MIDWEEK LENTEN WORSHIP begins on Wednesday, February 18th at 7:00 p.m. The theme this year is **GLITTERING VICES**. What is a vice? A vice is a habit we’ve formed over time that is detrimental to our lives and especially to our Christian faith. These vices cling to the self, to the things of this world and to our desires. The trouble is, we hardly recognize many of these habits and behaviors as dangerous. In fact, at times, they truly seem to “glitter” in their appearance.



Indeed, vices “glitter” with the appearance of providing “do-it-yourself” shortcuts to happiness and success, so we take the bait and pursue them. We bow down to them with the intention they will bring good to our lives. We trust in them, because they glitter, but then, they fail us every time. In the passion account of our Lord Jesus that we will hear and read in the midweek worship; we’ll see vices on display time and time again as sin rears its ugly head in the lives of the disciples.

As we journey through the Lenten Season, we not only see these vices in the lives of the disciples, we will examine our own hearts to recognize the vices that dwell within us, sometimes deep within us and that we at times fiercely defend. Then we’ll consider what kinds of virtues, that is, good habits, we can cultivate in places of vices. When we endeavor to fear, love, and trust in God above all things, we increasingly free our hearts from the grips of idolatrous vice. Good habits drive away our bad habits. Living in faith in Jesus, we find ourselves more willing and active in loving God and our neighbor.
