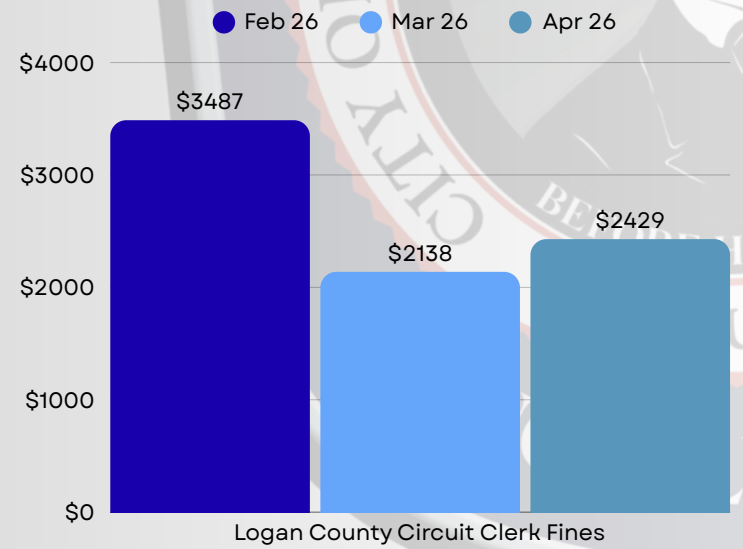
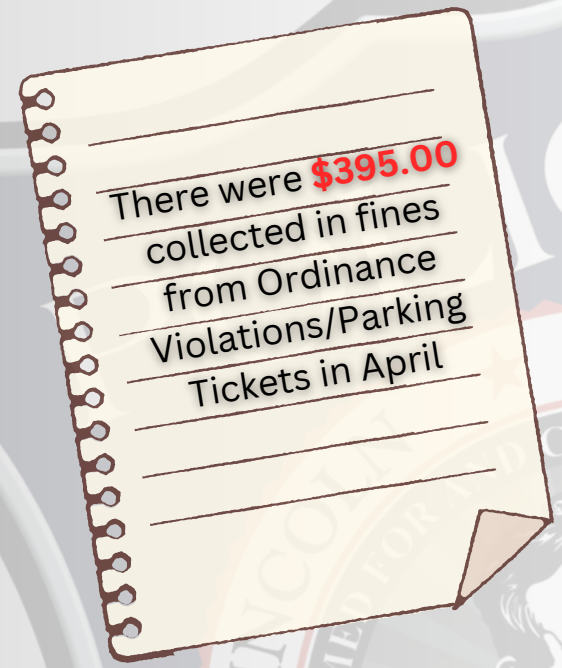
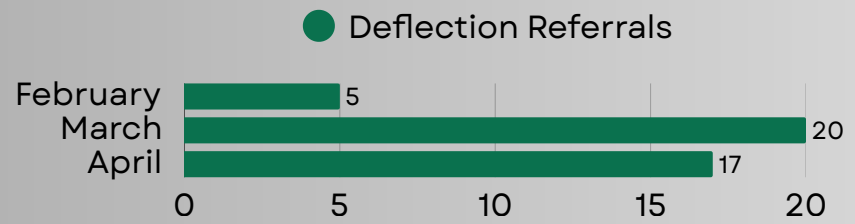
DIVISION

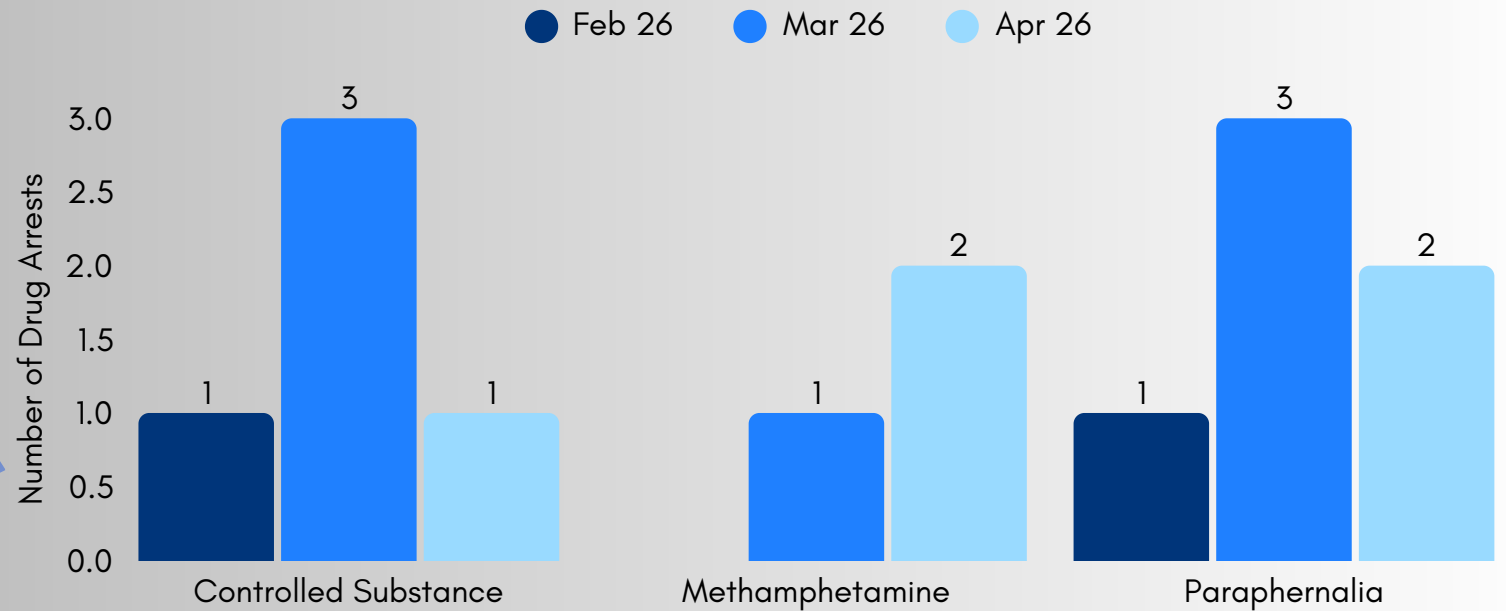
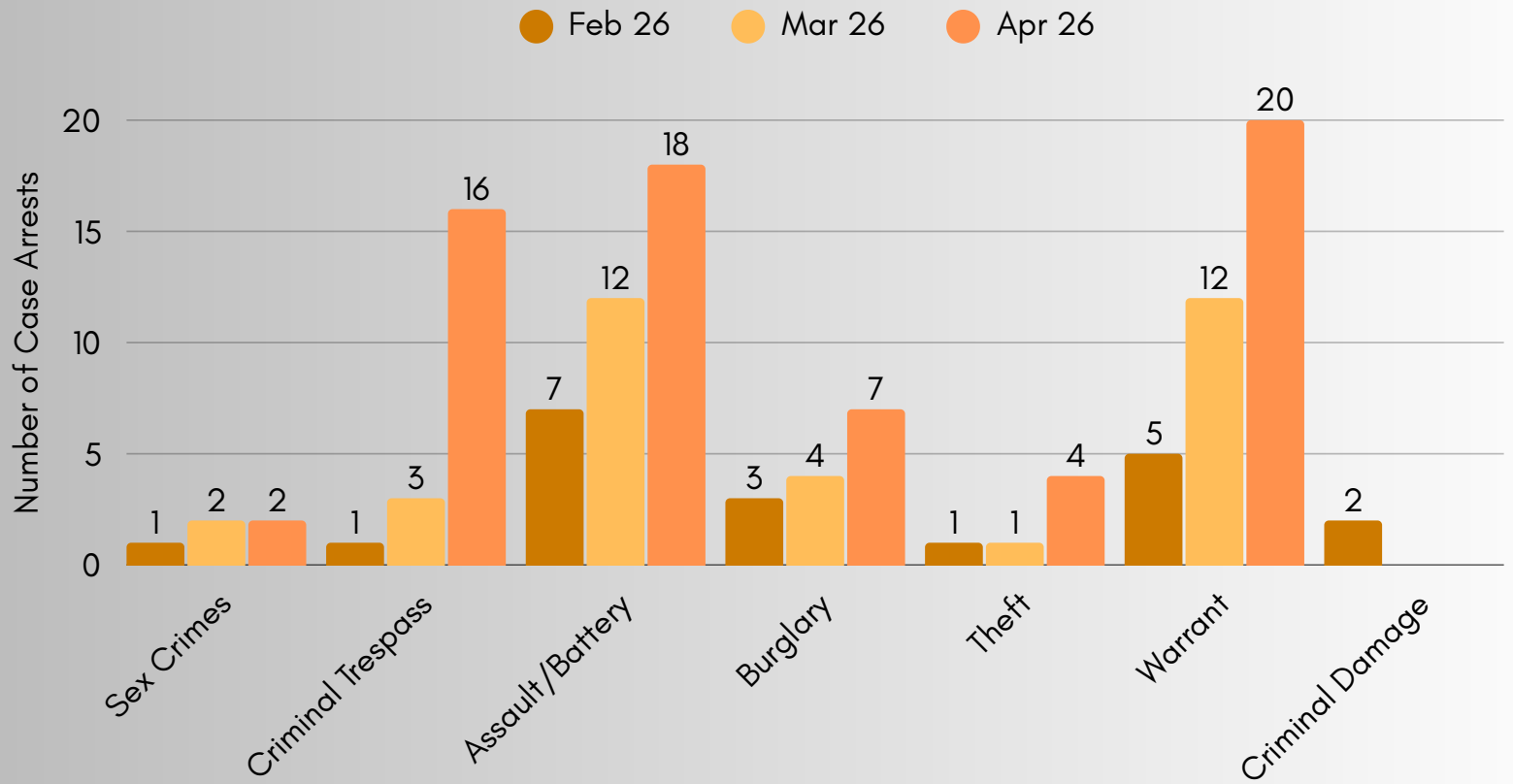
ANALYSIS

