

# NEWS

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## Report Summary

Lincoln Police responded to 792 incidents, which resulted in 86 case reports written for the month of February. Officers responded to 18 vehicle crashes. Patrol officers wrote 53 traffic citations, 45 written warnings and 1 city ordinance violations.

Of the 60 arrests for the month, the top arrests were for warrant, criminal trespassing, driving with license suspended, DUI's and possession of drug paraphernalia. Detectives continued investigations on many cases including participating in CIEG task force operations.

## Fines


Fines collected, by the Logan County Circuit Clerk, for Lincoln during the month of February were \$5,377.28

### Top 10 Vehicle Actions






# MONTHLY STATISTICS

### NIBRS Report for February 2025








# DIVISION REPORTS

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## Criminal Investigations

The detectives of the Criminal Investigation Division of the Lincoln Police Department conducted further investigation on 19 active criminal investigations in the month of February. The types of investigations are listed but due to the sensitivity of those investigations, specific information is not available for release.

One officer of the Criminal Investigations Division continues to participate in a multi-jurisdictional drug task force, conducting joint investigations with other local, state, and federal agencies.

## Lincoln K9




Officer Phillips and K9 Diesel had 4 deployments during the month of February. On those deployments, there were 4 search environments all of which were vehicles. There were 4 indications on these deployments which produced 4 seized incidents and 2 arrests. The seized items consisted of drugs and drug paraphernalia.

Officer Phillips and K9 Diesel spent 18.0 hours training during the month of February.

## DARE/Community Policing

The Department supports the DARE program and its efforts to assist youths with sound judgement and decision making, including but not limited to resisting drug/alcohol abuse and prevention of bullying at home, at school and in their community.

The Lincoln Police Department was the training hub for the 5th consecutive year this February hosting 18 enthusiastic officers from all over the country. The two week D.A.R.E. curriculum is designed to take the officer from an investigative mindset to a teaching mindset. The Lincoln Police Department has graduated many of our own officers through this program and currently have four active D.A.R.E. officers on staff; as well as D.A.R.E. Instructor Officer Fruge.



## School Resource

The goals of well-founded SRO programs include providing safe learning environments in our community's schools, providing valuable resources to school staff members, fostering positive relationships with youth, developing strategies to resolve problems affecting youth and protecting all students, so that they can reach their fullest potentials. The three main roles of school resource officers are: educator (i.e. guest lecturer), informal counselor/mentor, and law enforcement officer.

SRO Rohrer responded to incidents of battery/assault/threat issues, alcohol/tobacco/vape issues, bullying/harassment issues, social/emotional/mental health issues, theft issues and accident/parking lot issues.

SRO Christy Fruge responded to incidents of bullying/harassment issues, social/emotional/mental health, which involved counseling issues, truancy and truancy issues.
