

Introduction

Jávea (Xàbia in Valencian) is one of the most exclusive holiday resorts in Spain. Since its tourist expansion, Jávea has always opted for tourism with a high purchasing power, family-oriented and concerned about the conservation of its privileged natural environment. This has allowed it to maintain its traditional character, care for nature and reduced overcrowding.



It has a **rocky coastline of 25 with 5 capes**, which give rise to a large bay, as well as numerous coves of different sizes and types, with endless opportunities for variety when it comes to bathing on **rocky, gravel or sandy beaches**, some of which are only accessible by boat. They also form a **unique landscape of cliffs, coves and mountains**, which has been painted by famous painters such as Sorolla, André Lambert, Navarro Llorens and Sala Coll.



Jávea is eminently suburban, having always avoided high-rise construction. Its population resides mainly in single-family homes inspired by traditional architecture scattered throughout the municipality. There are 3 population centres about 3 km apart: the Old Town, the Port and the Arenal. Jávea has hardly any public transport, so all journeys must be made by private vehicle.

Jávea also has **2 large natural parks** (El Montgó-Cabo de San Antonio and the Granadella Forest Park). The former includes a protected marine reserve, which is one of the reference points for scuba diving enthusiasts in Spain.









The village and its surroundings enjoy a **rich gastronomy and a wide variety of leisure possibilities**, of which this guide makes numerous recommendations, based entirely on the opinions and first-hand experience of the owners of the property where you are going to stay. Please take these recommendations as totally personal, subjective and not conditioned by any relationship with the providers, but we believe that they will help to make your stay much more special.



The Beaches

Jávea's rocky coastline is quite unique and different from other nearby Levantine towns, making it more similar to the coasts of Ibiza or Mallorca (its surroundings have sometimes been referred to as "the peninsular Ibiza"). The 5 capes that make up its coastline give rise to numerous wild coves of singular beauty, some only accessible by boat or hidden paths and flanked by cliffs. At the same time it has long beaches that are easily accessible and urban and equipped with all the services.

The clarity of its waters and the beauty of its seabed are highly appreciated, making them ideal for scuba diving or snorkelling. The presence of poseidonia seaweed gives it a unique mosaic of blue and green colours. Three of its beaches (La Grava, El Arenal and Granadella) have been awarded the European Community Blue Flag in 2022.

The rocky bottoms of Jávea's beaches can hurt feet, and the sea urchin population is abundant, but it's **essential to equip all members of the family with booties**, crab shoes or other water shoes with non-slip soles. Decathlon has several models from €5, or they can be purchased at any local beach shop. It's also highly recommended to get some snorkelling goggles for maximum enjoyment.

In the chapter dedicated to Beaches in this guide you will find useful indications to visit our favourites, as well as others chosen from nearby towns. Having a **boat also multiplies the possibilities of enjoying them** and makes it possible to go to Cala Sardinera, Cova Tallada, Cala el Pom, Cala la Barra or Cala En Caló, which do not have viable or easy access by land.

We invite you not to settle for the nearest or most touristy ones, but to explore as many as your visit allows, you won't regret it!





The historic centre

This part of Jávea still conserves its peculiar **medieval layout**, a network of narrow streets dotted with white façades, arched doorways, Gothic windows and wrought iron grilles, all topped by the **characteristic "tosca stone"** of the area. Its location far from the sea and its distribution is due to the need to defend it from the once frequent attacks by Barbary pirates. A stroll through its streets takes us back in time.



In the centre of the town stands the Church of San Bartolomé, from the 14th to the 16th century, a beautiful example of Elizabethan Gothic. In this same square we can see two beautiful examples of houses, such as the Palau dels Sapena (15th century) or the Casa dels Bolufer (18th-19th century). On both sides of the church are the Municipal Food Market (1946) and the Town Hall (18th century, renovated in the 20th century).

Going up Principe de Asturias Avenue, we reach the reconstruction of a section of the old medieval walls. From there we can access the Parc Montaner where **the Riurau dels Català d'Arnauda** is located, moved from its original location, it is the most representative example of the importance of the sultana trade in the 19th century.