Crime Analysis is responsible for the analysis and distribution of crime activity data and the collection and preservation of crime intelligence information for the City of Lincoln. This data is compiled into the National Incident-Based Reporting System or NIBRS. NIBRS captures information on victims, offenders, arrestees, property, and the location involved in crimes on each incident in great detail. This federally based program breaks down law enforcement data into three main categories: Crimes Against Persons, Property Crimes, and Active Community Policing (drug crimes).

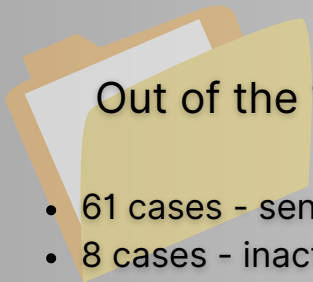

PATROL

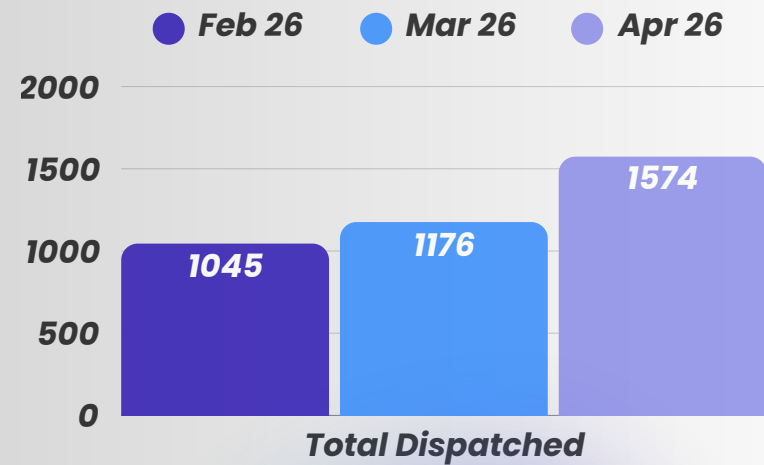
DIVISION

The Patrol Division consists of 20 officers patrolling the streets of Lincoln split up into four shifts, including one K-9 Unit. The City of Lincoln is broken down into 3 different beats in order to best protect and serve the 13,406 citizens of our community. The Patrol Units have two different types calls for service they answer to: dispatched and self-initiated.

