CONFESSION AND ABSOLUTION

P God is light; in Him there is no darkness at all. If we claim to have fellowship with Him yet walk in the darkness, we lie and do not live by the truth. C **we are not worthy to be called Your children. So often we have chosen to live in the darkness of sin rather than to reflect Your glory in our lives. We have not loved You**

C with our whole heart. We have sinned sinned against the people in our lives in our thoughts, in our words, and in our actions. Have mercy on us, kind Father, for the sake of Jesus Christ.

P I have Good News for you. Before we were even aware of our sin and need for forgiveness, God sent His only Son into this world made dark by sin. He came among us as one of us, lived the perfect sinless life in our place, and died for

P us on the cross that we deserved. By His death, the penalty for our sins was paid in full, and in His glorious resurrection we are assured of the gift of new life. To them that believe on His name He gives power to be called the children of God and hath promised them His Holy Spirit. He that believes and is baptized shall be saved.

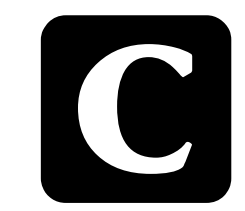

SECOND LESSON: 1 CORINTHIANS 1:10–18

¹⁰I appeal to you, brothers, by the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, that all of you agree and that there be no divisions among you, but that you be united in the same mind and the same judgment. ¹¹For it has been reported to me by Chloe's people that there is quarreling among you, my brothers. ¹²What I mean is that each one of you says, "I follow Paul," or "I follow Apollos," or "I follow Cephas," or "I follow Christ." ¹³Is Christ divided? Was Paul crucified for you?

Or were you baptized in the name of Paul? ¹⁴I thank God that I baptized none of you except Crispus and Gaius, ¹⁵so that no one may say that you were baptized in my name. ¹⁶(I did baptize also the household of Stephanas. Beyond that, I do not know whether I baptized anyone else.) ¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize but to preach the gospel, and not with words of eloquent wisdom, lest the cross of Christ be emptied of its power.

Zebedee their father, mending their nets, and he called them. ²²Immediately they left the boat and their father and followed him.

²³And he went throughout all Galilee, teaching in their synagogues and proclaiming the gospel of the kingdom and healing every disease and every affliction among the people. ²⁴So his fame spread throughout all Syria, and they brought him all the sick, those afflicted with various diseases and pains, those oppressed by demons, epileptics, and

paralytics, and he healed them. ²⁵And great crowds followed him from Galilee and the Decapolis, and from Jerusalem and Judea, and from beyond the Jordan.

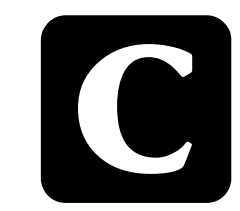

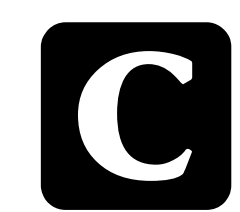

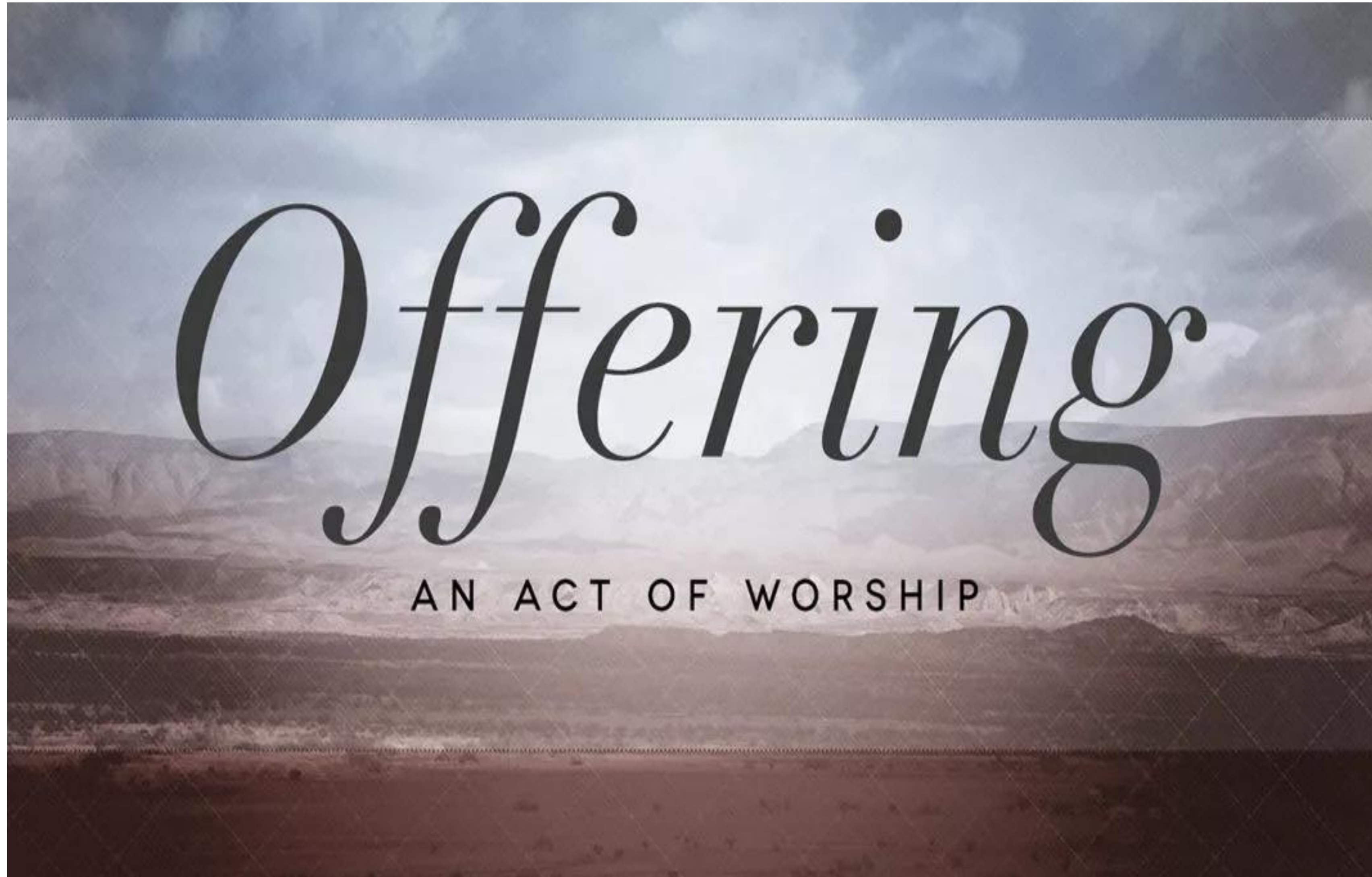

As the glory of Your presence once filled Your ancient temple, so in the incarnation of Your Son, Jesus Christ, You manifested the

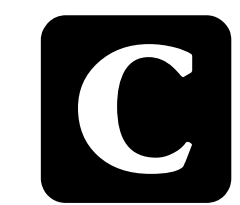
P fullness of Your glory in human flesh.

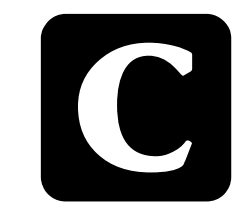