Over the years, this neighbourhood has grown without losing its charm. Walking through its streets you can find all kinds of shops with a long family tradition, as well as local tapas bars and other services. Shopping at the Mercado Municipal de Abastos where you can buy local gastronomic products has become a must for our visitors. In addition, a weekly street market is held every Thursday between 8.30 a.m. and 2 p.m. approximately in the Plaza de la Constitución and Placeta del Convent.



From there, along Primicies street we reach the **Soler Blasco Archaeological and Ethnographic Museum**, located in the 17th century Casa-Palacio de Antoni Banyuls. Continuing along C/ Major we pass the Casa de Tena (1867), now the Ca Lambert Exhibition Hall. A few metres away, in Carrer D'Avall, is the Chapel of Santa Anna. Going down the C/Mayor again, we arrive at the Pl. del Convent, where we find the Convent of the Augustinian Nuns.



The Port and the Arenal

The Port ("Aduanas del Mar") and Arenal make up the other two urban centres of Jávea, and are the ones that concentrate most tourist activity, given their proximity to the sea.

Around the port grew a **neighbourhood with a strong seafaring character**, with old whitewashed fishermen's houses on the ground floor and narrow streets. The charm of this neighbourhood is enhanced by the sculptural silhouette of the **Church of Our Lady of Loreto**, an important example of avant-garde religious architecture, which stands out for the bold design of its lines, the conception of space and the nod to the fishermen's boats. For many years now, in order to cater for the many foreign parishioners, the Gospel is read in English, German, French and Dutch.

Another building of note in the port is the **Casa del Cable** (1860), now an art gallery. It is located at the foot of the **Playa de la Grava beach**, on a small and charming **promenade** lined with small bars where you can have a drink a few metres from the sea and enjoy the morning sun.

The arrival of the boats, the auction and the subsequent sale of fish in the **fish market** have become an essential attraction for our visitors (8am-12am Tel: 965 790 492. Next to the port, the **Nautical Club** offers different options for water sports lovers.





The **promenade** around the Arenal beach is the tourist centre of Jávea. At its northern end there was an important Roman settlement, where today the **Parador de Turismo** is located. Along the promenade there is a leisure and shopping complex which is the nerve centre of this area all year round, but especially during the summer period.

Summer nights in the Arenal are extraordinarily lively and bustling, a place where young people usually congregate around the many leisure and restaurant establishments.



The natural parks

Jávea has always tried to make its tourist industry compatible with the conservation of its privileged natural environment. For this reason it has 2 natural parks:

Montgó Natural Park: Mount Montgó rises above the plains of Jávea, Dènia and Ondara and reaches a maximum height of 753 m. above sea level. It has a varied natural wealth, its plant diversity being one of the most important in the Western Mediterranean with more than 800 species. For this reason, the Valencian Government declared this area a natural park in 1987, including the cape of San Antonio and the plain of Las Planas, which serves as a link between the coast and the massif itself. In the park you can find eagles, eagle owls, kestrels, peregrine falcons, Audouin's gulls, yellow-legged and black-legged kittiwakes and shag, among other species. The park has an Interpretation Centre (Camí Bosc de Diana, Denia. Tel. 96 646 71 55.) and several authorised hiking routes (PR CV-355). It can also be explored on horseback.

As part of the Montgó Natural Park, the Valencian Government established in 1993 the **Marine Reserve of Cabo de San Antonio**, which establishes the prohibition of fishing in all its modalities, the circulation of boats, and the authorisation of diving only in controlled conditions. Jávea is one of the reference points for scuba diving in Spain (see the Scuba Diving section).

The **Granadella Forest Park covers** an area of 700 hectares of low scrubland, with species such as lavender, centaury, pyramidal orchid or bee-eye orchid (yes, there are orchids in the Mediterranean!). There is a forest route (PR CV-354) that allows you to walk along it, and which goes to the viewpoints of Granadella and Castell de la Granadella, to enjoy its spectacular views (and of course a swim in the spectacular beach of the same name). The Granadella Trail is a famous race that runs through the park every year. In 2016 the park was ravaged by a virulent fire, but the flora has now fully recovered.