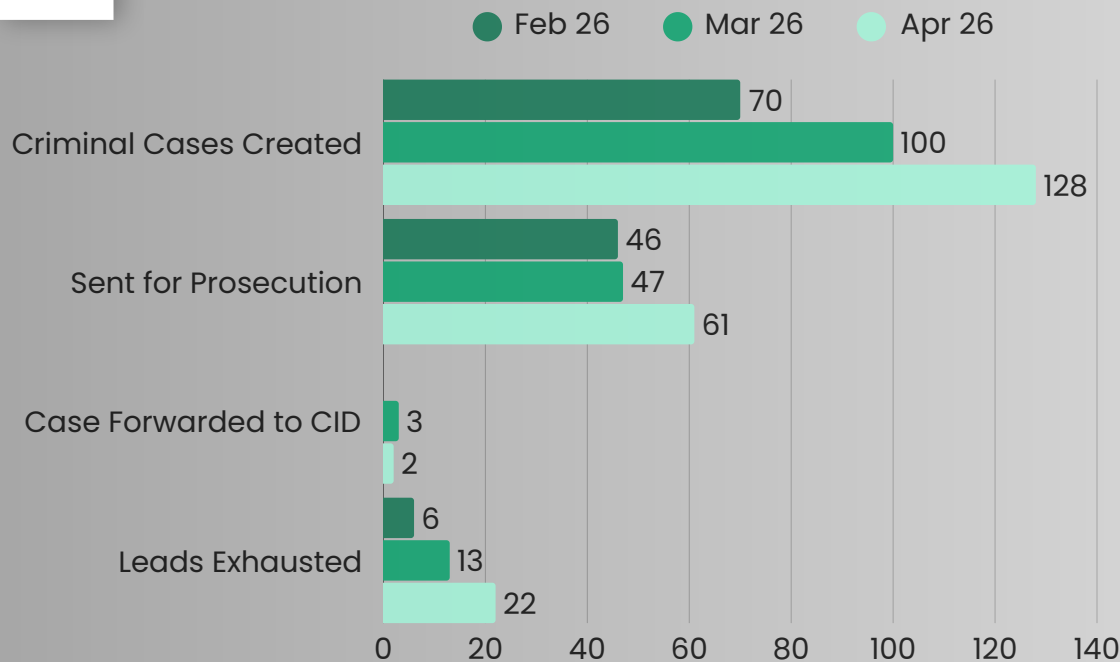


Out of the 1,574 calls for service, 128 new criminal cases were created

- 61 cases - sent to the State's Attorney's Office to seek prosecution
- 8 cases - inactive pending further information

Calls for Service**



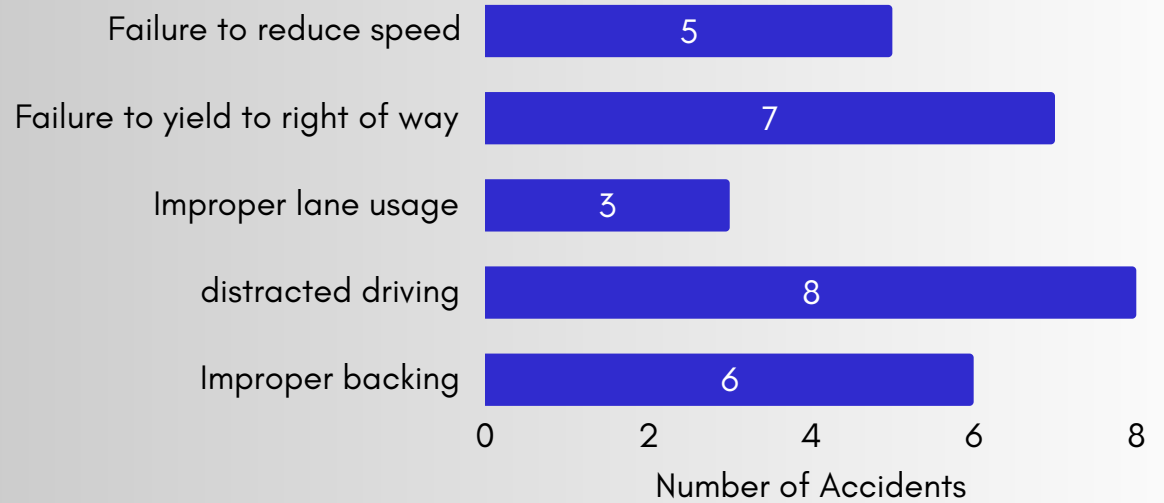
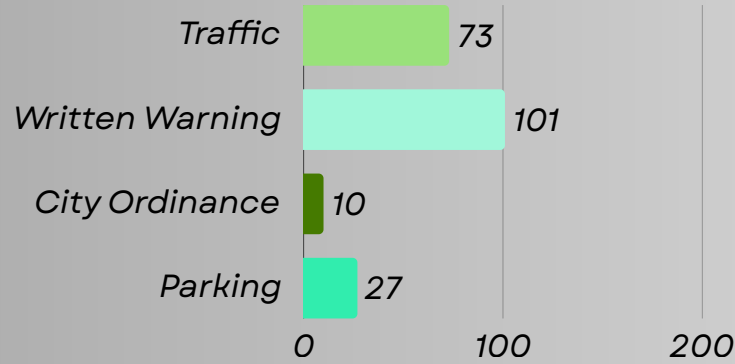
For the month of April, there were 786 self-initiated and 788 dispatched; totaling 1,574 calls for service.

