






DD Act (2000)

The purpose of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance and Bill of Rights Act is to assure individuals with developmental disabilities and their families are participating in the design of and having access to needed community services, individualized supports, and other forms of assistance that promote self-determination, independence, productivity, and integration and inclusion in all facets of community life through culturally competent programs.








Three National Networks of Centers

LEND

LEND Programs provide graduate level interdisciplinary training. The purpose of the LEND training program is to improve the health of people with disabilities across the lifespan. We accomplish this by preparing trainees from diverse professional disciplines to assume leadership roles in their respective fields and by ensuring high levels of interdisciplinary clinical competence and leadership.