Typical gastronomy



Jávea participates in the **Valencian gastronomic tradition of rice and is a** perfect place to enjoy dishes such as paella, fideua, arroz a banda, arroz negro or arroz del senyoret. There is a wide range of all these dishes in the local restaurants (see section on traditional food restaurants).

In Jávea and its surroundings there are **dishes of strictly local tradition** that will delight the curious traveller. Some of them have references to Roman or Arab times.

- **Cocas**: The most typical. Bread bases with peas, spinach or onion and tomato; esgarrat and salt, with oil and salt or sausage. They can also be eaten as a closed pie.
- Typical tapas: Red Prawn of Denia (a delicacy recognised all over the world), Bogamarins (Sea Urchins), Bread with allioli and tomato, Polp Sec (dried octopus in slices) Capellans: (dried cod roasted with a flame), Esgarrat (Eggplant, peppers and onion roasted in the oven), Sausages (special mention to the sobrassada of Tárbena, a small inland village repopulated by Mallorcans),
- Stews: Cruet (typically seafood, with fish and shellfish with potato, onion and tomato), Suc roig (based on grouper, conger eel or monkfish) Polp amb penca (octopus and fish) Borreta (salted tuna gut with dried tomato, possibly derived from Roman Garum).
- **Desserts:** Tortà de almendra (sponge cake made of almond flour), Pastissets (sweet pastries filled with almond and/or sweet potato paste), Coca Maria: (very typical sponge cake, you can find it in any bakery).

The region was an important **wine** producer from Roman times until the arrival of phylloxera. The local bodegas produce excellent wines from Monastrell and Giró red grapes and Muscat of Alexandria whites **in the nearby villages of Jalón and Lliber** (see recommended plans). A popular local speciality is **Mistela**, a sweet Moscatel wine drunk as a dessert.

Alicante's oenological jewel is **Fondillón**. A sweet wine of natural fermentation of the Monastrell grape whose production was almost completely lost due to phylloxera and its high cost of production, but which has been preserved by a few family wineries, mainly in Monovar and Villena (but also in nearby Parcent). Fondillón is obtained from the bottom of the barrel, which was emptied by a third for marketing and refilled with the last harvest. In the 19th century it was one of the most admired drinks by European royalty and aristocracy, being the favourite wine of Louis XIV of France, as attested by his doctor. Philip V was very fond of it, his doctor attributed aphrodisiac properties to it, and it was the first wine to travel around the world in the Magellan-Elcano expedition. It is one of the five wines in the world with its own denomination recognised by the EU, a category shared only with Jerez, Bordeaux, Port and Champagne. Don't leave without trying it!

Nearby towns



If we start our tour in the north, we find **Denia**, whose seafaring tradition can be seen in the picturesque neighbourhood of Baix la Mar. Its Moorish castle on top of a hill overlooks the town and is well worth a visit. It is highly recommended to visit the Playa de las Marinas, with 10 km of very fine sand, or the **new marina**, with its boat piers and leisure facilities.

In the interior of the region, it is worth visiting the wine cellars of Lliber, Jalón and Parcent, as well as the almond blossom (end of February, beginning of March) in the villages of Jalón, Lliber or Alcalalí. The nearby town of Gata is famous for its wickerwork.

To the south is **Teulada-Moraira**, a traditional agricultural town with a well-preserved old town centre and a fortified church from the 16th century. Its coastline is also notable for its beaches and the watchtower at Cap d'Or and the Torréon, (an old battery and coastal fortification). Moraira (the fishing village) is one of the most upscale tourist towns in the Valencian Community and has an excellent atmosphere and great restaurants and bars by the sea.

Benissa has a neo-gothic church known as the "Cathedral of the Marina Alta". Its wellpreserved medieval old town offers a variety of traditional shops.