The top incidents for April were: building premise checks, follow up investigations, traffic stops, domestic battery/assault calls for service, and citizen contacts.

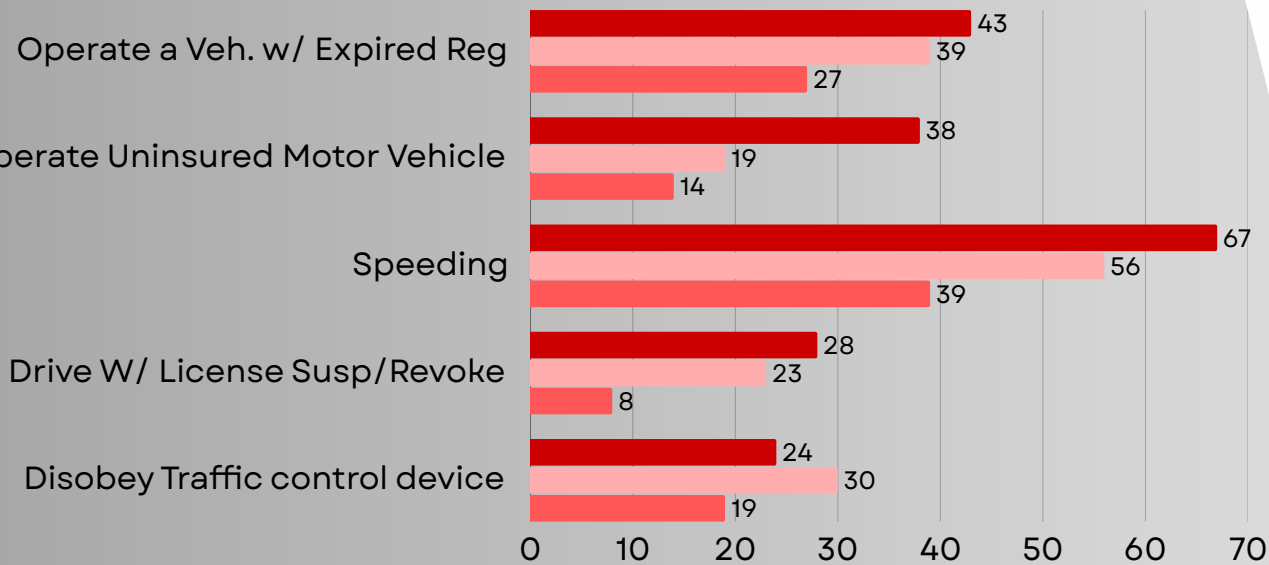

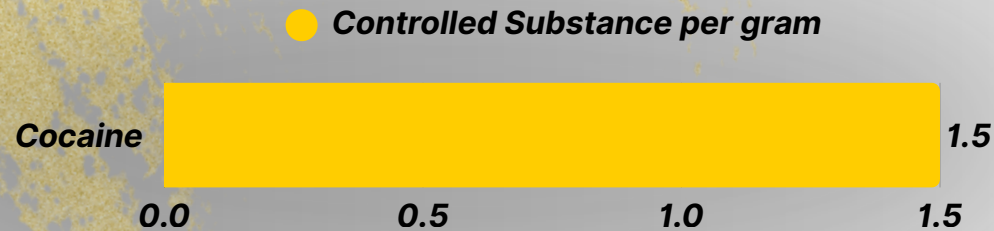
K-9

UNIT

K9 Diesel has been certified by the State of Illinois to detect the odor of illegal drugs, track to assist in the apprehension of suspects, locate missing individuals, and conduct "article searches", which are searches for discarded objects.

K9 Diesel and his handler Sergeant Phillips had 7 deployments for the month of April. One person search, and 6 vehicle deployments were completed resulting in 4 drug paraphernalia seizures, 2 controlled substance seizures and 1 felony arrest.

