Keynote Vance Corum



Vance grew up primarily in upstate New York and Vermont. After graduating from St. Lawrence University with a Bachelor's in Sociology, he hitch-hiked to Colorado and worked on a vegetable

farm, in a cannery, and at a Hunt's sugar beet factory. He moved on to Los Angeles, where he did community organizing before he was asked to develop the first farmers' market in Southern California. A 1-year commitment led to a lifetime passion of building farmers' markets and helping farmers and other producers to create stable, sustainable income, allowing them to pursue their dreams and remain in rural communities. He has been instrumental in building state and regional conferences and helped found the North American Farmers Direct Marketing Conference, coordinating it several times, including speakers, a trade show, and a 3-day tour.

Vance has led seminars on market development, solicited new farmers at major events like the Tulare Farm Equipment Show, captured new customers with mini farmers' markets at county fairs, developed farm tours for market managers, and conducted consumer research at farmers' markets in the U.S. and Central America.

He has shared his perspective at conferences in 20+ states as well as Canada, Cuba, and India. He is the coauthor of The New Farmers' Market in 2001, which he updated in a second edition in 2016.