Calpe is located next to the Peñón de Ifach Natural Park, which can be reached via a path to the top. It is a tourist town of great tradition, with a beautiful promenade, and has gained gastronomic relevance due to its 3 Michelin Starred restaurants.

Further south, don't miss a visit to the picturesque and bohemian town of Altea, with its spectacular historic quarter, or if you like entertainment, go to Benidorm, which has an overwhelming range of leisure activities for visitors of all ages and a seafront promenade that never sleeps. Don't hesitate to visit the Asia Gardens Hotel and discover its incredible gardens, or the nearby Moorish village of Guadalest, a delight to walk around and be transported to another era.

The best beaches



El Arenal

3 Km from Porta Maris

Located in the centre of the bay of Jávea, it is the only sandy beach in the town. It is the best known and most popular beach due to its fine sand and shallow waters. It is ideal to go with small children. It has a blue flag and is equipped with lifeguards, adapted access, toilets and even assistance for the disabled.

The beach is urban and is attached to a small promenade with a wide range of leisure and gastronomic options, as well as the Parador de Turismo. It also has plenty of parking spaces nearby. It stretches for 500 m in a small bay.

Summer nights in the Arenal are extraordinarily lively and bustling, a place where young people usually congregate around the leisure establishments. This centre is undoubtedly the most cosmopolitan area of Jávea, its extensive leisure and gastronomic facilities make a visit inevitable and the temptation to return irresistible.







Cala Blanca

2 Km from Porta Maris

This is a wild beach of rock and gravel made up of two adjoining coves, connected by a stone coastline. Its name derives from the whitish colour of the rocks of its cliffs. Each of the two coves (Caleta de Dins and Caleta de Fora) has its own personality and both are ideal places for snorkelling, due to their rocky seabed and abundant marine flora and fauna. Sorolla painted some of his most famous pictures of bathers on this beach. The cave in the pass that separates them is one of the most famous pictures of Jávea.

It can be reached via Caleta de Fora, which forms a small rocky inlet like a natural pool. On foot along a path barely 200m away you can reach La Caleta de Dins, which has a rough stone arm that goes out to the sea as a barrier, so its waters are usually calm and crystalline.

There is a small car park at the end of Avenida de Ultramar, but it tends to fill up quickly in the summer and at weekends. It is essential to wear waterproof shoes (crab shoes or booties) to be able to walk on the seabed comfortably and avoid hurting your feet on rocks or sea urchins.

La Granadella regularly appears in the lists drawn up by the press as one of the most beautiful beaches in Spain, some years having obtained the first place (and deservedly so!) It is an essential visit due to the spectacular beauty of the place where it is located and the incredible colour of its waters.

Cala Granadella is a wild beach, but it has a Blue Flag and has good services such as sun lounger and deckchair hire, bars, toilets, parking, lifeguard, you can go water skiing or diving, and in summer there is a floating platform where the little ones can have fun.

It is a very busy beach and it is advisable to go early if you want to secure a good spot during the summer season. For the last few years in July and August you can't park at the beach, but you have to leave your car in a car park about 2 km away and get on a free minibus that operates between 10-19h and leaves every 20 minutes approximately. The car park fills up quickly, so it is advisable to get to the beach early.

It is a gravel cove, so it is essential to be equipped with crab shells or booties and it is highly recommended to wear diving or snorkelling goggles.







El Portichol / La Barraca

Cala del Portichol, also known as Cala de la Barraca, is located between Cabo de San Martín and Cabo Negro. It is a beautiful rustic gravel cove with white fishermen's houses, perfect to spend a day enjoying the sun and the sea. From the beach you can enjoy the view of the Portichol Island, as well as the Capes on both sides. In summer there is limited parking space, so it is advisable to arrive early.

The fishermen's cottages on the beach itself are very picturesque. One of them has a unique blue door that has become almost a symbol of Jávea, and is one of the most shared spots on Instagram in Spain. On the beach you can find the Cala Clemence restaurant, a highly recommended place to eat or have a drink while enjoying the spectacular views.

It can be reached either by car or on foot from the Cruz del Portichol viewpoint, on the Carretera del Cabo de la Nao. There is not much parking, although you can leave your car in the streets of the neighbouring urbanisations (although they can be steep). In summer it is very difficult to find parking if you arrive later than 9.30 am. It is a gravel cove, so it is essential to equip yourself with sea booties and it is highly recommended to wear diving or snorkelling goggles.

La Grava / El Montañar

The beach of La Grava, also known as El Montañar or El Benissero, stretches for about 3 km from the port of Jávea to El Arenal. It is a semi-urban beach, which you can walk along a wide pavement with a cycle lane.

In its most urban stretch (La Grava), at the foot of the Port of Jávea, the beach enjoys a Blue Flag and plenty of services and places to eat or have a drink. As it faces slightly east, it is an excellent place to enjoy the sun, especially in the morning.

In summer there are several temporary beach bars along the beach, and there are 2 well known and recommended permanent places to eat or drink (La Siesta and Montgo Di Bongo).

You can leave your car on the gravel of the beach next to the road in two car parks, or in the streets of the neighbouring urbanisations. It is a gravel cove, so it is essential to wear sandals or booties and it is highly recommended to wear diving or snorkelling goggles, as the gravel soon gives way to a rocky seabed of great beauty.





Las Marinas de Denia

Las Marinas de Denia, in its different stretches, is a spectacular beach of fine, shallow sand that stretches for 10 km with widths of up to 300 m. It is an ideal beach if we want a different sandy beach to the Arenal, and we don't mind going outside Jávea and getting to know the surroundings.

It has some restaurants right on the beach, ideal for a typical local rice dish. The Noguera Restaurant-Hotel is specially recommended.

As it is such a wide and extensive beach, it never feels crowded, even in summer. It has semi-urban and wild stretches and plenty of services. Given its size, parking is not usually difficult except in the stretches closest to the town centre of Denia. As it is a sandy beach, no booties are required, and its shallow depth makes it ideal to go with small children.





El Moraig

El Moraig is a 500 m long wild cove located in the neighbouring village of Benitachell. Like Granadella, it appears recurrently in the lists of the most beautiful beaches in Spain. It is flanked by two cliffs and has a beautiful cave with 3 eyes (Cova dels Arcs), which happens to be the outlet of an underground river. It is a frequent meeting place for divers to explore its passages. It has a single steep asphalted access coming from the Urbanización Cumbres del Sol. In summer there is restricted parking capacity, so it is advisable to arrive early.

It has a pleasant beach bar where you can have a drink. Parking can be difficult in summer. There is a parking space at some distance from the cove. The parking space has to be booked in advance on the website www.elmoraig.es. The beach has a Blue Flag, so it has plenty of services.

It is a gravel cove, so it is essential to be equipped with crab shells or booties and it is highly recommended to wear diving or snorkelling googles,







Cala Ambolo

Cala Ambolo is a wild beach 300 m long, with only pedestrian access and no parking. Possibly for this reason, despite not being formally a nudist beach, it has been (and is) the most common place to bathe for visitors who prefer to do so without clothes. From here you can enjoy the spectacular view of the Isla del Descubridor and the elevated coastline that rises up to the Castell de la Granadella, perhaps the most spectacular view of Jávea.

It is not possible to park near the beach. It is best to leave your car in the streets of the Urbanisation Balcón al Mar (Calles Richard Wagner or Giuseppe Verdi) and walk the last stretch of the access road with stairs while enjoying the breathtaking view. It does not have any kind of services.

As it is sheltered by a cliff, it has been closed for some time due to the risk of a landslide. You can check its condition before visiting it at the Jávea Tourist Office (Tel: 965 79 07 36). It is a gravel cove, so it is essential to wear booties.







El Portet de Moraira

14 Km from Porta Maris

El Portet beach is a small semi-urban beach located at the foot of the most exclusive urbanisations of Moraira. As it is very secluded and sandy, it is ideal for children. It is famous for its crystal clear waters and its marvellous shades of green and blue, due to the presence of Poseidonia algae, and is one of the main tourist attractions of Teulada-Moraira.

It is close to several restaurants and has a blue flag, so it has a lifeguard and plenty of services. It does not have a dedicated car park, so you have to leave your car in the nearby urbanisations, which is not always easy. It is advisable to go early to ensure a good spot, as the cove is only 300 metres long and 20-30 metres wide, so in summer it fills up quickly.







Cala L'Andrago

Located in Moraira, Cala L'Andragó is a small corner full of charm. It is a totally rocky beach, which gives it crystal clear and transparent waters and makes it ideal for snorkelling. It is a semi-urban beach that is at the foot of several leisure and restaurant establishments, including a chill-out area with an excellent atmosphere.

It has a car park right on the beach, which tends to fill up quickly in summer, but it is not difficult to park in the urbanisations on the other side of the beach road. It can get deep quickly and is less sheltered than El Portet, which makes it less suitable for children. There is a ladder built into the rock to make access easier.

It is a rocky cove, so it is essential to be equipped with crab shells or booties and it is highly recommended to wear diving or snorkelling googles.





Recommended leisure activities





Hiking routes - Jávea

Discovering the beautiful landscapes and coastline of Jávea is one of the many attractions that await us in this privileged corner of the Costa Blanca. Being part of a unique natural environment, which combines sea and mountains, is a very good alternative for nature lovers, who will be able to get into lush vegetation, walk along the cliffs and enjoy spectacular views through a wide variety of trails of great ecological and scenic value that run through the Network of Natural Areas of Jávea. These walking routes are well signposted in all their sections.

Local Festivals and Festivals 2023

Valencia is world renowned for the uniqueness of its regional festivals. Jávea and the surrounding villages are no exception and offer many opportunities for fun and contact with regional folklore.

The **Moors and Christians** festivities are deeply rooted in the province. These fiestas, full of history, have become very popular due to their colourful and spectacular nature. They commemorate the Christian reconquest of the region by the troops of King James I of Aragon. They stage the landing of the Christian troops, the battle and a commemorative parade of both sides accompanied by their bands (one for each Filá, or private club representing a squadron of each army, with their own costumes and anthem). The impossibility of having enough costumes, music bands, etc. for everyone at the same time means that the towns of the province distribute an annual calendar with the weekends of the season distributed around the summer, so that at almost any time of the season the fiesta can be enjoyed in a nearby town. The dates for 2023 are: **Jávea:** 15-16 July, **Denia:** 13-16 August. **Moraira:** 9-11 June, **Benissa or Pego:** 1-2 July. **Calpe:** 21-22 October. If you want to go to the most superlative expression of the fiesta, go to its birthplace: the towns of **Alcoy** (22-24 April), **Villajoyosa** (24-31 July) or **Crevillente** (30 Sept - 3 October).





Las **Fallas** (or its smaller Alicante sisters Hogueras de San Juan) need no introduction, and are also celebrated in the Marina region, which is halfway between Valencia and Alicante. Some towns even celebrate both. If you are not going to Valencia, the birthplace of the festival and first choice for anyone interested, and you are going to be in Porta Maris between **14-19 March**, it is worth seeing the **Fallas in Denia** where the festival has a great tradition and Fallas houses with a big budget, or even going to **Gandía**. **Jávea** celebrates the **Hogueras de San Juan in the** week of **17th-24th June**, as well as the rest of the towns southwards as far as **Alicante** itself.

Specifically in **Jávea there are** several patron saint festivities: San Sebastián, Patron Saint of Jávea (20-30 January), the Ascent of Jesus the Nazarene to the Calvario Chapel (20 March). The Fiestas of the Virgen de Carmen and its seafaring procession (16th July) and the Fiestas of the Virgen de Loreto (31st August-6th September). As for music festivals, the most traditional are **Montgó Rock (**2-3 June) and **Xabia Jazz** (1st week of August), especially for lovers of each genre. Both have been held for many years and feature some of the best artists.

Bicycle Routes

Jávea has several cycling routes that run through places of great beauty and that lead to places of tourist interest, such as the viewpoints or the Montgó Natural Park. The large number of small rural roads scattered throughout the municipality make it easy to make short cycling excursions or to access neighbouring towns. Several professional teams from Northern Europe spend part of the winter season in the town to continue their training, and it is a regular stop-off point for the Vuelta Ciclista a España (Tour of Spain), given the spectacular scenery. Dutch residents in particular, including the elderly, regularly travel around Jávea on mechanical or electric bicycles.

There are 10 official cycling routes in Jávea, which can be consulted on the website (https://www.xabia.org/ver/1492/Rutas-enbici.html).

The most recommended routes are the **Vuelta al Montgó** (from the Port of Jávea to Denia, going around the Montgó along a 26 km flat route that passes through Jesús Pobre and La Jara), the **Family Route from the Port to Cala Blanca, which is** completely flat and always runs along the edge of the sea along the Bay. It is well paved and perfectly suitable for children. **The Viewpoints Route passes** by the most scenic points of Jávea on the edge of the cliffs and the **Granadella Route**, which runs through the Natural Park, the beach and the cliffs that surround it. The **Jávea Parks Route** passes just 200m from Porta Maris. In the QR code to the right of this paragraph, you can see its routes on a map.



There are several companies in Jávea that rent bicycles (see below). One company in Morair also offers guided tours of the area, which are highly recommended.

Wineries

Fondillon is an oenological speciality from Alicante that only a few wineries in the world make. It is a wine of great ageing, late harvest, sweet but not fortified from the Monastrell grape variety. It is not cheap, but you should not leave without trying it. It was a favourite of King Louis XIV of France. Clubs and nightlife

Jávea has a lot of nightlife venues, which are particularly lively during the summer season. Almost all of them are concentrated in the Arenal area, although we must not forget the temporary chiringuitos (beach bars) or permanent establishments that are distributed along the Montañar beach, or the two discos in the town.

The most lively pubs, chill-outs and bars in Jávea are concentrated in the southern part of the **Arenal**. These have undergone a great transformation in the last 10 years, due to the entry of new business groups in the leisure sector who have opted for more modern premises, decorated in more modern styles and with all aspects of service much more carefully looked after. The more traditional establishments had to raise their game in order to keep up, which has led to a general improvement in the leisure offer. Places like **Achill**, **Atalaya or Bambula** combine an excellent atmosphere, good music and modern décor, varied cocktails with sun loungers and wonderful sea views. **Chambada**, **Carnaval**, **Khandala** or **Amnos** are also worth a visit along the promenade. For the more traditionalists there is the biker and rocker inspired **Octopus** pub, where beer is served in mugs or pints.





On the Montañar beach there are 2 essential places: **La Siesta**, decorated with sand, palm trees and Balinese beds on the edge of the gravel, and **Montgo Di Bongo**. These are old houses that were built on the beach itself long before the coastal laws and are nowadays places where the Madrid and Valencian bourgeoisie meet for dinner, drinks, socialising or shopping in their hippie-inspired clothes shops. A short distance away is the **Viva Beach** pub, another good place to have a drink overlooking the sea.

The Port is a quieter place that has traditionally been less suited to late-night entertainment, but it still has some very noteworthy venues. In particular the **Beach House** terrace, exquisitely decorated in Ibizan style, and **Cala Bandida**, also in the same building literally hanging over the sea, are highly recommended. **La Esquina** also serves delicious cocktails.

Jávea has 2 Discos: El **Mol**í (formerly Molí Blanc), which also has a spectacular interior garden and a lively central dance floor, and **La Hacienda**, located on the Carretera del Cabo de San Antonio, which maintains its original, typically seventies logo.





Gyms and Yoga

In Jávea there is not a huge variety of gyms, but there is enough to keep in shape for short stays. All gyms in the area have daily passes and tourists are welcome.