Sergeant Phillips and K9 Diesel put in a total of 17.2 hours of training in combined patrol and detection exercises for April as well.

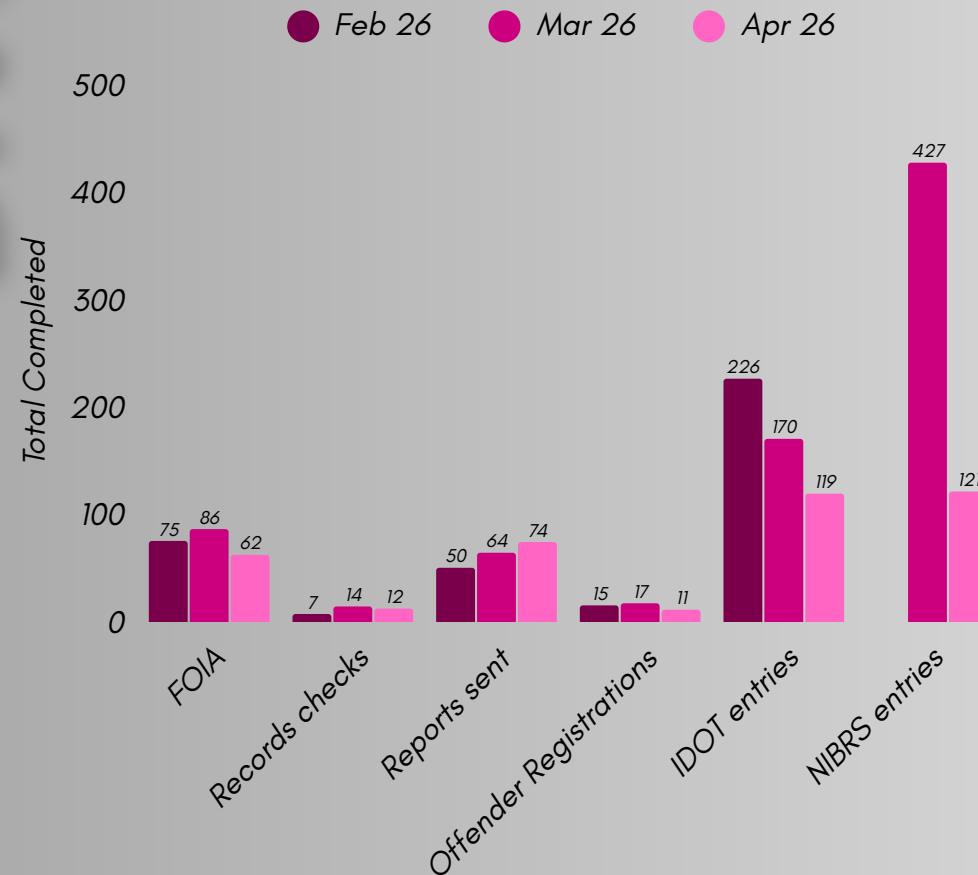

RECORDS

The Records Department provides clerical and administrative support to the operational side of our department and assistance to the community.

Records is responsible for IDOT reporting, verifying ordinance violations, performing criminal background checks, fulfilling FOIA requests, serving as business hours switchboard operator, NIBRS entry custodian, registering sex offenders and violent offenders, and executing court orders to expunge or seal reports.



