Oh, so much Light! Two nights before Epiphany, on the first Sunday of calendar year 2026 (the 2nd Sunday of Christmas), nearly 50 people stood together, holding our lit candles—with the night sky illuminated by the fiery light of the tree that had adorned our church lawn with its own lights throughout the prior Advent/Christmas days! As I absorbed that holy moment, I found myself thinking about all the Light that shone through the people of Living Springs in this season:

- The light of 100's of community members, Cristo Rey mission partners, children, and animals gathered on cold winter's nights for a **Living Nativity** to share the joyful story of Christ's birth (in both English & Spanish)!
- The light shining on drivers' faces in **Rush Hour** traffic, as they received 200+ little Advent-Christmas blessing bags of unconditional love & grace!
- The light of **3000+ food items** (and still counting) given for local food pantries as our "birthday gifts" of love for Jesus our Lord, to feed those in hunger!
- The light filling every inch of the upper altar area & steps, occupied by dozens & dozens of children/youth at our **Christmas Eve family service**, all finding joy in being "living stars" to share the good news of Jesus' birth!
- The light radiating from the manger & reflected in human faces through the cracks of a broken mirror at Christmas Eve **candlelight communion**—with the sounds of horn, cello, flute, guitar, bells echoing in our hearts & little wooden ornaments sharing Love, Kindness, and Peace/Shalom for us to carry home!



- The light filling porches, living rooms, and facility corridors with visitors **singing carols** of Christmas joy!
- More light in the faces of community members at DOKO Station, singing with joy sy **Beer & Carols** and engaging in random conversations of faith!
- The light filling the sanctuary with dozens & dozens being touched by the joy of children sharing the **CDC Christmas program** and our **LS Children/Youth Advent-Christmas program!**

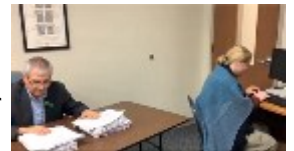

Notes from: *Justice Ministry*

As the new year begins, estimates are that 16,000 families in Richland County need safe and affordable housing. Our Justice ministry is working with Richland County Council to pass an ordinance to establish an Affordable Housing Trust Fund and dedicate seed money to get this underway. Housing trust funds do not create public/Section 8 housing. Instead, they create housing that is safe and affordable for working people such as teachers, firefighters, and police officers. Our Justice Ministry has been working to get such a trust fund in place for several years.

In December we decided to focus our Housing efforts this year - again - by doubling down on our local Affordable Housing Trust Fund campaign. "Doubling down" means we want to win BIG steps towards a Housing Trust Fund in Richland County by the end of 2026. How will we do this? We will be attending every Richland County Council Session and hosting or participating in special events such as our previous Housing Bus Tour and Food Walk. We will circle back to our meetings with other agencies and organizations that are working on affordable housing to see what new things we can learn and implement in our campaign to get a trust fund in place. Everyone is invited to participate.

As the New Year begins, be sure to Save-the-Date for the annual Nehemiah Action: Monday, April 27 at 6:00 pm, location TBD. What is our Call? Justice for all!

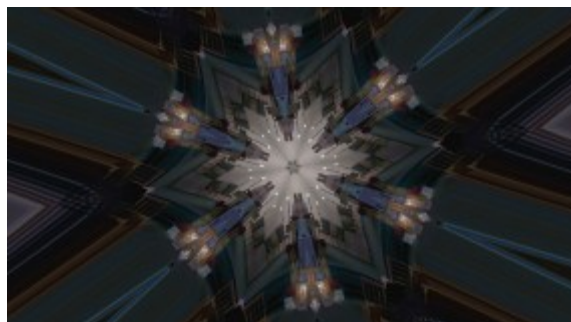

At our Ladies Bible Study brunch, we shared stories of Christmas memories - I like to think that one or more of these Dove Tree recipients will someday share a memory too.
