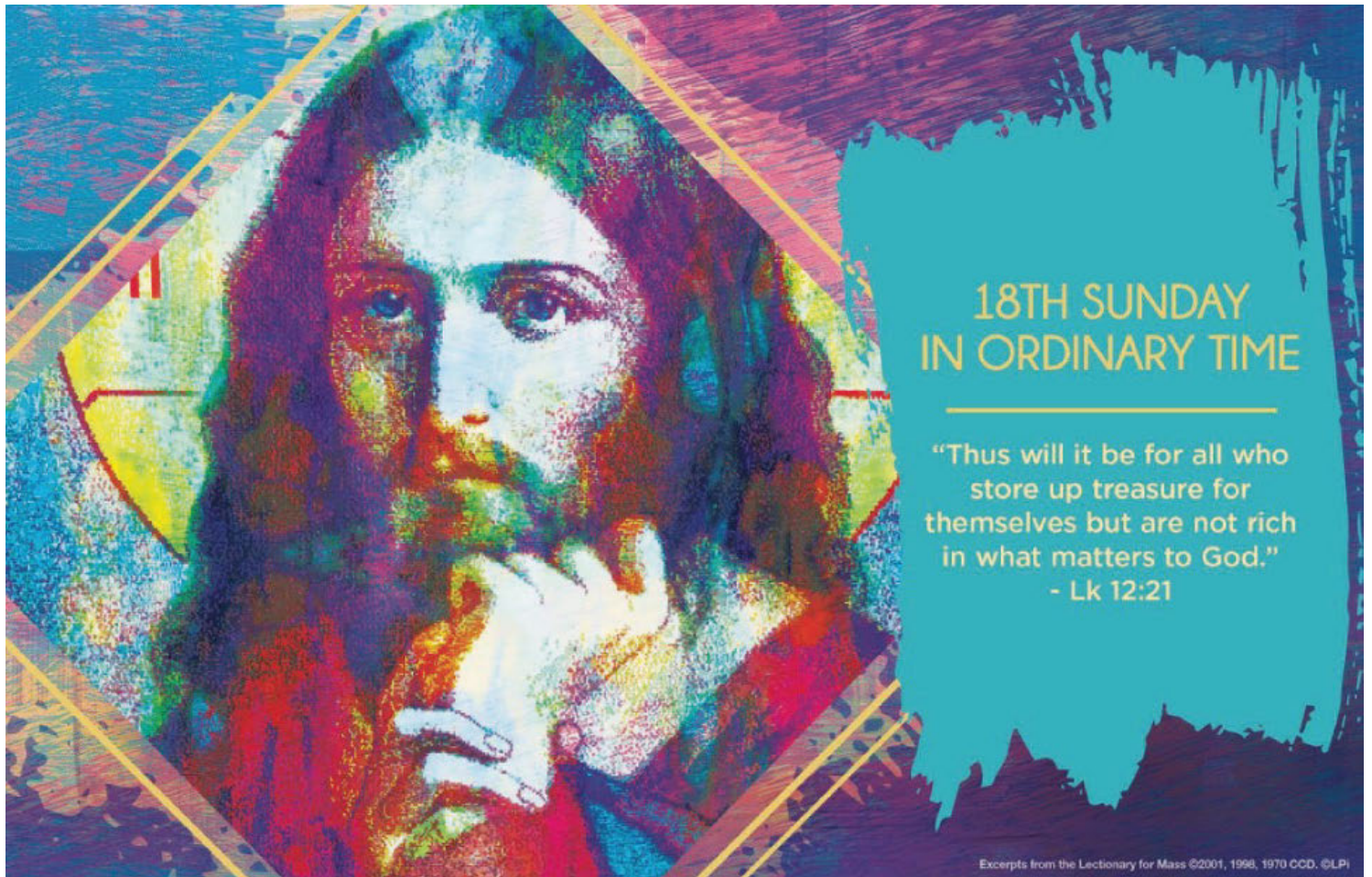

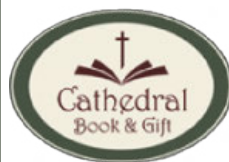

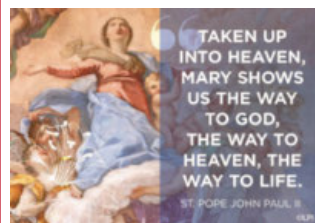

2025-26 Registration

St. Francis Xavier Cathedral and St. John the Evangelist Youth Faith Formation/Sacramental Preparation

Registration is now open for the 2025-26 faith formation year. All classes and Catechesis of the Good Shepherd atrium sessions are held on Wednesdays September through May. For planning purposes, please register as soon as possible. To avoid a late fee, please register no later than June 15th.

All Class offerings are held at St. Francis Xavier Cathedral site:

- Weekly Youth Faith Formation classes for children in grades 1-12
- Weekly Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Level 1 atrium session (ages 3-6)
- Confirmation classes held separately in the spring of 2026
- First Confession/Holy Communion Preparation Classes

***First Confession and Holy Communion:** For children entering second grade or an older child who has not received these sacraments. Important note: Children who attend Catholic Day School seeking to prepare for these sacraments need to register now for part time classes at the parish (*see separate part time schedule on Cathedral website*).

***Confirmation:** teens in public, parochial, and home school seeking the sacrament of Confirmation MUST REGISTER NOW for classes held in the spring of 2026.

On Our Journey

Gratitude. I often tell people that the easiest thing to do in the world is to complain. It takes very little know-how, makes us feel better about ourselves (or does it?), and with ease, it is repeated, time after time after time. There is a reason why a popular phrase coined in 16th-century England remains popular today: “misery loves company.” That’s because our fallen nature leaves us prone to such behavior, and if we can find a confidant in our moaning and groaning, well, all the better! So, what is the alternative? Gratitude.

Dictionary.com defines gratitude as *the quality or feeling of being grateful or thankful*. Gratitude is not something we can bring upon ourselves; like all things in life, it is a gift or grace from God. Any gift or grace from God is not a reward for doing something well or earning his grace; it is a free will offering given to us for our own good and the building up of God’s Kingdom.

So, how can we tell if we are grateful? There is a fairly simple way to get an idea of how grateful we may or may not be. Take a look at yourself and consider how patient or impatient you are. A lack of gratitude or thankfulness is first seen in how patient or impatient we are. The next stage of impatience is complaining. We’ve all been there, “why is this taking so long”, or “when are they going to be here?”. Our level of patience is a mirror of our level of gratitude. The patient person is almost always more grateful. Patience is a Fruit of the Holy Spirit. Ask the Holy Spirit for patience, and gratitude will soon follow.