EVIDENCE

The Evidence Technician has the responsibility of taking custody and managing each piece of evidence that is acquired by the Lincoln Police Department. This includes, articles of evidence related to criminal offenses, found or recovered property and any items held for safekeeping. Chain of custody is the primary responsibility of the evidence technician.

The tech tracks evidence from intake, lab transfer, court detail, release to owner, and disposition. All evidence in the Lincoln Police Department is tracked via the barcoding and records management system.

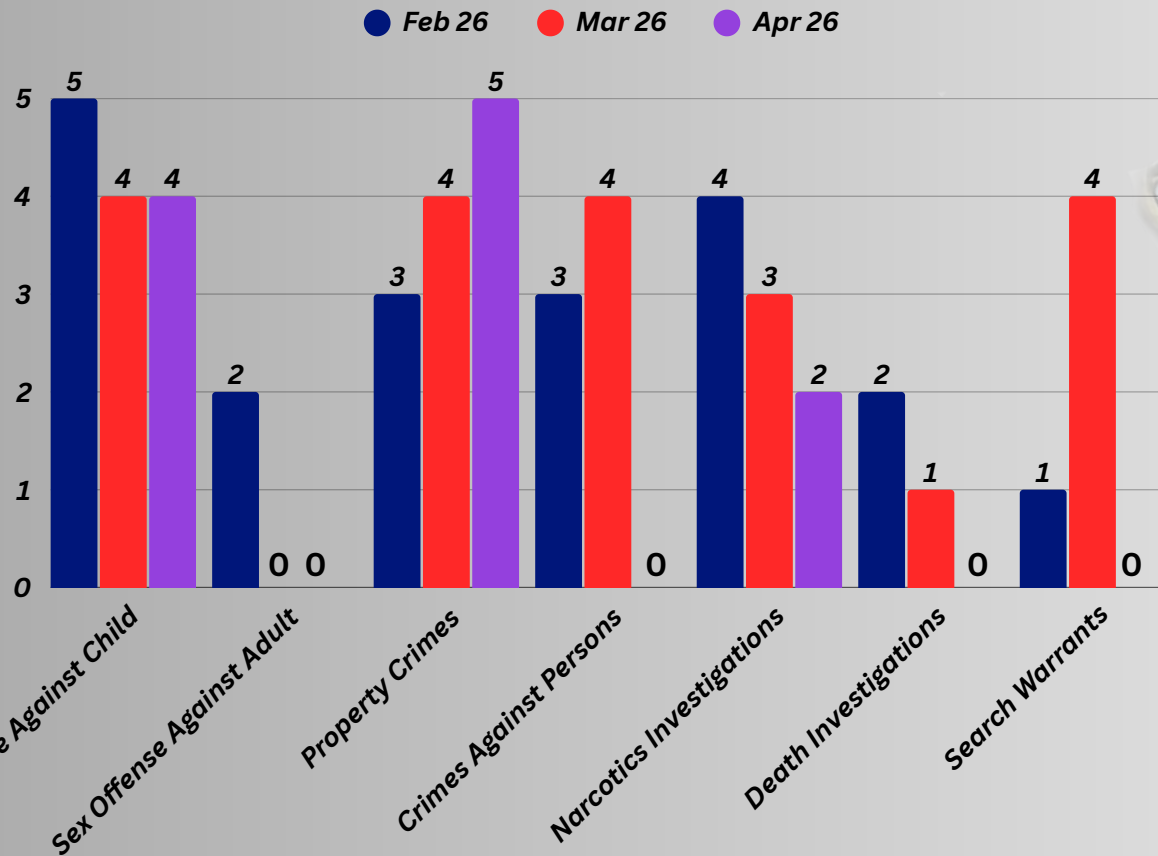

DIVISION

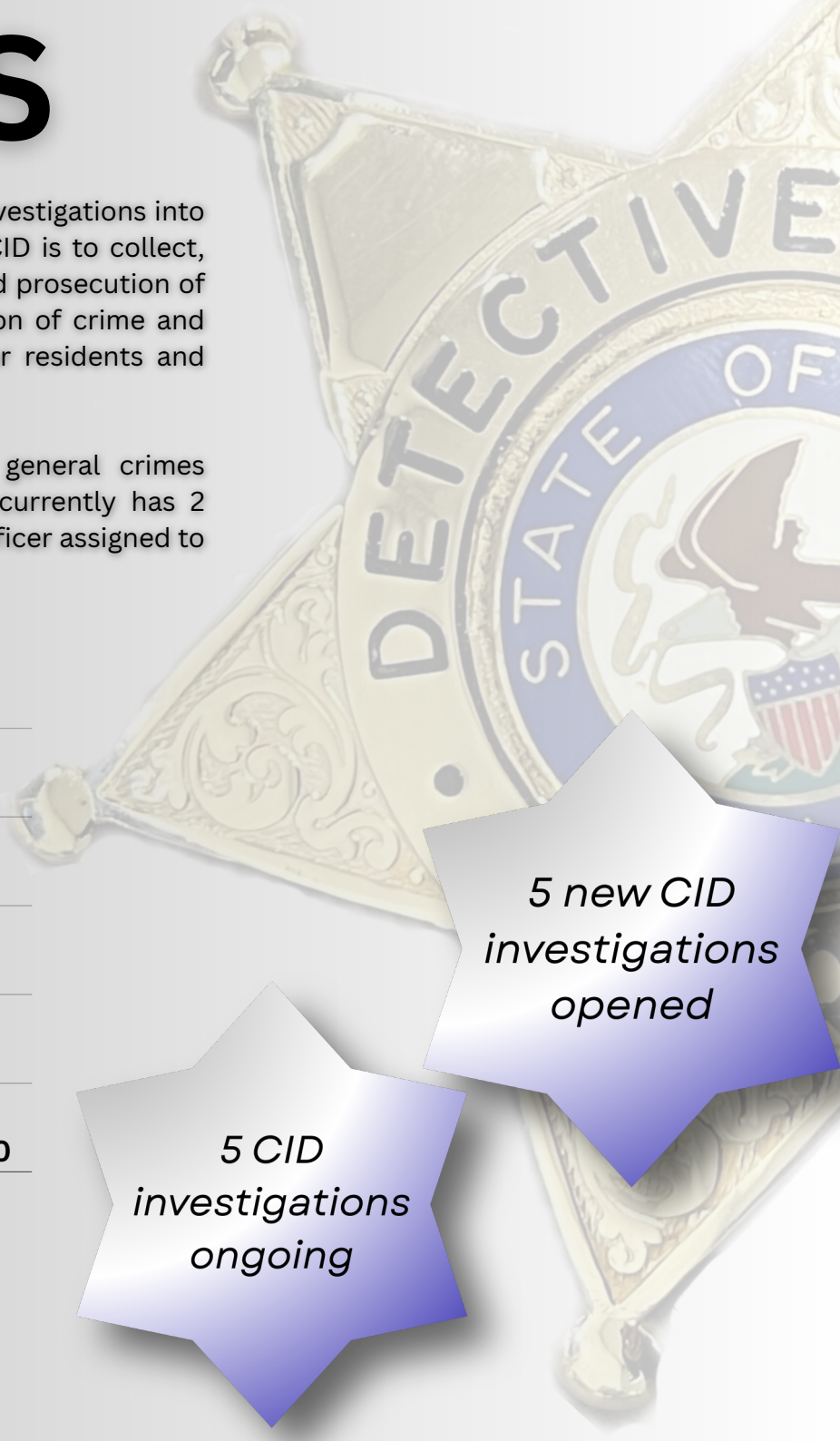
The Criminal Investigation Department (CID) has the responsibility to conduct investigations into criminal acts reported to the Lincoln Police Department. The primary goal of CID is to collect, preserve, and present evidence that conclusively leads to a successful arrest and prosecution of the criminal. CID also works with other department units toward the prevention of crime and other related activities in order to maintain the highest quality of life for our residents and visitors.

The Criminal Investigations Department has positions for 4 detectives; 2 general crimes detectives, 1 violent crimes detective and 1 drug task force inspector. CID currently has 2 detectives running investigations at this time, 1 drug task force inspector and 1 officer assigned to the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force.
