Transition Week – Wed 16th July to Mon 21st July

As with any small school, where there are mixed aged classes, transition from one class to another is a big thing for both children and adults. For many, you have had two years of stability in one class, knowing the classroom and its' routines but a change can inevitably have some people feeling anxious.

With some of the 'big' moves, such as moving from Year 2 to 3 or Year 6 moving to high school, a lot has already been happening to support your child, including visit, group activities and lots of conversations around 'moving on'.


Since the pandemic, and following consultation with yourselves a few years ago now, we go beyond what most primary schools do and offer a 'transition week', which begins on Wednesday 16th July. The week will run for four days, including Monday 21st July.

On Tuesday 22nd July, just for the final day, all classes will return to their former rooms and the staff. We hope this doesn't confuse them, but it's an ideal chance to be with their old class one final time and an opportunity to celebrate the year, particularly with our leavers service being that morning in church.

In this week, the children will effectively move to their new class, as if it were September. This means working with the new staff, possibly a different year group and being in the actual classroom for next year. The aim of this is to ease any worries they may have for September.

Squirrel Class (New Year 1 & 2)


The following staff will be in Squirrel Class next year:
